## Linda Luna Spends Life Helping Children with Love and Patience

"In 2007, my son and my beautiful daughter-in-law called me and said I was going to be a grandma." Linda Luna, a Park Vista senior community resident in El Segundo, moved to sunny California to be closer to her growing family.

Born in Louisville, Kentucky, Luna's parents moved out to California for a better life. She then grew up in San Jose, working as a clerk for Pacific Bell. But the thing that most stands out about Luna's life is her extensive work helping children.

"I love kids," she says, going on to explain that she spent her parenting years also fostering children. As a foster child herself from age thirteen to eighteen, Linda used her experience to relate to kids going through the system. When her two sons were ages four and seven, she started a foster home and took kids from Juvenile Hall and the Girls' Ranch, a place for girls in difficult situations.

"The girls are pretty amazing, and once they knew that they were going to be safe and not be judged for whatever they did, but be encouraged about going forward and becoming the best they could be, you could see a change in their attitudes and their thinking," she explains.

The biggest challenge with a foster child, she says, is getting them to know that they can trust you. Luna explains the importance of establishing that she would not lie to or deceive a child in her care. She made sure it was clear that she wasn't going to kick them out if they did something wrong, be it not doing what she asked, or sneaking out and sneaking back in. She showed love, patience, structure, and kindness to every child in her care.

So how did Luna come up with her approach to these difficult situations? "I tried

to follow what my foster mother did," she says, explaining that her own foster home was as normal as could be, and her foster parent was very motherly and loving. Not being able to have children of her own, Luna's foster mother took in about ten girls and helped empower them to take ownership of their own lives and responsibilities, giving them activities to do and taking them on vacation. "I would say I learned a lot from that and tried to implement it in my own home."

Often, kids who enter the foster system are dealing with some tough life circumstances. Luna recalls one girl who came into her care with 98 cavities and had trouble sleeping for fear of not being secure. For about three weeks in a row, she and her husband

## El Segundo Public Library Welcomes Back Its In-Person Patrons

I've got good news for all of you readers who would rather venture into a brick-and-mortar building to peruse your favorite books, magazines, newspapers, and DVDs in person instead of staring at a little screen on your phone or your tablet or laptop.

The El Segundo public library (ESPL), located over there on Mariposa Ave., a tad bit west of Main St., has invited back its customers to burst through their glass welcoming doors, and traipse over the well-worn carpet, wander through the bookracks, grab a magazine or newspaper, and check-out DVD offerings.

The official "soft opening" of the El Segundo public library occurred on April 12, when reservations were required to step

inside the building, and safety and social distancing protocols were enforced. But as of May 3, reservations were no longer required.

An email sent by the ESPL noted that "Beginning Monday, May 3, 2021, the El Segundo Public will no longer require reservations and will open its doors to walk-in visitors during the hours of 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Saturday. Use of the library will remain limited, with doors closing once the building's maximum capacity has been reached. A temperature check will be required upon entrance, and visitors must always wear a face mask while in the library. Visitors are welcome to browse the collections, check out material,

## Eagles Have Difficult Week in League Play

El Segundo returned to the Pioneer League when the 18 South Bay high schools realigned the Pioneer, Ocean, and Bay Leagues. The first week in Pioneer League play wasn't so welcoming when the baseball team was swept, the softball team fell twice, and the soccer teams had mixed results.

### Baseball Team Swept by North

For the first time in the program's history, the Eagles were swept by North Torrance 4-1 and 10-2. The Saxons have rebuilt their program from within and are a young team with solid pitching on both ends and have enough hitting to keep them in games.

In the first game, the Eagles started Jake Stolnack, who threw another complete game was solid. Stolnack had one bad inning that led to four runs on four hits, including a two-run home run by Brynner Waiolama. For the game, Stolnack scattered ten hits, struck out five, and walked none.

El Segundo's offense struggled against North pitching that limited the Eagles to five hits. Timely hitting was an issue when they stranded three runners in scoring position. In the third inning, Jack Stoker had a leadoff double and was stranded at third. In the fourth inning, Kenny Chung's one-out double went for naught when he was left stranded at second base. In the sixth inning, trailing 4-0, Chung drew a two-out walk, and Rafael Smith followed with a single. Jack Aguilera's fielder's choice scored Chung to make it 4-1. Smith was left stranded at second base when Lloyd Sapanza's chopper was fielded and thrown out on a close play at first base. The Eagles went quiet in the seventh and fell in their Pioneer League opener.

The second game was a matchup of two hard-throwing pitchers. The Eagle's Kenny Chung is averaging a strikeout per inning and an ERA of 1.96 entering the game against North

Torrance. His counterpart, Brynner Waiolama, is 4-0 with a 0.56 ERA and limiting opposing teams to a .136 batting average.

North struck first with Ryan Petch's RBI double in the first inning. The Eagles tied the game in the second inning when Chung led the inning off by getting hit by a pitch. He later scored on an RBI single by Sapanza to make it 1-1. In the fourth inning, Chung drew an eight-pitch walk and scored on Aguilera's

double to make it 2-0. Chung, who had been sailing along through the first three innings on the mound, allowed a leadoff double to Waiolama, scoring on a wild pitch to make it 2-2.

The wheels fell off in the fifth inning for Chung and the Eagles. The Saxons batted around and scored six runs on four hits highlighted by a three-run home run by Toa Ortega to give the Saxons an 8-2 lead. The Saxons would score two more runs in the sixth inning and go on for the 10-2 win.

El Segundo faced Arcadia in a tournament game on the road and came away with a 5-4 victory. The Eagles took advantage of some shoddy play by Arcadia and took a 5-2 lead into the seventh inning, and then held on for the victory. The Eagles host Torrance tonight at 6 p.m. in a key Pioneer League matchup. They host West Torrance on Tuesday afternoon at 3:15 p.m.

### Softball Team Drops Pair

The Eagles faced the North Torrance Saxons and the Torrance Tartars to open their Pioneer League schedule. Both are perennial powers and are off to a great start. The Eagles fell to North 5-0 and lost a heartbreaker 8-7 to Torrance.

The Eagles couldn't manage any offense against the Saxons and were shut out. They were held to three hits and never threatened

## Tank Mural Inspires Eagle Scout

With plenty of commendations to go around at Tuesday's City Council meeting, the first one went to an Eagle Scout who wouldn't let a pile of red tape stop him from celebrating the colorful water tank mural on Grand Avenue. For his community-service project, Jack Crawford created a vista point for John Van Hamersveld's bold and iconic designs with a little help from friends and the El Segundo Public Library. "My breath was taken away by how vibrant and intricate the mural is, so for my Eagle Scout project, I wanted to build a viewing station to recognize the artist and the cultural significance behind the mural," said the Mira Costa High School senior. On Tuesday, mayor Drew Boyles praised Crawford for his drive, noting that the coordination and patience it took was exemplary. The Eagle Scout worked with the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power and the city of El Segundo to secure the site. DWP crews lent a hand with the landscaping while the El Segundo Public Library gave technical support. The area opened in late April.

The viewing station is a stopping point for pedestrians, runners, and bicyclists cresting the hill at Grand Avenue overlooking the beach. Under the Eagle Scout's leadership, a surfboard-inspired bench was built and installed, and DWP crews pitched in with the landscaping. There's an informational sign about the 360-degree mural. At the same time, those curious about Van Hamersveld and his contribution to pop culture can read about him using a digital link that Crawford and library staff did together. The area is accessible only on foot, using the sidewalk on the north side of Grand Avenue.

The teen and his friends laid brickwork, and DMV crews planted drought-tolerant

landscaping. The entire council thanked Crawford with a proclamation read Tuesday night at the council meeting for creating an inviting place in El Segundo for people to "stop, sit and enjoy art."

With the easing of COVID-19 restrictions on public gatherings, the City Council met in person for the first time in over a year.

He hosted honorees - including the Crawford family and the Fire and Police Employees of the Year.

Fire Chief Chris Donovan presented Capt. Andy Powell as the department's designee for 2021. His boss described Powell as a "peer leader" who served in many capacities during 2020 with emergency services and training the staff to use a new radio-communication system. Powell is a member of a post-incident or injury team. He maintains a level of trust within the department that makes it possible for the team to follow up on an emergency and obtain accurate firsthand information from crew members.

Police Officer Armando Rodriguez and management analyst Julissa Solano are the Police Department's sworn and personnel

employees of the year. According to Chief Bill Whalen, Rodriguez - called A-Rod by his colleagues - is a motor officer who leads the department in arrests. Officer Rodriguez is a 17-year member of the force, a senior SWAT member, and a traffic accident-reconstruction investigator. The chief praised Solano as a non-sworn employee who looks for work and ways to help his staff. Whalen explained her responsibilities include managing budgets, training, and keeping the department in compliance with state mandates. Solano was hired in 2015 and promoted to her current analyst position in 2019.

Councilman Lance Giroux later commended

the El Segundo School District for Friday night's senior class dance on Main Street, calling it something the June graduates and their city needed. Noting that surrounding school districts and classrooms remain closed, Giroux called the ESUSD-sponsored social an incredible event. Councilman Scot Nicol complimented residents for staying engaged and communicating issues of concern to the council, including one urgent request made Tuesday that city officials add their support to the monthlong Asian American Pacific Islander observance happening in May. The AAPI movement reported 245 incidents of violence and hate speech in Los Angeles

County last year. Members of a local grassroots organization called Sweat Equity Alliance called on the City Council to denounce acts of violence and aggression against Asians and Pacific Islanders by supporting the AAPI.

In other Council action, code enforcement measures were added to a proposed backyard beekeeping ordinance. Council members seemed pleased with the changes, including specifics about the Public Works Department's role in responding to neighbor complaints and checking that beekeeping hobbyists have registered their hives with the county. The ordinance would allow up to three hives on a single-family

residential lot. A final vote on the ordinance is expected on May 18, when the council meets again.

Development Services Director Sam Lee will retire on Friday. The council approved a 10 percent increase in the salary range for the director position to recruit and hire a replacement. Even with the pay boost, the position will pay a lower salary than what surrounding South Bay cities pay their development department heads. The change in salary passed on a 3-2 vote, with the mayor and mayor pro-tem Chris Pimentel opposing the recommendation from the city's Human Resources director. •

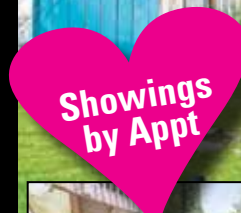

would wake up with this little girl curled up on the foot of their bed, just to be close to them. With patience, love, and individual understanding, eventually, the girl felt safe enough to sleep in her own bed and opened up about things in her past.

"Each child is going to be different, and if you listen to them long enough, you'll hear what the root of the problem really is," she says. According to her, it's all about building trust and being truthful. Luna believes that God's gift to her was her natural instinct to be able to communicate with children, and it's her faith that helps her live her life.

Her advice for new parents is this: you have to sacrifice. The time of raising kids is so fast, she says, and you only have that short window of pouring yourself into their lives in order for them to have something to fall back on as an adult.

The most rewarding part about this facet of her life, she says, is getting to see kids grow into happy and healthy adults. "The most rewarding part was when they left, and they called back, and they'd come over and see me, and they would bring their kids with them and show me that they made a good life," she says fondly.

As for her children, Luna sees her son (now a teacher in El Segundo) nearly every day. She is best friends with her daughter-in-law. She enjoys spending lots of time with her two granddaughters.

"I have fallen in love with El Segundo," says Luna, "It's a very friendly town." Living

in Park Vista, she says she enjoys monthly resident meetings where she can voice questions and concerns, even through Covid over Zoom. With optional activities, trips, parties, and a community room, Luna loves to explore and be active, and bond with her community. During Covid, her complex ensured that all of the seniors had access to safe and secure vaccine appointments and transportation.

Prior to having a stroke last year, Luna would ride her bike five miles, four days a week. She loves to go to the beach, and eat at local restaurants, and spend time with her family, be it a Chinese food night at home or a birthday party. "The simple things in life are the things that I like to do."

Linda's life so far has been spent loving and giving to those around her, and her advice for transitioning into senior years is to walk through these times softly and embrace the process. Having spent her seventy years making decisions for herself and her children, she says that it's okay to let her children start to steer the ship now.

She is looking forward to her granddaughter's upcoming eighth-grade graduation. Her goal for the foreseeable future is to regain her strength after last year's stroke, something with which she's already made remarkable progress. "You know," she ponders, "a life's story is very detailed and very intense at times... I just want to live out the rest of my life knowing that I gave my very best to my grandchildren and my son and daughter-in-law and that I love the Lord with all my heart." •

use the internet computers and get research assistance. In addition to this, a small number of seats will now be available for reading in the library, and study rooms will be available for one-person, one-hour reservations."

So now you know the May 2021 ESPL guidelines; so, you have no excuse not to drop into the library, right?

Brick-and-(sometimes) mortar libraries have a rich, worldwide tradition. A little research unearthed that the first library is accredited to have been started by some presumed dictator, long-deceased. "The world's oldest known library was founded sometime in the 7th century, B.C. for the "royal contemplation" of the Assyrian ruler Ashurbanipal," the research yielded. It was in the long-forgotten city of Nineveh in what is now modern-day Iraq. The site included "a trove of some 30,000 cuneiform tablets organized according to the subject matter."

I did not find that information in dusty Encyclopedia Britannica volumes, but borrowed the details from the always helpful internet, which you can, again, access from the ESPL.

Not exactly sure what cuneiform tablets were, but I will venture that the information on those tablets was riveting, and those local "common folk" who could view the tablets with the OK from Ashurbanipal felt like they may have hit the knowledge lottery. Now, like all information gleaned from impeccable sources regarding events a billion or so years ago, take my research with a grain or two of salt. I think the Greeks claimed that they had invented the library way before Ashurbanipal, but it seems the ancient Greeks took credit for the invention of many things back before anyone could verify anything.

In what was to become the good old U.S. of A. the iconic Benjamin Franklin, he of the kite flying adventures, inventor of "bifocal glasses," and relevant in the start-up our country, is credited by many for starting the first stateside library in 1731. Of course, that factoid is also in dispute; not sure if the Greeks are also claiming that they started the first library in

America. My research uncovered the nugget that Franklin, like the long-deceased ruler Ashurbanipal, also wanted us "common folk to have access to books."

Julie Todd is the ESPL senior librarian and oversees cultural development and communications, and community services. She figures that she has worked at the library for about 15 years. As for most of us, the COVID-related shutdown in the Spring of 2020 forced a game-plan change for the ESPL. Todd said the library had to pivot to curbside services and make available virtual content to its customers. "The staff was challenged," she said while noting that the library workers were open to embracing a

different way of operating during the advent of the pandemic. Todd said that she and her team worked closely with the City of El Segundo to utilize the library to provide timely pandemic information to citizens while also enhancing their digital contents, including audiobooks, and refreshing their website offerings.

Now that the ESPL is opening up to its customers, Todd again sees the building as a "community hub" to citizens, providing the traditional library services, plus live-music offerings, author events, book discussions, and senior internet class usage, while continuing to ramp-up educational and cultural opportunities for those who may also like to take advantage of library services virtually.

"We want to offer experiences that enhance people, and that will encourage people to want

to be here," she said. Of the soft reopening in April, Todd said that "people are really happy to have the library access again. People are still cautious, hesitant about public spaces," noting that the library has reconfigured some of its interior furniture to comply with social distance parameters, and encourage patrons to take advantage of available services, but not hunker-down for a full-day at the library.

One of the services now offered again at the library is that computer access. "It is nice to be able to offer internet access," Todd said, "because there are a lot of people who rely on the library for (it)."

The library's value does not just include

what takes place inside the building or online. The ESPL, the department that oversees El Segundo's cultural development program, has helped shepherd the efforts of Manhattan Beach's Jack Crawford, a 17-year-old Mira Costa High School student and Hermosa Beach troop Eagle-scout-to-be, to design and install a viewing station on the North side of Grand Avenue across the street from the stunning Department of Water and Power tank mural that was the brainchild of El Segundo graduate (class of 1959) John Van Hamersveld.

The Van Hamersveld mural, which replaced to some a "rusted and paint peeling eyesore," looms 32-feet into the ozone, with a circumference of 510 feet. The design pays homage to the South Bay surf culture, which is fitting, because the designer, among his other

works, is credited with creating the poster for the iconic surf film, the 1960's release, "The Endless Summer."

For his part, Crawford, who became familiar with the DWP mural while making multiple trips to El Segundo to visit his grandparents, and team, which included Hermosa Beach scout troop leaders and members, installed the viewing station in mid-April. It consists of a surfboard built as the bench, a sign with a QR code that directs interested folk to the library's webpage, which shares details about Crawford's project, and includes a link to Van Hamersveld's website.

Van Hamersveld, who was inducted into the El Segundo High School hall-of-fame in 2017, has a long history of iconic graphic designs. He was the art director at Capitol Records in the mid-'60s and designed album covers, and was an integral component of devising worldwide ad campaigns to promote the bands his work helped to put on the pop culture map.

You may have heard of some of the bands that Van Hamersveld worked with: the Beatles, the Rolling Stones, KISS, the Grateful Dead, and the Beach Boys, to name a few. Too bad most of us off-loaded most of our albums from the '70s and '80s when we were coerced to buy 8-tracks or cassettes. I believe that some of those vintage covers, possibly designed by Van Hamersveld and the vinyl encased between said covers, might be worth a nickel or two in 2021?

For his part, scout Crawford emailed that he was "very appreciative of all of the people who came together to support my project. I especially enjoyed exploring my creativity and working on blending technology with art to create a more meaningful experience for the community."

Upcoming events sponsored by the library include a Story Walk in Library Park, book discussions, and the annual summer reading program launch in mid-June. 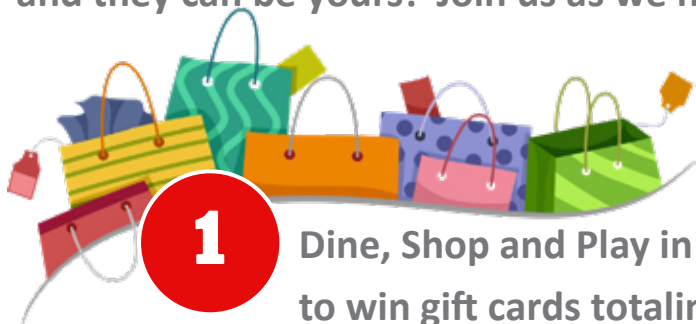
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
