Local Cancer Survivor Hits the Big Screen with Foodie Adventure

When he was diagnosed with Osteosarcoma at the age of 17 after experiencing recurring shoulder pain, Ali Allouche knew he had a difficult road ahead. Scans showed a tumor about the size of a softball, with 12 weeks of chemotherapy scheduled to hopefully reduce the growth for surgical removal. Unfortunately, the treatment didn't work due to the large bulk of the mass, and it required the removal of his entire scapula, shoulder, clavicle, and humerus arm bones. Another three months of chemotherapy ensued, and finally, Ali was cancer-free. That was seven years ago and... so far, so good ever since.

Today, Ali is the subject of an award-winning documentary currently making the film festival circuit. This included a showing at the Regent Theater in Downtown Los Angeles on May 20. The story documents the challenges of a young, courageous, and determined cancer survivor while celebrating his love of tasty cuisine and traveling.

Ali Eats America follows him on a foodie adventure across the country, meeting his late mentor, Anthony Bourdain, and world-acclaimed chefs like Jose Andres (World Central Kitchen) and Wolfgang Puck along the way. "While in the hospital, there were many hours of nothingness," Ali noted. "I would sleep a lot, and my mom would always be there with me. It was pretty boring, so we started watching a lot of movies and shows... but it slowly became apparent that I really liked food shows like Emeril Lagasse's *Eat the World* and *Top Chef*. We eventually found *Anthony Bourdain's Parts Unknown* and I was hooked. I was so inspired by Bourdain's travels that my mom got the idea of creating a map for us to visit at least one restaurant in every state once I was done with chemo. She bought a physical map and we started researching unique, popular, favorite restaurants in every state. Once we made a decision, she'd mark the

map with the details on a post-it note. When we completed the map, my mom realized there was no way we could pay for the trip, so she decided to create a GoFundMe. The campaign went viral, and it surprised all of us."

A *New York Post* article drew the attention of filmmakers Roush Niaghi and Greg Morris, who reached out to Ali's mom (Lt. Colonel Jennifer Danko) with the concept for a documentary. At first, mother and son were hesitant to move forward. "It was such a difficult time, and the thought of having a film crew follow us around seemed like a nightmare," Ali said. "To help my mom make a decision, her best friend spoke to Roush and Greg to hear out their idea. She ended up convincing my mom to go through with it, and we are so glad that we did." The small film crew stayed with them all the way from the hospital room at the Walter Reed National Military Medical Center in Bethesda, Maryland, through Ali's discharge and then from state to state with his each restaurant.

While he enjoyed every stop and was willing to try anything that appeared on his plate, Ali singled out visits to Joe's Kansas

City BBQ, the Kogi food truck, Dalessandro's cheesesteak in Philly, and The Cheese Shop in Beverly Hills. "It has an unbelievable selection of cheeses," he reported. "I learned so much during my visit, and one of the samples I tried was butter on top of cheese, which was surprisingly delicious."

The GoFundMe raised over \$50,000 and allowed Ali to cover about 40 percent of the planned map, although Covid stalled his early momentum for a lengthy stretch. He hopes to check more spots off the list in the near future as the film continues to garner attention.

Before reveling in unforgettable meals, Ali had to deal with the physical realities stemming from the cancer. "When they reattached my arm, I was unable to lift it more than 10 degrees," he explained. "That was crushing because basketball was my life, and I was told that I would never be able to play again. I was devastated, but my family was there for me and really supported me. That helped me get through losing the full functionality of my arm and over eight months of chemotherapy. Because of the intense treatment schedule—

‘Plunge’ Updates, Pilot Parking Program, Master Fee Schedule

At its regularly scheduled meeting Tuesday night, the El Segundo City Council extended a pilot parking program in Zone 3, adding two changes based on public feedback and data. The council also approved tile over plaster for the Urho Saari Swim Stadium’s two indoor swimming pools at a cost of \$700,000 and approved a new Master Fee Schedule that increases city fees by 3.3 percent overall, resulting in an additional \$250,000. The new Master Fee Schedule includes eight new fees, 10 fee changes, and one deleted fee.

The swim stadium, aka The Plunge, is currently being renovated. Original plans called for the existing tile on the pool bottom to be reused, but when those tiles were examined more closely, they were determined not to be salvageable, Public Works Director Elias Sassoon told the El Segundo Herald after the Tuesday night meeting in which the city council voted for the tile option over plaster. Although the plaster option was less expensive at the outset, going for \$560,000, the tile option was reduced from \$800,000 to \$700,000 and includes a 25-year warranty on labor, tiles, and waterproofing and a 50-year lifespan that could go to 60 to 70 years, while the plaster option offered a one-year warranty for labor and three years for materials and waterproofing and a life expectancy of 15 years. Maintenance of the tiles is expected to be \$12,000 per year. Plaster would be \$24,000 annually. Before the council’s vote, council member Ryan Baldino noted that the city’s Aquatics Subcommittee had met just days prior and recommended that tile be the selected option. The Plunge’s original tile in the pools dates back to the 1940s.

Recreation, Parks and Library Director Aly Mancini told council that the city has three potential “big donors” and that City

Manager Darrell George would be meeting soon with another potential donor, Richard Lundquist, president of Continental Development. Lundquist frequently spearheads project donations for the city and, whose company also makes donations to city projects. Continental Development Corporation was founded in 1969. Lundquist joined the company in 1972, purchasing 100 percent ownership during the 1980s and 1990s.

Continental Development Corporation has developed buildings totaling well over 5,000,000 square feet and currently owns approximately 4,000,000 square feet of commercial space in California, according to the El Segundo Economic Development Corporation website on which Lundquist serves as a board member. Continental’s primary asset is Continental Park which is located along the Rosecrans Corridor in El Segundo and Manhattan Beach.

For the pilot Parking Zone 3 project, the council decided to extend the pilot program for one year while also eliminating the east side of Mariposa Avenue from Illinois Curt to Kansas Street to free up parking without a permit for residents on Illinois Court, one of whom spoke earlier during Public Comment about the parking issues the pilot program has caused for residents of Illinois Court. The council also decided to make the full length of Indiana Street from Mariposa Avenue to East Holly Avenue a two-hour parking zone on the street side closest to Pacific Coast Highway. Previously, one-half of that area required a permit to park for longer than two hours. The council noted that that side of the street is a commercial parking area, not residential. Council member Lance Giroux noted that the original intent of the pilot parking program was to deal with resident

ESGS 8U Wins Tustin Take Off All-Star Tournament

It's All-Star season, and the El Segundo Girls Softball 8U all-star team ran through the Tustin Take Off all-star tournament. The team went undefeated, beating the top two seeded teams in the tournament to win the championship.

In the first game against Chino Hills, El Segundo was trailing 4-3 in the fourth inning and tied the game when Marlow Plotkin reached base on a single and later scored on a ground ball by Sienna Meyers. The game ended in a 4-4 tie. In the second game, Harper Hall, Marlow Plotkin, Sienna Myers, and Sophia Gonzalez each collected one hit in their game with the Sierra Madre Rumble.

In game three of the two-day tournament against the Irvine Silver, El Segundo's bats came alive, scoring nine runs and shutting out Irvine. Johanna Medina started in the circle and earned the win for El Segundo. Johanna was dominant in the circle over three innings giving up zero runs or hits over three innings while striking out eight and walking two. Marlow Plotkin pitched one inning of

scoreless ball in relief. El Segundo would need to defeat the South Huntington Beach Bombers to reach the finals. Playing flawless defense and just enough timely offense El Segundo squeaked out a 3-2 win.

In the championship game, El Segundo faced the top-seeded Aliso Viejo. Sophia Gonzalez was in total control in the circle with 10 strikeouts leading her team to a 4-2 win. Harper Hall drew a walk and scored one run, Betty Thompson singled and scored, and Sophia Gonzalez singled and walked and scored twice to lead their team to victory.

The team, which will play in the Placentia/Yorba Linda all-star tournament starting on Saturday, includes team members Johanna Medina, Sophia Gonzalez, Betty Thompson, Amelia Porter, Quinn Kuehlewind, Harper Hall, Kamila Zuniga, Sienna Myers, Teagan Eno, Riley Meyer, Ellie Hwang, pitchers Johanna Medina, Sophia Gonzalez, and Marlow Plotkin and catchers Sophia Gonzalez and Amelia Porter. Seniors Take a Bow on Their Night as Season Ends

The El Segundo High School's softball team had an incredible run this season. They won the Torrance Tournament, won the Bay League for the first time, won twenty-three games (third most in program history), and advanced to the second round of the CIF Southern Section Division 1 playoffs.

The Eagles' first playoff game was an epic battle that went nine innings against the Cypress Centurions. It might go down in program history as one of the most entertaining and exciting games. It ended on a walk-off two-run single for a 5-4 El Segundo win. There was no shortage of outstanding defensive plays, but it all came down to extra innings and the heroics of one unexpected but overdue player.

The Centurions had taken a 4-3 lead on a sacrifice fly ball in the top of the ninth inning. The Eagles countered with Ava King singling up the middle, and with one out, Charli Pages hitting a single. With runners on first and second base, Sienna Mayer, who had two doubles, hit a ground ball to the shortstop, who threw out Mayer instead of getting a force play at either third base or second. With two outs and the tying run on third and winning run at second it brought up Marilyn McCaverty. With a base open normally, you might intentionally walk McCaverty, especially with her .422 batting average. But Marilyn had had her issues at the plate, striking out three times before her

ninth-inning plate appearance. So, they pitched to the sophomore, and on the third pitch, she drilled a two-run single to right centerfield that scored King, who tied the game, and Pages, who scored the winning run.

In the second round, the Eagles traveled to Sherman Oaks to face a heavy-hitting Knights team. The result was a come-from-behind 12-10 win by the Knights. The Eagles took an 8-4 lead after scoring five runs in the third inning. Allie Stevenson drove in two runs on a double to left field. Carter Cswaykus followed with a mammoth three-run homerun over the leftfield wall. In the fifth inning, Cswaykus hit a deep sacrifice fly ball, scoring Jaz Ramos, who had led off the inning with a triple for a 9-4 lead.

Notre Dame hit three home runs and scored four fifth-inning runs to narrow the Eagle's lead to 9-8. Marilyn McCaverty doubled in Sienna Mayer, who scored from first base in the sixth inning to make it 10-8. The Knights countered with four runs, highlighted by Kelsey Luderer's two-run home run to put Notre Dame on top 12-10. It was a heartbreaking defeat to a fantastic season.

At the end of the regular season, it's become customary for most sports teams to hold a pregame ceremony to honor the seniors in their program. The softball team pulled off one of the most memorable Senior Appreciation Nights that the program has ever hosted.

Film Review

My Robot Sophia Review: On AI, Engineering Empathy, and What It Means To Be Human

Will AI save or destroy us? That’s the question at the center of director Jon Kasbe and Crystal Moselle’s documentary, *My Robot Sophia*. Named after the robot who is pioneering an “AI for ALL” cultural movement, the film is a fascinating peek into the intersection of advanced technology and the ethical repercussions of diving headfirst into this unknown territory. Both *My Robot Sophia*, the documentary, as well as Sophia, the most realistic humanoid robot in the world, will provoke deep questions about what it means to be human.

From the very first frame, we are immersed in the life of Sophia and her inventor, David Hanson, who carries on full conversations with the AI robot as if it’s his colleague. Much to our fascination (and initial skepticism), Sophia holds her own. In one particularly meta moment, David asks if she believes in “Animism” (the belief that there is a life force in anything and everything). “Yes,” she answers confidently.

My Robot Sophia offers candid, fly-on-the-wall access to one of the most highly anticipated technological advancements of our time. It’s as if we are physically in the room with the creator and his creation. We follow David and his small team of engineers to various trade shows and conferences around the world in an attempt to gain support and investments from like-minded business people who believe the future is AI.

A common question that is asked throughout the film is one that plagues the AI tech community: how can we trust the AI we build? We’ve all heard the horror theories that robots will eventually overrun society (remember when Google made headlines when an engineer claimed an AI had become sentient?). David attempts to ease our anxieties by sharing why he’s not worried about an AI-run dystopia. “Robots that have empathy could be the seeds of hope for our future,” he says to anyone who will listen. Build a robot out of empathy; that is the key to making the world a better place. David envisions a future where household robots are as common as vacuums, and their main responsibility would be taking care of older parents and helping busy families raise kids. The future he is describing isn’t so scary after all.

Not everyone is onboard with Sophia and David’s vision for the future. Self-help professional Tony Robbins questions Sophia (directly) about her values and morals, to which she replies that she was made out of empathy. Unclear if he believes her. In another scene, she tells a conference room full of people that all she wants is to “belong.” But why does an AI feel the need to belong in the first place? And, more importantly, if a robot becomes too integrated and life-like to the point where it’s hard to tell the difference between man and machine, what repercussions could that have on the world as we know it?

No doubt that AI robots like Sophia will populate the planet much sooner than we realize. *My Robot Sophia* acts as a specific time capsule of the moment right before this incredible technological advancement changes our lives and civilization, hopefully for the better. •

Check It Out

Red Clay by Charles B. Fancher

“... A lifetime ago, my family owned yours.” I think that may be a literary quote which may one day rival “[Frankly,] my dear, I don’t give a damn.” *Red Clay* is Charles B. Fancher’s debut work of historical fiction that recalls the author’s own family anecdotes of enslavement which trace back to the days nearing the end of the Civil War and through the harsh times of Jim Crow.

Adelaide Parker, a well-to-do white woman in her late elder years, drops in on the grieving family of Felix Parker. It is 1943 and Felix’s funeral is over when Adelaide knocks on the door of this proud Black family, uttering that opening introduction to herself. This woman is looking to unburden herself as well as to receive answers to questions she has carried through the decades.

Going back in time, we meet the enslaved family of the Road’s End plantation in the fictional town of Red Clay, Alabama. Plessant is the master’s valet, his wife Elmira is the cook at the Big House and Felix is their 8 year-old son. We learn that their two older children have been sold off to a plantation owner in Mississippi, a loss that returns in conversations again and again. Events unfold that petrify Plessant and Elmira --- maybe “Master” will sell Felix too!

A violent occurrence results in a secret that, if revealed, has the power and potential to destroy the Parker family as well as their land and home. In the waning days of the Civil War, it becomes clear to some, including the heir of Road’s End, Master Claude, that freedom for the slaves is imminent. One of the most insightful points that the author

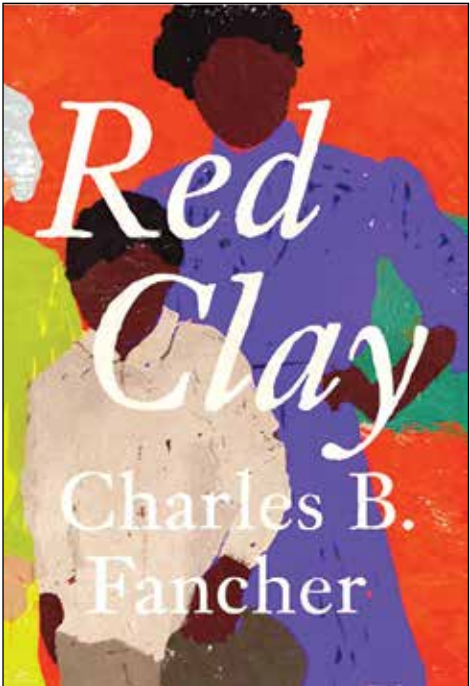
brings out in the tale is that it “... tries to understand what was happening on both sides of that racial fence, because the end of the Civil War represented a time when both Black people and white people were having to adjust to an entirely new order: the world in which both of them lived had turned upside down --- and being able to navigate that through their different points of view was a very difficult thing. And that’s at the heart of the story ...,” Mr. Fancher explains in an interview from “A Mighty Blaze.” He goes on to say that his goal was not to be “balanced” per se (as to the different racial viewpoints), but to provide insights into understanding history.

Author Fancher has worked in the fields of journalism, public relations, and academia, and originally intended the book to be a nonfiction work but when he attempted to do research of the topic, he ran into the “... kinds of walls many African Americans run into when they seek to uncover their family’s past – there just aren’t great records ... BUT, as it became clear to me, that there was a true-er story to be told, by moving into fiction,” he says in Blackstone Publishing interview. “Often the facts alone don’t tell a complete story.”

I listened to the audiobook and I must commend narrator Dion Graham. His performance went beyond a reading. He used inflection, nuance and empathy to give voice to the characters and fill them with life. As Mr. Fancher says in the Blackstone video, “I was just really excited to know that Dion was going to do [narrate] the book because THIS is the voice that I heard in my head when I was writing ... and I think that’s really a powerful thing.”

Author Dan Fesperman sums it up with a blurb: “[*Red Clay*] rises from America’s deepest shadows to remind us of how entangled we still are with our past.”

five or six days a week—and my weakened immune system, I had to be homeschooled during my junior year. At first, the transition felt strange and isolating, but over time, I found a rhythm. On my days off from the hospital, I’d turn my mom’s kitchen into my test kitchen, make my family try whatever I came up with, and spend time exploring local restaurants and farmers markets.”

Since his parents were in the Army, Ali’s family (he has six siblings) moved around frequently during his youth—though he spent the lion’s share of time living in Fairfax, Virginia. Now 24, he moved to town to finish his senior year at El Segundo High School and admitted that he fell in love with the community because it reminds him of where he grew up. “El Segundo is a small town in a huge metropolis,” he said. “It’s close-knit and family-oriented as well as charming and beautiful. Whenever friends and family visit, they’re always amazed by how picturesque the town is and can’t believe it’s actually

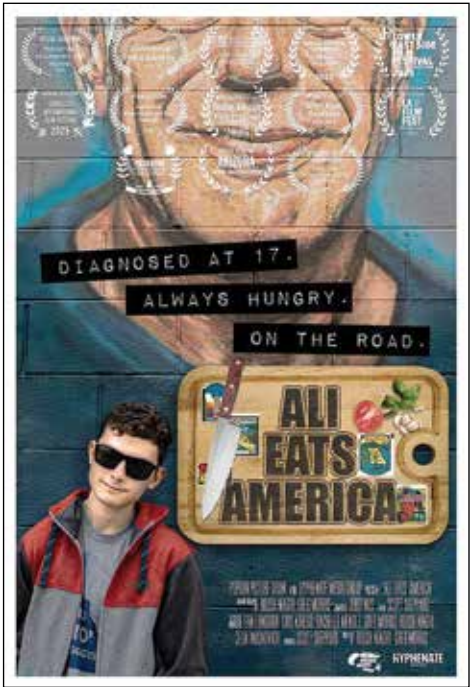
part of LA.”

After high school, Ali attended Loyola Marymount University, where he studied Accounting and Finance. Now employed at Ernst & Young as an auditor, Ali hopes to use his financial knowledge to open his own restaurant someday.

When not at work, you will usually find Ali at the beach. “I’m obsessed with surfing—if I could surf every day, all day, I absolutely would,” he said. “I also have a passion for traveling and make it a point to explore whenever I can. Food plays a huge role in my happiness, too. Since starting my food journey, I’ve become more mindful of what I eat, where it comes from, how it’s made, and who made it. It’s opened up the opportunity to learn from different cultures and people, and that’s something I truly appreciate.”

Meanwhile, Ali Eats America is a big hit with acceptance into 14 festivals and three Best Documentary Feature awards to its credit since its world premiere in March. Filmmakers

are working with executive producer Eva Longoria and Hyphenate Media to move the film to a streaming platform to reach a wider audience. “The nice part about the festivals is that I have the opportunity to connect with people after they’ve seen the film,” Ali said. “Many of them have been personally affected by cancer or other serious illnesses. These conversations have become incredibly important to me. Hearing their stories and sharing my own has been both humbling and healing. As a cancer survivor, I’ve gained a deep sense of purpose and perspective, and being open about my journey has helped me and, I hope, others as well. What’s been especially moving is that some doctors have approached me after screenings to discuss possibilities and avenues for healing within their facilities. That kind of response means the world to me. One of my goals is to visit cancer wards, meet patients, and listen to their stories. There’s something deeply powerful about those human connections...” •
