Coffee With the Cops: Dominique Alvarez Works to Keep El Segundo Informed

El Segundo prides itself on its safe neighborhoods and low crime rate. This is in large part thanks to the work of the El Segundo Police Department (ESPD) and people like Dominique Alvarez, a crime prevention analyst, and community engagement officer for the city.

Alvarez grew up in a small town called Los Banos, California. Her mother was a dispatcher, and after completing a degree in Global Studies and Liberal Arts with an emphasis in Media Studies, she began to work in city government as an intern. Eventually, she landed a job at the El Segundo Police Department.

"When I first wanted to work for a police department, I wanted to do dispatch because my mom was a dispatcher," says Alvarez. With some insight into life at a police department, Alvarez wanted to dip her toes and learn more before diving into police training. This resulted in a job as a police assistant in the records division, where she wrote reports and learned codes.

After a while, with some retirements and internal movement, Alvarez saw the opening for her current position.

"It had a lot more to do with social media and working with the community and everything else that I went to school for," she says, "I was thinking: this is what I need to do, this is what I enjoy doing."

A typical morning for Alvarez looks like reading through crime reports from the night before and logging them. At the end of the month, she looks through the accumulated reports and logs and analyzes what type of crime is happening in which parts of the city and decides the best course of action to prevent further crime.

For example, a common incident that appears in her reports for El Segundo is property

crime. This is often boiled down to something as simple as leaving a door unlocked or leaving valuables visible in a car. While she says, it's rare that something big lands on their table, theft continues to be a regular report.

Over the course of the pandemic, Alvarez explains, there was a spike in theft of catalytic converters, a part of a car's exhaust system that contains valuable metals. In response to this, they began sending units overnight to highly trafficked areas and kept their lights on, and the city saw a significant decrease in the number of thefts.

Another major part of her job is getting the word out to the citizens of El Segundo. Due to Covid restrictions, most news and outreach throughout the pandemic has been

El Segundo Author Dick Upton; Master Chronicler of General Custer and the Indian Wars By Duane Plank especially the historic timeframe surround

We will start with a Thursday morning trivia quiz...What do George Custer, the United States general who became famous (infamous?) after he and many of his charges were annihilated by the coalescing of three Indian tribes on a deadly battlefield back in late June of 1876 along the Little Bighorn River in the Montana territory, and Hall of Famer "Prince Hal" Newhouser, a southpaw pitcher for both the Detroit Tigers and Cleveland Indians, have in common? A General and a Prince?

Tick-tock... Does anyone know the answer? And the answer is: both men are subjects of serious interest to El Segundo, author, publisher, and resident Richard "Dick" Upton.

Upton has a keen interest in history,

especially the historic timeframe surrounding the life and death of Custer. One of his books, of which more than 50 have been published, featured the Battle of the Little Bighorn, known to the Lakota and other Plains Indians, as the Battle of the Greasy Grass, and commonly referred to as Custer's Last Stand. It was an armed engagement between combined forces of the Lakota, Northern Cheyenne, and Arapaho tribes and the 7th Cavalry Regiment of the United States Army. The battle, which resulted in the defeat of U.S. forces, was the most significant action of the Great Sioux War of 1876. On June 25–26, 1876, it took place along the Little Big Horn River in the Crow Indian Reservation in southeastern Montana Territory.

Irene is survived by her children Christine and Gary with their spouses, her sisters, Leslie and Patricia, several nieces and nephews and her granddaughters Mika and Amy. The family will be having a private service in August to celebrate Irene. •

Oprah and Prince Harry Talk Mental Health Struggles in The Me You Can't See

The topic of mental health has taken on more importance over the last year when isolation and loneliness was universally felt at an alltime high. Co-produced by Oprah and Prince mind so much. The first episode is broken up into five chapters that highlight different people dealing with their own mental health struggles, none of which are alike. It's a safe narrative structure, but the driving force here

Harry, The Me You Can't See is a documentary series comprised of hour-long episodes that go into intimate detail about struggles with mental health and just how universal these feelings of helplessness and sadness are. Throughout their candid sit down conversation, Prince Harry and Oprah explain how 2020 put a mirror in front of the grief that was already present in so many people, and their goal for the series is to shine a light on the «invisible injury» that is mental health. This series is important, personal, and now streaming on Apple TV+.

The Me You Can't See is by far one of the most heartfelt and vulnerable series that is currently streaming on platforms today. Seeing how some of the most powerful people in entertainment put on brave faces and pretend like everything's ok, when in reality they're struggling to just make it through the day, is heartbreaking. The series also shares the personal journeys of other public figures, including Lady Gaga and Glenn Close, with more to be included throughout the various episodes.

Technically speaking, The Me You Can't See is a very traditional docu-series and visually, it can almost be confused for a 20/20 special. It relies heavily on the "talking heads" style of interview but when the talking heads are Prince Harry and Oprah Winfrey, we don't isn't the cinematic achievements, rather they stories they propel.

Everyone who connects to this series in one way or another should feel comforted by the fact that we are all kindred spirits with struggles and insecurities of our own. Acting as a starting point towards collective healing and understanding, The Me You Can't See proves that everyone is carrying some sort of emotional baggage that goes undetected. 2020 City of El Segundo Urban Water Management Plan Update: **Public Notice**

The Urban Water Management Planning Act (AB 797) and Assembly Bill 2661 (AB 2661) respectively, require all urban water suppliers who provide water to more than 3,000 customers, to prepare and adopt an Urban Water Management Plan (UWMP) every five years. Our last plan was adopted in 2015/2016. The 2020 plan, which includes data through the end of 2020, is required to be adopted by July 2021. As mandated, the City of El Segundo, in coordination with the West Basin Municipal Water District (WBMWD), is making the draft 2020 Plan available for public review in May 2021. Any interested parties can request information or leave comments with the City's Public Works Department.

Since the original act's passage in 1983, several amendments have been added. One of the most recent changes includes legislative requirements set forth by SBX7-7 or the20x2020 Water Conservation Plan, which calls for a 20 percent per capita water use reduction by the year 2020. The City's reduced water use targets were introduced in the 2010 UWMP and met in the 2020 Plan update. The City is currently in compliance with SBX7-7 requirements

A public hearing will be held in June/ July 2021 to present the final plan to City Council and allow for public comment on the Plan update. The date of the hearing is to be determined.





conducted over the department's social media pages. However, Alvarez is looking forward to getting back to in-person events, which she gets to plan.

One such event is "Coffee with the Cops," which will hopefully return in June. Residents can grab a coffee and ask their police department any questions regarding rules, regulations, and safety. It's also a chance for the police department to educate the city on crime prevention and other useful tips.

"One of the things [we talk about] is how to report suspicious activity. We want to emphasize reporting suspicious activity, and Alvarez. They discuss what suspicious activity looks like, how to recognize it, and how to properly report it.

As far as community protection, Alvarez also heads up the neighborhood watch program. Operating on a volunteer basis, El Segundo is looking for block captains to keep watch over their specific neighborhood and inform their neighbors of anything. If something happens in an area of El Segundo, Alvarez has a direct line of contact with local block captains, who are encouraged to get to know their neighbors and keep everyone informed. This helps localize prevention and ensure

Alvarez's work revolves around keeping in touch with the community of El Segundo.

ESPD partners with several organizations around the city. Coming up, they will be awarding a "good guy or girl award" with the Kiwanis Club of El Segundo, which recognizes outstanding citizen behavior in a police report. This round's recipient will be going to a gentleman who stopped a suspect from hurting a female friend, essentially saving her life until ESPD could arrive.

There is no surefire way to stop one hundred percent of crime from happening. This is what Alvarez describes as the hardest part of her job. Despite all the research, communication, and effort on the part of the police and the community, crime will always happen. Alvarez

is using her position to ensure it happens as little as possible.

"We are working really, really hard to stop property crimes and all of our crimes," she says, "The whole department is working as a team, and I think the whole city should work as a team, too." Alvarez encourages El Segundo residents to get to know their neighbors, join the neighborhood watch program, and don't make yourself vulnerable to being a victim. This includes not leaving valuables in your vehicle, checking to make sure doors are locked, getting packages off your doorstep as soon as possible, and looking out for your neighbors. •

The fight was an overwhelming victory for Indians, who were led into battle by several major Native American titans, including Crazy Horse. The visions of Sitting Bull had inspired it. The U.S. 7th Cavalry, a force of 700 men, suffered the major defeat while commanded by Custer. Five of the Cavalry's twelve companies were annihilated, and Custer was killed, as were four of his male relatives; the total U.S. casualty count included 268 dead and 55 severely wounded (six died later from their wounds).

The battle and events in the tumultuous ensuing decades in Montana, which became a state in 1889, piqued the interest of Upton, and he began a career documenting that locales events and that period in Western American history.


El Segundo resident Todd Felker considers Upton a long-time friend. During our phone conversation, Felker shared that he used to, back in the '90s, do some computer work for Upton. "(Upton) has lived in town forever," Felker shared and is "Probably one of the countries foremost experts on General Custer. He has written a lot of books, published a lot on topics related to that facet of the Civil War." Felker said that Upton did not limit his interests to researching post-Civil War history. "He has been in some bands, played baseball until up into his 70's, late sixties at least, and has a lot of interesting baseball stories," Felker said.

As he entered his golden years, Felker said, Upton continued working, writing, editing, and publishing his books and processing orders on websites such as Upton and Sons.

On the sporting side, Upton was always a baseball pitcher, Felker added. Once he entered military service, Upton played on a 'club' baseball team in the Army, hoping to move up to the varsity army team, but his superior officer nixed that idea. Undeterred, Felker said, Upton seized an opportunity to pitch against the regular Army team and proceeded to shut them down, which prompted a keen baseball observer, and Army General, to inquire "who is that kid on the mound?" who was stifling the bats of the top-seeded team in the long-ago held Army tournament.

Upton said that "Baseball and the Civil War era were two things that I seemed to excel in. I wasn't very verbal," he admitted. He was born and raised in Flint, Michigan, in 1933, "a great time," he said while noting that "Flint (today) is a grim place, but in those days, was a wonderful place. Work was good, and people were buying second homes. It was wonderful."

Upton said that both of his parents were from Canada and that his mother was the child of a "well-off" family and had inherited "some



Dick Upton and Wife Frankie. Photo Courtesy of Doug Westfall. money." Because of health issues, the family was counseled to relocate to California and landed in Culver City more than 70 years ago.

He was, at the time, favoring playing baseball and plying his musical chops on the tuba while also sharpening the verbal skills that he deemed necessary to develop in his new environment. He attended Venice High School, continued refining his tuba talents, met people by playing baseball, and became a standout pitcher. Upton related that he was not overpowering on the mound, but gave credit to a childhood Michigan friend, who saw that Upton had potential on the hill, and as soon as Upton grew a bit, he started to have success on the mound.

Upton flashed back some seventy years ago, remembering that he pitched against El Segundo High School at a long-ago raised field on Arena St., a prep baseball game contested more than seven decades ago; Upton said that he struck out the first four batters.

Following the baseball trajectory, Upton played service baseball while he was serving the United States in the Korean War. He also won pitching accolades in American Legion baseball.

He received a scholarship to Loyola Marymount University, but that did not work out too well. "I was successful there, but I wasn't mature enough and just could not keep my grades up. Lost my scholarship, so I went into the U.S. Army." He later sojourned to Alaska to play

summer ball in the Alaska Baseball League, a league that still endures. It was around that time in his sporting life, Upton said, that his aspirations to climb the ladder of professional baseball were doused. "I found out that you had to be," Upton said, "more than just good."

As a tuba player, he was considered by those who knew music as "more than just good." Like baseball had, his tuba playing opened "a lot of doors" for him. He said that he played "symphonic, operatic stuff," but to pay the bills, Upton realized he "had to get a job." He landed employment with the Bank of America in Culver City, ascending to the post of lending officer. He got hitched to his wife Frankie, a schoolteacher, and decided to leave his B of A job and return to school, "even though I was a terrible student." As an older returning student, Upton said he got "serious," to not be derailed by extracurricular activities, including baseball.

Upton later landed a job in the Wiseburn Unified School District, teaching instrumental music and leading the student band. He was also playing the tuba professionally, working with what he termed "wonderful, wonderful, conductors and musicians." In the late '50s and the early '60s, a time frame Upton called "the golden age of the Wiseburn District," he said school districts were always looking for "winning football coaches, and successful band directors," who could help entice parents and their children to enroll in the district.

Upton said that the prior band director in the district was "a better musician than me," but that his musical leanings, Upton noted, mentioning Mozart, were not the type of tunes that were necessarily helpful in motivating a teenage musician of that era.

Upton said budget cuts threatened his music program, which was eventually axed. He went to the superintendent and tried to devise a solution and broached a unique option. Upton was slated to teach daily in the classroom, which he was not too keen about. He offered to pay someone else to teach the class (\$100 bucks a day at the time). "So, I paid \$18,000 dollars to "continue the privilege of teaching band and orchestra." That game-plan fizzled-out, however, only lasting for a year, but Upton said that it was "Quite an experience, glad that I did it."

So how did a Michigan lad, by way of Southern California, become immersed in post-Civil War history and the demise of General Custer? Upton got married to a woman from Billings, Montana, (Frankie) whose grandfather was stationed at Fort Custer all those years ago. Frankie's grandfather was involved in the Cavalry.

Said Upton: "I wanted to find out more about grandpa," but in the pre-Google days, that was not an easy task. He said that Fort Custer was built one year after the Custer battle, but that the Custer battlefield had been "completely wiped off of the map."

Book publisher Doug Westfall of The Paragon Agency has been working with Upton for 25-orso years. They met about a quarter-century ago when both were attending book-related events in Los Angeles and formed a partnership that exists to this day.

"He has published more books on Indian Wars and Custer's Last Stand than any other publisher," Westfall said. "He is the champion of Western history, and we applaud that," while noting that Paragon is planning to publish another Upton book this summer. "You have to hand it to the guy for what he has done," Westfall said.

As for his support of the continuing sometimes somnambulant Detroit Tigers (although they did garner a recent winning streak), Upton offered that "They win just enough to break your heart." Alas, when this story was filed, the Tigers sported a not-so robust 17-26 record, good enough to be ensconced in fourth place in the American League Central Division.

Adding a little more local flavor to the story: When local baseball icon George Brett was signed by the Kansas City Royals more than 50 years ago, he was jettisoned by Royal management to play his first professional season in Billings, Montana. Obviously awfully familiar with the Montana environs, Upton traveled to the unofficially christened "Big Sky Country" to watch Brett play. The future hall-of-famer ascended from the dugout to speak with the Upton's. "I am not hitting now," Brett said, "but I am going to start hitting." It seems to have worked out OK for Mr. Brett, right?

The Uptons have called El Segundo home for more than 50 years, and Dick said that that is a timeframe that he has cherished. He has met "A group of really decent people," he said, calling the friends and business associates that he had made "keepers, people that I am proud to cross paths with, and I hope that never ends," noting how El Segundo locals' band together to help out their neighbors. "I hope that the city stays that way."

The people who have "crossed paths" with Upton probably feel the same way. •


