## Taking a Look at Measure W

### City Attorney's Impartial Analysis

The El Segundo Municipal Code currently prohibits all commercial cannabis activity in the City and no person can be issued a license or permit for the cultivation, possession, manufacture, distribution, processing, storing, laboratory testing, labeling, transportation, distribution, delivery, or sale of cannabis or cannabis products. Measure W would repeal the prohibition and replace it with an ordinance that would allow for specified types of commercial cannabis businesses to operate in the City, subject to a licensing and regulatory scheme, if they are: (i) located more than 1,000 feet from any school or day care center, (ii) located more than 600 feet from any youth center, and (iii) located east of Pacific Coast Highway (PCH) but not located on PCH, El Segundo Boulevard, Rosecrans Avenue, Imperial Highway, or Aviation Boulevard. In addition, each cannabis retail business must contain a minimum of 1,750 square feet of gross floor area.

Specifically, the ordinance would permit cannabis retail sales, cultivation, manufacturing, distribution, testing, and microbusinesses. A cannabis "microbusiness" is a business that engages in at least three of the following: cultivation, manufacturing, distribution, or retail sales.

Measure W does not place a cap on the total number of commercial cannabis permits ("CBPs") for retail-only cannabis businesses. Rather, it authorizes the City Council to establish the maximum number of permits by resolution. Measure W provides that the maximum number of CBPs that may be issued for other types of commercial cannabis businesses is zero unless the City Council subsequently decides to allow such permits by resolution.

Measure W would establish an application process for CBPs for retail businesses. The

process would require applicants to submit a list of owner and manager qualifications, along with several different plans. The city manager would be required to issue a CBP to an applicant that submits all required application materials and passes a criminal background check. Once issued, a CBP would remain in place indefinitely unless suspended or revoked.

Measure W was placed on the ballot by the City Council.

A "yes" vote by a simple majority of the votes cast would repeal the City's current prohibition on commercial cannabis activities and instead permit commercial cannabis activities.

A "no" vote would maintain the City's prohibition on commercial cannabis activities.

## West Basin, Hyperion and LAWA Updates

It was an evening of updates, a \$75,000 grant, and discussion of a new pilot program for residential sound insulation to combat airport noise, excessive commercial fire alarms, and city proclamations for National Bullying Prevention Month and Breast Cancer Awareness month during Tuesday's regularly scheduled El Segundo City Council meeting.

The most extended update came from the West Basin Water District's Scott Houston, who oversees the water division in El Segundo and is vice president of the board of directors. Houston delivered a 30-minute presentation on the current drought and

was followed by an update on the city's neighbor to the west, the Hyperion plant, by city staff. Due to ongoing issues with odors and emissions from the plant, which the city has declared a public emergency and is preparing for litigation against the City of Los Angeles, which owns and operates the Hyperion Water Reclamation Plant. The plant's July 2021 emergency sewage spill into the ocean and plant flooding continues to impact El Segundo residents, who say they are experiencing health issues that lower their quality of life.

City Manager Darrell George listed five recent activities or actions related

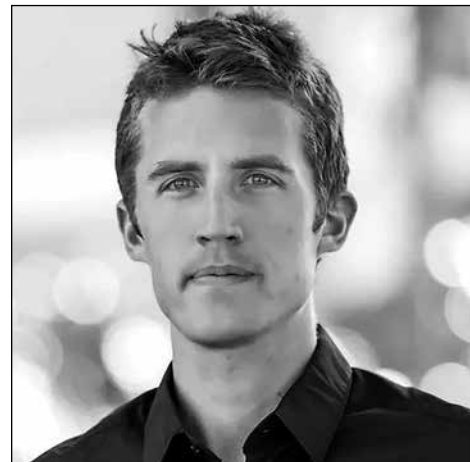

1. Roughly \$5M in short term projects have been approved to redo skate park, teen center, basketball courts, Joselyn Center, baseball fields and irrigation, yet there is approximately \$60M capital improvements that are unfunded. How can this be addressed and what would be your priority?

**Ryan Baldino:** We have 9 committees and commissions which advise our City Council. One such committee is the Capital Improvement Advisory Committee which reviews our infrastructure needs and develops a 5-year Capital Improvement Program which ranks and prioritizes all infrastructure projects and makes recommendations to our City Council. Our Parks and Recreation Commission is currently working on a field use assessment to determine how our fields are being used in order to plan what updating and improvements are needed at Rec Park. They recommended, and the city recently approved, the modernization of the Teen Center and the

Joslyn Center, and I believe that is a great start. My priority in renovating our park facilities will be based upon listening to the information and advice from our residents who serve on these commissions, as well as the feedback they receive from fellow engaged citizens. Informed decisions only come from input from our community.

**Michelle Keldorf:** Maintaining our parks and facilities is key to a vibrant community. While there has been discussion of a bigger spending initiative to redesign Recreation Park, I am a proponent of completing these short-term projects as soon as possible. Further delays bring diminished enjoyment along with cost escalation. We need to identify a funding source for public infrastructure improvements. I would prioritize updates to our water and sewer systems while concurrently developing a comprehensive plan to address our streets and sidewalks. Over the next two years, I would engage staff to evaluate potential financing mechanisms to determine the path most aligned with our community's goals and objectives. In the near term, we need to spend responsibly. I believe in order to avoid runaway spending, we must budget first and design accordingly for future projects.

**Robin Patch:** The Parks and Recs Department has proposed both a long-term and short-term strategy to remodel Rec Park and its facilities. The approximately \$60 million-dollar unfunded capital improvements would be incurred \*if\* the City approved a long-term complete overhaul of Rec Park. This would include reconfiguring the entire park layout, demolishing several current structures and constructing new buildings in their place. I am opposed to this plan because it is highly expensive, and would also require the Park to close during construction. I am in favor

of the lower cost short-term plan to revamp the Park's existing buildings and fields on a case-by-case basis. This way residents can still utilize the Park while it is under construction, and will also benefit from updated facilities in a shorter time frame.

**John Pickhaver:** My top priority would be funding these short term projects to ensure residents are getting the most of our facilities and amenities. There's a considerable amount of money already allocated for these purposes. We need to work diligently to see those funds are appropriated to get these projects done. As for more broad capital improvement projects, I would approach this on multiple fronts. First, earmarking an increase in our local sales tax could be used to fund these projects in the long-term. This option increases the pool of contributors to this new fund because most of our local tax revenue actually comes from those living outside of El Segundo spending at businesses throughout town. Additionally, I would engage in discussions with El Segundo residents about a CIP bond to raise such funds. Whichever approach we pursue it must start with communication with residents to determine the best course of action.

**Chris Pimentel:** Mega-projects are seductive, conceptually efficient, and nearly impossible for cities to do well. There may be \$40-60 million of theoretical work in Rec Park, but the idea that the city embarks on a grand overhaul, and tax you for it, is a canard. That's just dumping money into the "Government Big Idea Woodchipper" (imagine a trip to the River Delta Tunnels on the Bullet Train and seeing the Sepulveda Pass Light Rail as we go!).

Smart governance means adopting a park plan, prioritizing projects, and allocating specific funding. The restrooms were aw-

ful, so we are replacing them. Joselyn is a rebuild; it's too far out of code to update. The future clubhouse permutation accounts for half of the park's needs. This can all be done with financial discipline. Since 1960, mega-projects incorporating many large projects, are replete with delays and budget overruns. . . just take the 105. . .

**2. Residents have written to say crime is up, electric bikes are a menace on sidewalks and streets with no ramifications and the police seem to be patrolling less. How would you address this?**

**Ryan Baldino:** Everyone deserves to feel safe in our town. The overall increase in crimes and thefts in the South Bay region has also been felt here in El Segundo. The explosion of electric bike use is a concern in our community, and the safety of the children and adults who do not obey traffic signs is a real problem. One of many benefits of living in El Segundo is having our own Police and Fire Departments who recognize our concerns and engage with our community. From having “coffee with a cop” events or by recently “greeting” our middle schoolers on their way to school to remind them of the importance of helmet and bike laws, our police continue to demonstrate their understanding of the ever-changing safety issues our town is facing. I will work to continue the open dialog and engagement our public safety officers have with our community.

**Michelle Keldorf:** From the rapid increase in the number of electric bikes to catalytic converter theft and homeless outreach, our Police Department is tasked with a wide range of present-day public concerns. As a City Council member, I am committed to working with our department heads to secure the resources they need to be successful. I

sure was pulled last minute and no longer appears on this ballot. Unfortunately, there was not enough time to reconvene City Council to vote on whether to pull its own initiative before the deadline passed. The City of El Segundo's measure remains on the ballot for our community to vote on and determine.

The measure was written with what we, the El Segundo City Council, believe is in our community's best interests. Voters will decide if dispensaries will be allowed to open and operate in the city. It is important to note that while this measure does technically provide for "unlimited" business licenses, it purposefully limits where in El Segundo those companies can be located. This measure allows dispensaries only in a small specific area on the city's east-side – away from schools, residential neighborhoods, public parks, playing fields, and major thoroughfares. Specifically, you will not see dispensaries west of or on Pacific Coast Highway. In addition, this measure retains local control about who can operate within the city and where.

We feel that if the voters want to have dispensaries in El Segundo, that this measure will allow it to happen with the least amount of negative impact to the community, in a responsible way, and maintained local control. •

to Hyperion:

- That a recent abatement order given to Hyperion by the South Coast Air Quality Management District had been fulfilled on Sept. 27 and 28, when Hyperion took two samples of Volatile Organic Compounds as required by the abatement order. Results will be available in the next couple of weeks.

- That the city's mayor, public works director, and the city manager had been invited by Barbara Romero, executive director of the Los Angeles Bureau of Sanitation (LASAN), which is in charge of Hyperion, for a tour of Hyperion to see firsthand the number of measures being taken for odor control. The chief engineer gave an in-depth presentation. Some \$103 million in improvements are in the works and being bid out in the next 24 months. George noted that an officer from Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti's office had been on the tour with them, calling this an "elevated" level of communication between the two cities.

- That two more notices of violation had been issued over the past weekend to Hyperion.

- That he had a one-on-one meeting with the incoming chair of AQMD last week and "discussed our entire situation with her."

- That the first of monthly joint force task meetings had taken place at Hyperion with the city of El Segundo's fire department representatives and the city's new communications manager attending. The joint task force will develop protocols for communication when residents and visitors in El Segundo need to be aware of something related to the plant. George noted that management officials from LA County Public Health, the City of Los Angeles Emergency Management and Fire departments, Los Angeles County Beaches & Harbors, and LA Sanitation, which oversees Hyperion, are on the task force.

Mayor Drew Boyles asked questions to which George and City Attorney Mark Hensley responded. When asked about potential state legislation that would authorize an air quality management district to require and enforce the presence of specific air monitors that detect specific chemicals in the air at wastewater plants (like they can do with refineries), Hensley noted that the state legislature is a couple of months away from being in session to work on such matters.

Of the two recent samples taken by Hyperion, George told City Council, "It's my understanding that the samples do not include any testing on the presence of H2S (Hydrogen Sulfide) or NOx (Nitrogen Oxides) fumes. So, they have been hesitant about including those other two tests for those chemicals. We are pressing them on that." Hensley added that according to the city's Public Works Director Elias Sassoon, Hyperion has the ability to test for such chemicals. Said Hensley, "The monitors they have, at least the hardware can plug in these different monitoring devices. They've

just chosen not to do so at this time." Added George, "And from what I understand also, it's not very costly to add those two monitors the city attorney is referring to, so we will continue to press them on that."

Earlier, during the Public Comment portion of the meeting, a resident asked for more information regarding the El Segundo Police Department's internal review of an incident in late May in which a reported unresponsive driver with a reported handgun parked on Center Street near two public schools during daytime hours eluded the response, which included police officers, K9 units, armored vehicles, drones, and crisis negotiators. The resident said that the subsequent arrest of the individual believed to be the driver in question was not an adequate explanation of what had transpired. "For you to continue to do nothing and allow trust and faith in our government to continue to drop, and allow public doubts about whether there will ever be any real accountability for law enforcement to continue to grow, I think that we can all agree that is not a good outcome here." In response, George told City Council he had "fully reviewed" the report and appreciated ES Police Chief Jaime Bermudez' efforts "toward identifying what shortcomings were identified. There were several items in the report of recommendations to improve efforts." He said he'd speak with the chief "about potentially making the report available and get back to the council on that."

In other news, the city accepted a \$75,000 grant from Chevron for economic development, bringing the total dollar value the oil company has provided the city during the last ten years to \$1.3 million approximately.

On Tuesday night, representatives from Los Angeles World Airports presented a pilot Residential Sound Insulation program that is offered jointly with the Federal Aviation Administration. Interested El Segundo residents can get more details by calling a hotline at (424) 646-7444, emailing [lxrsi@lawa.org](mailto:lxrsi@lawa.org), and visiting a dedicated website at [www.LAWA.org/LAXrsiProgram](http://www.LAWA.org/LAXrsiProgram). The program is fully funded by LAWA and the FAA and, as such, is free to qualifying residents. Sixty properties will be included in the pilot program, so homeowners are encouraged to act quickly.

Council also heard from Fire Chief Deena Lee about a way to recover city costs related to false commercial fire alarms. Under the proposed change, businesses would be fined starting with their third false fire alarm within a year. That change to the city code will be brought back to be approved by the council at their next meeting on Oct. 18.

Council member Carol Pirsztuk announced that this week is Homecoming Week at El Segundo High School and that the parade of floats "made by hand" assembled by students will take place this Friday. •
