# **The Plunge Redesign Starts Now**

The doors are locked, the lights are off, and The Plunge is quiet these days. El Segundo's public indoor swimming venue is in mothballs, put there by COVID-19. For recreational and competitive swimmers and water polo teams, the Wiseburn Aquatic Center across town is the only public swimming pool currently open. The rebuilding of The Plunge has been anticipated since the Wiseburn swim complex opened in early 2019 on the eastern outskirts of El Segundo. The city paid \$1.8 million toward the building of the aquatics center. The Wiseburn district and private donors paid \$6 million each to make the project happen. As public-construction projects go, pools are expensive, and maintenance is costly.

Almost three years later, El Segundo is making good on its promise to rehabilitate The Plunge. The swimming community has waited patiently for the city's next big capitalimprovement project, which involves a deep dive into the inner workings of the 80-year-old venue. That will include the boilers that heat the water, the ventilation, bleacher seating, the pool deck, and everything from the windows to the changing rooms. Before any decisions are made, and blueprints are drawn, the city is asking the swimming community, residents, and even non-residents this question: What do you want? El Segundo has posted a survey link on its website to gather responses and ideas for the design team hired by the city. Interest in the project - tentatively scheduled to be completed near the end of 2023 - is running high, based on the responses so far to the 11-question survey. Within 72 hours of posting the link, 500 people had filled out surveys, according to spokeswoman Martha Guzman-Hurtado. The comment period closed on October 7. The survey is a first step to

balance what swimmers and families want

and what El Segundo can afford, especially

since this project is happening in a sluggish economy. Over the summer, the city awarded the Mithun design firm a \$130,000 contract for preliminary work to renovate the Urho Saari art-deco swim stadium. The Plunge was built in the 1940s and needed mechanical and structural repairs to meet current standards.

The City Council a year ago set aside \$1 million toward the project, which could cost between \$5 million and \$10 million to finish. Mithun's team drafted the community-wants survey and will collect the feedback and come back to the City Council with the results. The Mithun design group has a 40-year history in Los Angeles County, refurbishing the historic Robert Frost Auditorium in Culver City and the Egyptian Theater in Hollywood. The team is experienced at modernizing pool and recreational venues and will partner with the Aquatic Design Group to usher The Plunge into a new era. Together, they have reimagined community pools in Northern California and Tacoma, Wash., according to their proposal submitted to El Segundo Parks and Recreation officials.

The Plunge remodel is expected to take 18 to 24 months. The \$1 million earmarked to get the project started involved a trade-off. Instead of spending the money on the pool at Acacia Park, the council decided the money could be better spent on The Plunge. The city's new Public Works Director, Elias Sassoon, will oversee the capital improvements at the indoor swim stadium. Chevron has donated \$500,000, and once El Segundo officials see the new designs and know the project's cost, they'll have a better idea of how much




# **Chef Hannes Brings Fine-Dining to Main St.**

It may seem like a whirlwind-the everchanging lineup of restaurants throughout El Segundo-but Main St. has always been resolute with a few favorites. For the past 20 years, Chef Hannes has endured as one of the town's main culinary pioneers. Hannes and Lisa Kraschitzer are the owners of Chef Hannes at 411 Main St. From his Austrian roots, Hannes delivers a barrage of world flavors that blend delectable, savory entrees with exquisite wines-a combination guaranteed to create a memorable experience for guests. And keeping that tradition alive, Chef Hannes has appointed a new Head Chef to re-introduce the concept of fine-dining back to the community.

Chef Jesus Liberato—a protege of Chef Hannes-has taken over management on the Main St. location since the beginning of October. After working closely with Hannes as a waiter, a short-order cook, and working at a slew of other restaurants in the South Bay, Liberato was thrilled to receive the offer to revamp the space, even amid the challenges of COVID-19. "I've known Hannes since he was an Executive Chef working in Beverly Hills, and at the time, I was working with him one or two days a week. ### Working for Who?

At the August 18, 2020 City Council Meeting, the City Council was advised that recycled water, water and wastewater operational costs were going significantly up (you can watch around 2:21 timeframe on the El Segundo TV YouTube channel). It appears Hyperion has been irresponsible in forecasting their finances and from FY 2017 to FY 2021, and there's been a 91% increase in cost. The recommendation is to pass along these costs to customers (us residents). For obvious reasons, City Council was visibly frustrated. I am also frustrated. How does our local area have two government owned wastewater treatment facilities (Hyperion and West Basin) and there's still a surplus in recycled water that gets sent to the ocean, instead of drastically expanding the purple pipes and also working with regulatory agencies on pushing legislation for recycled wastewater to be used for potable water purposes like already happens in other states? I am paying for wastewater recycling, yet my home has no access to this recycled water. I'm also being told by the West Basin that we need a desalination plant to be built in our town due to our high water demand and lack of local water supplies. Since we live in a desert region, I know that freshwater is a precious commodity, but why aren't we expanding the usage of recycled water, and why is this excess water getting sent directly to the ocean? I would like answers from Hyperion and West Basin because if I managed my job this wonky, I would get fired.

### **El Segundo School Board Candidates Q&A**

Once the students get back on campus, what measures should be taken to ensure school-site safety?

Amy Grant: ESUSD has given much thought and consideration to the protocols for safely reopening schools. Over the Summer the newly formed Health & Safety and Operations Committee collaborated and extensively researched best practices for keeping our teachers, staff and students healthy and safe. With their continued input and oversight, along with temperature checks, mask use, hand sanitizing, smaller classes, on-site nurses, robust testing capabilities and a secure contact tracing plan...we will set ourselves up for a successful return to hybrid/ in-person instruction. We MUST remain diligent and look at other schools nationwide for key case studies that exemplify both successful and unsuccessful practices.

Michael Wagner: Recent guidelines issued by the state allowing targeted groups to attend school are setting the stage for how we will fully return. Small cohorts, wearing masks, equipment sanitization, social distancing and other infectious controls are the minimal protocols. State health professionals will determine those minimal protocols in a full-scale return and determining those measures now would be premature. While the state will provide these, it is going to come down to the Administrators, Teachers and Parents of our schools to tell us what we should be taking into consideration in ensuring school-site safety. As Administrators and Teachers are designing programs to re-introduce students back to school environments, they are learning. We are going to have

to listen to their experience in fully returning. This isn't an easy answer but for me to presume otherwise would be ultimately minimizing the health and welfare of all its stakeholders.

Dieema Wheaton: ESUSD has a Health & Safety and Operations committee, which provides input on operational policies and procedures in preparation for the safe reopening of our schools. As an active committee member, I have first-hand knowledge of the measures being put in place to ensure the well-being of our students, teachers, and staff, and to provide a safe environment for the return of in-person learning. ESUSD has secured Personal Protective Equipment for all sites. They have procured 20,000 cloth masks and will provide each student five masks free of charge. The sites will also have access to hand sanitizer dispensers, contactless thermometers, handwashing stations, sneeze guards, latex-free gloves, face shields, additional disposable medical masks and other site safety and hygiene products. This is in addition to newly implemented cleaning and disinfecting standards, staff training, exposure response measures/alerts, staggered schedules, cohort management, lunch distribution, safety signage, volunteer moratorium, and more.

# 2. What are your thoughts on the Facilities Master Plan, and what should be prioritized?

**Dieema Wheaton**: The Long Range Facility Master Plan (LRFMP) initially began in 2015 and was followed by the passage of Measure ES in 2018, a \$92 million General Obligation Bond. The LRFMP allows our school district to address facility needs, repairing of aging structures, modernizing existing

spaces, construction of new facilities to address long-standing site demands, technology infrastructure upgrades, and provides current standards to address safety and security needs. In my opinion, priority should always be on the students. The LRFMP should be prioritized to address the safety, technology, and facility needs to support high quality curriculum and instruction, followed by on-going facility maintenance to avoid escalating costs resulting from delayed maintenance. This will not only assist with meeting the educational needs of our current students, but it will also allow ESUSD to remain a destination district that is highly regarded and sought after by families pursuing high quality education.

**Michael Wagner**: A thorough process was developed in determining the improvement and needs of infrastructure in the operation of our district and individual schools. As a professional educator, with experience in operations, the plan

is comprehensive and thoughtful in ensuring the physical plant and facilities are directly serving student learning and programming. School safety continues to be a paramount concern and our current board has prioritized it in this plan. It is also my priority as an educator and parent. In all school site developments "new" "safe" "security portals" are being established, with perimeter fencing and re-designed entry points to ensure each school's safety. Additionally, flexible multi-use rooms and facilities are being built to allow for programming needs as our schools expand into new curriculum and services for our students. The plans process secured stakeholder input in prioritizing safety and securing a dynamic environment for our students to achieve.

Amy Grant: The El Segundo Unified School District Facility Master Planning Steering Committee (2016), along with the El Segundo Unified School District Superintendents Advisory Committee (2018), the Facilities Advisory Committee, PBK Architects, School Administration, District Administration, and ESUSD Board of Education diligently put together a thorough and thoughtful Facilities Master Plan. Pre-Covid, there is very little I would change to the list of priorities; however, knowing that Covid is airborne, I believe that all school HVAC systems must be assessed immediately and upgraded where needed. Any upgrades to outdoor facility use should also be prioritized. The use of outdoor space is critical to the success of our return to onsite/in-person education. All projects that add precious square feet to the footprints of our schools are crucial. •

Per LA County Health Department, only students in specialized programs can return to classrooms. Your WUSD Board will proceed in November with a phased plan to safely return these students to campus.

Your Board and WUSD Administration and are actively improving communication pathways with our community. Jessica Daugherty: The most essential issue to address in the WUSD is to improve District communication with the community and community engagement with the District. Parents, students, teachers, staff, and taxpayers must have communication channels through which they can communicate with the District and visa-versa. The pandemic has increased communication and equity gaps for families that are less technologically connected. Improved communication must also include improving communication and collaboration with Da Vinci Schools in order to better articulate programming from middle school into high school.

Second, we must identify a financially stable way to expand access to early childhood education and childcare in order to meet community demand. This includes immediately opening the CDC to provide families with support during the pandemic. Many districts have opened their child development centers with the CDC-mandated 10-1 ratio. Families need childcare right now more than ever and our District has not prioritized it. •


#### Dear Too Much Mom and Dad,



Mithun and its partners will draw ideas from the survey results and create a list of priorities based on the comments. The redesign will go way beyond aesthetics. The pools, mechanical systems, and ventilation within the building all need to be re-evaluated. The survey raised the possibility of changes to all three areas and the stadium seating. The Plunge needs to become more userfriendly and fit today's needs and expectations; the team says in its proposal outlining the steps ahead. The survey results "will form the basis of a blueprint to revitalize the facility and turn it into the vital community asset it has been in the past," the Mithun proposal says. •

customers. Overall, I want people to know that it's not just a fine-dining place, but that anyone can come here and enjoy themselves—to have a glass of wine, relax and have fun."


Despite the setbacks from COVID-19, Liberato maintains the same attitude he always



To the extent that your parents are a bit clueless, are you able to give them a bit of a break? (The pandemic may be making it worse. Communication is harder, and parents have differing views and circumstances regarding safety.)

But wait: they should give you a break too. You are right: they certainly cannot understand what it's like to be you and to feel the pressure you feel. They haven't been your age at this time. They cannot feel it like you do. I

also suspect that you have begun to see that your parents - like all people - are far from perfect, and maybe even hypocritical about some things, and yet they still have power over you for several years... and that stinks. I would love to tell you to just hang in there and that things will get better as you get older, but I know that that feels like forever from now.

So what do you do? It sounds like you have given your parents good reason to trust you.

If that's the case, then you both have an assignment: have a conversation about uncertainty and not knowing and trust. Determine how far each of you is willing to trust one another, even when you don't understand where the other is coming from. This is a hard conversation and you may benefit from the help of a counselor or a trusted friend, but once you are clear about how much faith you have in each other, you may see change start to happen.
