El Segundo Unified School District Searching for New Administrators

Less than two months into the 2019/20 school year, the El Segundo Unified School District administration and School Board members have been tasked with selecting a new principal at El Segundo Middle School, (ESMS) and a new assistant principal at Center Street Elementary.

Middle School Principal Nicole Duquette, on the job for less than three months, decided to step down two weeks ago. Duquette's abrupt departure continues a trend at ESMS, which has seen multiple principals come and go since Director of Students Support Services Dr. Jack Plotkin was promoted to his current position. In an email, Duquette wrote, "Regrettably there are demands that made it difficult for me to continue at the Middle School. Unfortunately, since I can't say how long they will last, it is best for me to resign. ESMS is an amazing school and has outstanding students, faculty and parents. I am hopeful that they will find a principal that can serve them well, and for a long time." Also leaving is Center Street Elementary Assistant Principal Grace Long. Long accepted a position in the Wiseburn Unified School District as the assistant principal at the Da Vinci Science School. Emailed Long: "I am so grateful for my time here with the District. It has been a privilege to serve and be a part of this amazing community. The people here have always been warm, welcoming and supportive throughout the journey to better education for all learners. While I miss everyone here, I am fortunate to have the opportunity to expand as an educator. I will always be a huge supporter of the students,

staff and families of El Segundo."

Ali Rabiei, who moved into a new post as the ESUSD's director of operations after finishing out the 2018/19 academic year as the acting principal at the Middle School, will provide administrative support to that campus while continuing in his District job. Rabiei emailed that he is happy to be back at ESMS, and that the principal position was immediately posted after Duquette's intentions were known. Rabiei said, "The goal is to have a new principal in place before winter break."

Meanwhile two main special presentations dotted the School Board's Tuesday evening agenda. ESMS Assistant Principal Sarah Davlantis, in tandem with International Baccalaureate Coordinator Crystal Winner, delivered the annual state-of-the-school address. Their presentation focused on the strides made at ESMS, with data points delineating overall student achievements, English Language Arts proficiency, and suspension rates and chronic absenteeism data. The presenters also shared the results of the latest school climate parental survey and concluded with the next steps they are looking to implement, including increasing teacher efficacy, more data analysis, and "shared leadership," as well listing a handful of goals that the administration would like to achieve this school year. Assistant Superintendent, Educational Services, Marisa Janicek made her report on the District's implementation of the state-mandated California Accountability Plan, including Local Indicators/California Dashboard. Prior to the meeting, Janicek emailed that the Dashboard "provides parents and educators with meaningful information on school and

District progress so that they can participate in decisions to improve student learning. We are fortunate to have a small school district that enables us to truly hear from our stakeholders on how we are doing, and how we can continue to improve. The Dashboard incorporates state-identified metrics and the ability to work locally to ensure that we are focused on individualized needs."

Board President Nancy Cobb emailed prior to the meeting that the Dashboard "promotes a continuous cycle of improvement since we must annually measure our progress."

The Board members then tackled the 17 items listed on the consent agenda portion of the agenda. Among the items approved: the acceptance of Duquette's and Long's resignations; an El Segundo High School marching band field trip; and the renewal of a contract with In-N-Out Burger. The marching band will take part in the Western Band Association Championship, taking place in Fresno, beginning on Friday, Nov. 22. Nearly 70 students are expected to participate. The In-N-Out Burger agreement will provide dinner to all the participants at the Middle School's Winter Ball, scheduled to take place on Jan. 31. The Board also approved a contract with VoxDJ's to provide musical services at both the Halloween Dance and the Winter Ball at ESMS. After Board Clerk Tracey Miller-Zarneke read the list of gifts to the District, including \$300,000 from Chevron, the Board then dove into action items, including approving expenditures for furniture and equipment at the Eagles' Nest Preschool and The Learning Connection.

Other Top Golf facilities in the United States are built in industrial areas without an accompanying golf course. Top Golf should not be allowed to build on property that was intended to be used as a public park or golf course.

Parents Discover How to Detect the Signs that Their Teen Is Vaping

Hundreds of South Bay parents turned out last week to a town hall meeting to learn about what's in e-cigarettes and why they're so popular in youth culture. Speaker after speaker pounded home a message: Don't be fooled again by the tobacco industry.

Electronic cigarettes comprise a \$9 billion-ayear business that grew almost overnight. Sales increased by 78 percent in one year, and the companies behind the trendy smoking habit use social media to target minors, panelists revealed Oct. 14 at the teen vaping town hall gathering in Manhattan Beach.

While the smoking craze is safer than cigarettes, that doesn't mean teens should take up the habit, said pediatrician Dr. Alice Kuo with UCLA Health Sciences. It's never a good idea to put chemicals in the lungs, she said, adding she has seen lung damage in a few cases at the Redondo Beach clinic where she practices. She hears a lot from teens who think vaping is safe. "Oh Dr. Kuo, you don't know. It's just water vapor," her young patients tell her.

However, new data from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control indicates that e-cigarettes have caused lung damage and even deaths across the country. There were 1,299 reported cases of lung injury and 26 confirmed U.S. deaths as of Oct. 11, the CDC reported. Not all of the smokers were young and a majority of the injured smokers used their vapes to smoke tetrahydrocannabinol, otherwise known as THC, found in cannabis.

And, it can be vaped without being obvious to the untrained eye. There is a black market for vaping products that is contributing to the health problems reported by physicians and emergency room staff nationwide, the CDC says. Juice bought on the street or from family, friends, dealers or other informal sources "are linked to most of the cases and play a major role in the outbreak," the CDC announced this month.

Vaping is wildly popular with high school students, some teens told the packed auditorium of parents who came looking for information about the smoking craze. Vapes, as they are commonly known, are battery-powered devices that heat a nicotine-infused liquid called juice. When heated, the juice forms a steamy white cloud that teens inhale. Though it may look harmless, there is nicotine and other chemicals in the wispy vapor.

A huge challenge for parents is how easy it is for minors to buy vape products. Local stores See Vaping, page 11

Loss Doesn't Spoil Homecoming

The El Segundo High School 2019 Homecoming game drew a crowd of over 3,000 people. There were reunion alumni students from the classes of 1969, 1989, 1999 and 2009 in the stands. El Segundo High has long been described as a tight-knit campus and community where we are all part of one big family. Three members of our family including 5-year-old Reagan Sullivan, Kathy Motta and Mark Rooney all passed away recently and were remembered with a moment of silence prior to the game. As to the game itself, the Eagles played hard but came up on the losing end of a 42-9 drubbing by Culver City. Though it was a lopsided loss, it didn't dampen the spirits of those in the crowd.

There's nothing like Homecoming week at El Segundo High. What starts as a gathering of each class preparing and making floats ends with reunion classes attending the Homecoming football game to kick-start their weekend. El Segundo High is not unique in putting on a Homecoming game or festivities surrounding it. What sets ours apart from others is a parade down Main Street. The community lines the street downtown and in front of the iconic high school to applaud the float entries and the Homecoming Court.

It was a Norman Rockwell moment as the

parade started with the award-winning cheer squad leading the way followed by the decorated marching band playing the school's fight song. The parade of vintage convertibles, supplied by the El Segundo Automobile Museum, carried dignitaries starting with the Grand Marshal and long-time teacher David Reed as well as members from the El Segundo School Board.

Prince Reynaldo Silva III. The Homecoming Queen Ella Tichy and Homecoming King Wadia Alhalak preceded the class floats. The class floats rolled down the street escorted by proud students who worked on their respected float. They also chanted their class graduation year.

The class float judges included First Lady of El Segundo Lee Boyles, El Segundo Fire Chief Chris Donovan, Police Chief Bill Whalen and former El Segundo High teacher, principal and former School Board member Dr. Bill Watkins. But like one of them said, "Each class was a winner for their involvement, participation and school spirit."

It was a Homecoming game that will long be remembered for the officials throwing 31 penalty flags and failing to remember how to administer the penalties. In the end, Culver City outmanned the Eagles thanks to its long list of talented recruits.

El Segundo would need a perfect game to shock the top-ranked Centaurs. The game plan for the Eagles was to control the clock and pace of play to keep Culver City's offense off the field. If this were a boxing match the Eagles were the underdog taking on the champs and looking to avoid an early knockout. They sparred toe-to-toe with Culver City in the first quarter and took a 2-0 lead on a safety when Mekhi Evans-Bey was stopped by a host of Eagles two yards deep in the end zone. The safety was set up by Vinney Costa's interception. The Eagles managed to sustain a drive that ended when Connor Hochberg was intercepted at the Culver City 2-yard line. On the first play, Evans-Bey was smothered in the end zone.

On Culver City's next possession the Centaurs went 95 yards in three plays, helped along by three penalties, to score the first of three touchdowns in the second quarter. The two possessions El Segundo had in the second quarter were not sustaining enough and the Centaurs benefited on their other two possessions with long TD passes to take a 21-2 lead.

El Segundo fell behind 34-2 in the third quarter after allowing two additional long TD passes. Meanwhile the Eagles' offense sputtered. The game was put away with 1:29 remaining in

School Board

There were no information pending action items on the agenda, so Superintendent Dr. Melissa Moore then highlighted upcoming events on the ESUSD informational calendar, including the annual SKECHERS Friendship Walk that will take place this Sunday.

In other District news, the students at Center Street Elementary will participate next week in the UNICEF Trick or Treat program the third quarter on another TD pass to make it 40-2. One of the biggest surprises of the game was the lack of sportsmanship displayed by Culver City when it attempted a point after touchdown. The Centaurs lined up to kick the attempt, but ran a play off for a successful 2-point try and a 42-2 lead. It was one of the biggest Bush League plays in a high school game this reporter ever witnessed. It meant a running clock for the fourth quarter and decreased playing opportunities for second team players on both teams.

El Segundo would score a touchdown in the waning moments of the game. James Fraelich rushed three times including a 16-yarder, one for 22-yards and a 2-yard touchdown run to make it 42-9.

The loss dropped the Eagles to 4-4 overall and 2-1 in their last Ocean League season. It won't get any easier facing the recruit-rich Lawndale Cardinals on Friday night on the road. The Eagles return home next Friday night to face Santa Monica on Senior Night. They'll need at least one win in their final two weeks to advance to the playoffs.

Water Polo Shuts **Out Beverly Hills**

The Eagles were just too much for Beverly Hills in their 20-0 win over the Normans in Ocean League play. Mason Jaeger and Paxton Fastman paced the Eagles with four goals each. It was a game that El Segundo controlled from the outset and didn't provide much of a challenge to them. The Normans had just three shots on goal and those were meager attempts at that. Brian Schodorf was instrumental on defense and had one goal along with two assists.

The Eagles played host to Culver City on Tuesday and wrap up their regular season at home next Wednesday against Santa Monica.


Girls Volleyball Starts CIF Playoff Run







carry the popular flavored vape juices and the battery-powered devices into a breathable cloud. Because they are tobacco products, clerks are required by law to verify that a buyer is of age to buy e-cigarettes. However, teens use online websites to bypass the age restriction of 21 and older. And, online advertising directs teens to these retail sites.

Teens who spoke at last week's meeting revealed that vape companies, including Juul, reach their demographic using social media and websites. They post online ads that feature models who make e-cigarettes look and sound glamorous, according to student volunteers with the Beach Cities Health District. Teens who post images of themselves vaping on Snapchat and Instagram also perpetuate the image that vaping is what friends do together.

When asked ahead of the town hall meeting

why teens use vapes, high schoolers from the beach cities said they smoke for depression, stress and peer pressure. The nicotine in the smoke stimulates the brain and body when ingested, but what follows is fatigue and eventually addiction. Teens who vape for two to three months start chasing that feeling again, said Jennifer Harris who coordinates tobacco and drug prevention in the South Bay cities through the nonprofit Behavioral Health Services in Gardena.

Vapes can be bought on eBay or borrowed, so a teen can be smoking even if he or she doesn't own a pocket-sized pen, USB drive or a lipstick tube, the young people said. The heating elements are disguised as a box of Altoids breath mints, a can of Coke, car keys or an Apple watch. Parents should especially be on the lookout for any Suorin brand being carried by their child, Harris said. "Suorin is really popular for

people in the South Bay," Harris noted. "A lot of parents don't know that." She also pointed out that Suorin products are less expensive than Juul.

The Pax brand is used primarily for vaping marijuana, another good tip for parents. The makers of vapes are helping teens and young adults conceal their habit by hiding smoke-delivering tubing inside of hoodies and backpacks, Harris revealed.

Vaping ads surprisingly show up on study websites that students use, according to the teen leaders with Beach Cities Health District. There is some vaping that goes on during school hours in the campus bathrooms, and some of their peers said it makes students uncomfortable to see it. However, peer pressure prevents them from saying anything negative to the students who are vaping or reporting it to teachers or campus security.

Restricting access to vaping cartridges and flavored juices is the most effective way to reduce their use of e-cigarettes, said Dr. Donnie Watson with the Thelma McMillen Center for Alcohol and Drug Treatment at Torrance Memorial. He urges parents to push back against the marketing by tobacco companies to turn teens into lifelong nicotine users.

The explosive 78 percent growth of ecigarettes between 2017 and 2018 can be attributed to the marketing to minors, the speakers said. Until the federal government regulates the new-generation tobacco products, parents are the first line of defense. "We're 10 years behind in this," Dr. Watson told parents. "Be vigilant, just hang in there. They [teens] need your support."
