Candidates Reflect on Election; ESUSD Lauds Bond Passage

With last week's election in the books, the El Segundo School Board will welcome back an incumbent and see two new members take their oaths of office next month. With four candidates vying for three available seats, current Board President Emilee Layne was the top vote-getter with 30.46 percent, followed by Tracey Miller-Zarneke (29.41 percent) and Paulette Caudill (29.25 percent). Amy Rilling Grant fell short in her effort, finishing with 10.87 percent of the vote. Results were unofficial as of press time and not yet certified by the Los Angeles County Clerk. Additionally, El Segundo voters passed the \$92 million Measure ES school bond designed to upgrade classrooms, labs, facilities and equipment to support STEM education; repair or replace roofs, plumbing and electrical; and improve student safety and campus security. The measure received well over the 55 percent approval required, with 60.39 percent in favor and 39.61 percent against. School Board Vice President and Co-Chair of the Measure ES Committee Nancy Cobb was delighted by the news. "Passing Measure ES allows us to make an investment in our facilities that supports the education of our students," she said. "Whether it's repairing a leaky roof and windows, updating technology infrastructure, or modernizing classrooms that prepare for tomorrow's jobs, an investment in our children's education protects our community's future." El Segundo Unified School District Superintendent Dr. Melissa Moore echoed the sentiment. "If we want our kids to succeed in college and careers, they must have safe, modern school facilities," she explained.

"Measure ES will have a profound long-lasting impact as it will enable us to address our critical facility needs district-wide outlined in the Long Range Facility Master Plan and ensure quality El Segundo schools. Thank you to the community for making our dreams a reality for our students today and tomorrow."

Moore indicated that she planned to speak with counsel and the District's financial advisor this week to discuss the next steps in implementing the bond. To fund it, local property owners will see a tax increase of roughly \$43 per \$100,000 of assessed valuation that will take effect in 2019. Layne, first elected in 2014, will begin her second term on Dec. 11. She will swear in the new members on that date and the Board will then vote to reorganize its officers, with Cobb viewed likely to become the next President. "The Board has had a tradition that the role is rotated annually and each member sits at the table based upon who has received the most votes," Moore said. Meanwhile, outgoing members Dr. Bill Watkins and Dr. Jim Garza attended their final School Board meeting this past Tuesday. The two had opted not to run again. Reflecting on her reelection as well as the success of Measure ES, Layne said, "I am proud of the accomplishments of El Segundo Unified School District in the last five years and am grateful for the opportunity to continue to serve our community. I want to give a thank you to everyone who came out and voted for me and especially for the bond. With the passing of this bond, it shows that our community once again has placed a high emphasis on our students' success."

El Segundo's Environmental Committee, noted that she was honored the community showed trust in her to hold a seat on the School Board. "I'm excited to apply my years of experience and collaboration here in ESUSD at a higher level," she said. "I look forward to keeping our district on the path of high-quality public education, and am pleased that the passage of Measure ES confirms our town recognizes it will take a well-vetted list of facilities improvements to help us maintain our position on the cutting edge of educational opportunities for our students."

"A big thanks to everyone who voted for me, spoke with me at their doors and our candidate forums, donated, took a yard sign, and gave me much-needed encouragement along the way - I could not have done it without you all and I appreciate it," she said. "Now, let's get to work ... "

A newcomer to town who did minimal campaigning, Grant reported that she was pleased and encouraged to receive over 1,000 votes despite being a relative unknown. She called the overall experience invaluable and hopes to serve the community in other ways as opportunities arise. "This election cemented my belief that my husband and I made the 100 percent correct choice in buying a home in El Segundo and choosing to root ourselves here," she said. "I am so excited to see how Measure ES improves our school district and how the new Board of Education will navigate the next few years. Congrats to my three opponents. They are fantastic women who want

Facts From Government Sources

The facts in my 11/1/2018 letter, and the information flyers I authored that were distributed citywide, came from official government public record sources, including El Segundo Unified School District (ESUSD), L.A. County Clerk, State Treasurer, California laws, City of El Segundo, and TransparentCalifornia.com. Transparent California uses California Public Records Act requests for pay and pension data for government employees throughout the state, and posts the data on their website.

Ray Gen's 11/8/2018 letter used false accusations and personal attacks to cover-up the evidence of massive ESUSD and El Segundo police and firefighter union corruption that I exposed.

Gen is an El Segundo High School English teacher and Teachers Association (union) member. He was at the center of ESUSD corruption going back to 1996, when he organized illegal use of school district fcilities and resources to support Democrat Mike Gordon's City Council campaign. Gen had high school students illegally construct hundreds of campaign signs in the high school wood shop. Gen violated state law, and the state and federal constitutions, by using public resources to support a political campaign, including California Education Code section 7054, which can be punished as a misdemeanor or a felony, with fines and/or imprisonment.

I quoted the Measure ES text from the Official Sample Ballot (pages 67-68): "Proceeds of the bonds may be used to pay or reimburse the District for the cost of District staff" (salaries and benefits). And taxpayers do pay most of the school and city employee pension contributions.

In another race of particular interest to El Segundo, two local residents ran for West Basin Municipal Water District's Division IV directorship. Division IV also includes Culver City, Malibu and West Hollywood as well as seven unincorporated communities. Scott Houston garnered a second term by capturing 79.38 percent of the vote, while Joe Lococo received 20.62 percent. "I'm proud of the work we've done to ensure our community receives clean, safe and affordable water, and of my efforts to improve transparency and accountability at West Basin," Houston said. "You can see my attention to community engagement is working by the significant number of folks who voted for me to continue this work on behalf of the ratepayers. It's a responsibility I take very seriously and I am ready for the challenges we face ahead."

Lococo expressed his gratitude to the community for their support during his campaign. "You never lose - you learn," he said. "The last

Pay-For-Play

Ray Gen (11/8/18 letter) made numerous personal attacks against Mike Robbins to divert attention away from the real issue. Mike did residents a favor by exposing evidence the school district used pay-for-play corruption to fund the \$80,000+ campaign for School Bond Measure ES. Mike posted copies of the Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) 460 forms filed by the Measure ES campaign committee, which was created by school board member Nancy Cobb, at PublicSafetyProject.org.

The Yes on ES contribution data in Mike's "Vote No on Measure ES" flyer came from two 460 forms filed with the L.A. County Clerk. They show sixteen contributions totaling \$76,249,99 from construction- and technologyrelated businesses that make money from school bond property taxes. Three \$10,000 contributions were from architecture businesses in Houston, Texas; Omaha, Nebraska, and Rancho Cucamonga, California. An \$8,500 contribution was from a construction company in Dallas, Texas. Six \$5,000 contributions and six \$1,000 to \$2,000 contributions were from construction- and technology-related businesses, and lawyers. ESUSD's law firm gave \$5,000, which appears to be a conflict of interest. El Segundo taxpayers probably paid them over \$1 million over the years. A company that contributed \$1,500 sold four modular classroom buildings to ESUSD and wants to sell more (2/14/2017 ESUSD board meeting minutes).

This pattern indicates the school board and/ or district solicited these contributions. Businesses don't donate \$5,000-\$10,000 expecting nothing in return. The 460 forms show the campaign was managed from Oakland, and the slick campaign mailers were designed, printed, and mailed in Berkeley.

Congressman Ted Lieu won another term by defeating Kenneth Wright in the United States Representative 33rd District race. He carried 68 percent of the vote versus 32 percent for his opponent. For the 26th District, State Senator Ben Allen captured 75.63 percent of the ballots cast, with Baron Bruno garnering 24.37 percent. For the 62nd District State Assembly District, Autumn Burke cruised to reelection with 81.70 percent of the vote versus Al Hernandez's 18.30 percent. •

School Board Bids Adieu to Garza and Watkins; Welcomes Gooden

The El Segundo School Board on Tuesday evening paid homage to its past and looked forward to the future. Outgoing members Dr. Bill Watkins and Dr. Jim Garza, both of whom did not run for reelection, were feted for their service to El Segundo Unified School District (ESUSD). Both served long tenures in the District, including manning the position as the principal at El Segundo High School (ESHS). That job suddenly became available last week, when current Principal Dr. Jennifer Hawn informed the District that she was accepting a job offer from the Whittier City School District to become the Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources there. Hawn's last day at ESHS will be Nov. 23. Garza and Watkins, in their comments, emotionally spoke of their "labor of love" toiling for the District in multiple capacities.

Spotlight

Dr. Melissa Gooden, currently the principal at El Segundo Middle School (ESMS), will take over the leadership reins at ESHS. Superintendent Dr. Melissa Moore emailed that Gooden would start her new duties on Nov. 26, and that ESMS Assistant Principal Ali Rabiei will become the new principal at the latter campus. Moore noted that both Gooden and Rabiei will "return to their current positions for the 2019/20 school year, and that the District would open up the posting for the next high school principal in March."

Of her new post, Gooden emailed, "It has been an honor and a privilege to serve as the principal of the El Segundo Middle School. ESMS is a phenomenal school with amazing students, staff and families. I will miss the Bulldogs dearly and appreciate the kindness and support of the community during my tenure. I look forward into transitioning into the principalship at the high school and continuing the great work that is taking place at the best high school in the South Bay."

Moore emailed to the community, "Dr. Hawn has been a tremendous asset during her time with the ESUSD and has made significant positive contributions to the education of our students. We regret her departure, but understand the opportunity that has presented itself. We wish her the best in her future career."

Hawn, in her email sent to the community last week, wrote, "It is with great sadness that I will be leaving El Segundo High School in order to accept a position as Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources in the Whittier City School District. I have appreciated each day in the Eagle family, and we have accomplished so much since I joined El Segundo High School."

Of his new post at ESMS, Rabiei emailed, "I am incredibly excited to be taking the helm at the middle school. We have a lot of great work ahead of us, especially with our IB reauthorization, our rich discussions on our bell schedule, and the stellar work that our teachers have done to date and will continue to do with our achievement teams. At the end of the day, it is all about our students." In a busy week in the District, the recent elec-

ESHS Eagles Basketball Preview

The 2018-19 high school basketball season is up on us. In fact, the boys started their schedule this past Monday and the girls team started their season on Tuesday. The opening of the season comes approximately two weeks earlier this year than in past years for a number of reasons. Nevertheless the schedule has started and both teams are looking to improve on what they did in the past. For the boys team, it means improving on a 15-win campaign. Meanwhile, the girls are looking to return to the postseason with a new coach in place.

David March starts his third season guiding the boys. After a dismal inaugural season, March directed the Eagles to a 15-12 overall record in his second year. His philosophy calls for team play, tough in-your-face defense and helping players continue to get better. Coach March has gone to a position-less hybrid line-up that could have as many as 10 players in the rotation. "We have a lot of athletic players that can play different positions," he said.

The Eagles have a lot of size on the roster. After buying into March's insistence on a devoted weight room offseason workout regimen, the players are now bigger and stronger. The results should be favorable.

March believes the strength of the team this season is the experience, depth, athleticism and size throughout the roster. He said the Eagles will be more physical, concentrate on their defense and once again limit the opposition's point total. El Segundo had the best defense within its division last season, giving up a meager 38 points per game (less than 10 points per quarter).

The team returns nine players from a year ago who are poised to lead the Eagles to a better record and challenge their Ocean League rivals to a league championship and deep run in the CIF playoffs. March won't talk about a historic run to be the second team to accompany the 1963 team on the gold banner, but would say, "We're going to surprise a lot teams this year."

Senior guard Miles Jones returns after suffering a season-ending injury midway through last season's schedule. Jones is a four-year player who has long-range ability along with his leadership skills. Another four-year starter is Michael Lynch, also a standout volleyball player, who thrives as a defender near the basket and possesses three-point range.

Two seniors have made commitments to play after high school. Ben Peterson is a three-year starter and may be one of the top students on an already brilliant (in the classroom) team. Peterson will play a wing position, but has good ball-handling skills. He decided on Whitman College in Washington. It is coincidentally the same college that former legendary coach Cliff Warren, who guided the Eagles to the 1963 CIF championship, moved to after leaving El Segundo High School. The other senior to commit is 6'3" guard Dylan Aubert, who will play at Cal Lutheran. Aubert is another three-year player who plays with passion, has a nice shooting touch and great court awareness and could be the team's best athlete. The other senior is Harrison Hebert, a key returnee who started a handful of games as a junior and will be counted on for his defense.

March welcomes four new seniors to the team. Matt Romero, an all-league football player and standout on the baseball team, is new to basketball. However, March believes his athleticism will lead to plenty of playing time. See Eagles, page 11





Tracey Miller-Zarneke and Paulette Caudill and added another four- term for current Board President Emilee Layne. The voters also passed Measure ES, a \$92 million school bond initiative.

Emailed Miller-Zarneke prior to Tuesday's Board meeting: "I have been attending School Board meetings for months now, so I know that I can hit the ground running, and in the right direction at that. I am grateful that El Segundo voters showed that they understand and support the value in their tax-based investment in our schools, and I am excited for the amazing, thoughtful improvements to our facilities to come over the next decade. I am ready to see that financial prudence is respected in every dollar that is spent in this long and involved, but important, process, and I can't wait to see our campuses evolve to better serve our students and staff."

Tuesday evening's main presentation was the yearly state-of-the school address from ESHS, helmed by the departing secondyear Principal Hawn. She and her team of faculty and administrators shared many of the accomplishments of the 2017/18 school year, including decreases registered in chronic absenteeism and campus suspension rates. Survey results were shared as well as the latest testing metrics. Highlights included an increased graduation rate, a successful WASC accreditation visit, an Apple Distinguished School notation, higher testing scores on multiple platforms, and a larger number of National Merit Students. Said Hawn, "I have no doubt that this team will continue on their upward trajectory to success in order to meet the community's high expectations for the finest education available." The presentation concluded with data involving action plans to be implemented for the 2018/19 school year.

Chief Bill Whalen addressed the Board, updating the partnership between the District and the El Segundo Police Department (ESPD) and speaking about their unique synergy and collaboration with the various campuses. Whalen talked about the safety

and security of the school children, and how the department will be there every step of the way working to mitigate social media bullying, the vaping epidemic, and other issues plaguing school districts in 2018. That includes suicide prevention, which Whalen said was a "taboo" subject to address in the past. Garza and Watkins both gave kudos to the partnership with ESPD, noting how important it was for the safety and security of El Segundo students and community members.

Next, Moore gave plaudits to Watkins and Garza for their years of service to ESUSD, reciting their accomplishments as District employees and Board members.

Tuesday evening's consent agenda included the Board approving an ESMS field trip to Catalina Island in May; a consultant agreement with Michelle Borba to " produce empathetic, compassionate, courageous students with strong character in a digital-driven, self-absorbed, global world;" renovating the Little League field at Center Street Elementary School; a substitute teacher agreement with

Swing Education; renewal of a student teaching contract with Loyola Marymount University; and an agreement with the Wiseburn Unified School District to participate in its Success Learning Center.

The Board then approved three schools' single plans for student achievement; as well as ESHS' AP Capstone Diploma Program and Media Design and AP Studio Art 2-D program.

The Board also approved the hiring of Kimberlie Linz, who will become the new District Chief Business Official, replacing the retiring Susan Aceves. Linz comes to the ESUSD from the Manhattan Beach Unified School District, where she was serving as the principal for the middle school there.

Moore then highlighted the upcoming calendar, which includes a full week of vacation next week, as the District heads towards the always welcome Christmas break.

The next regularly scheduled El Segundo Board meeting is slated for Tuesday evening, Dec. 11. •




Pickled Ginger **Onion Relish**


Recipe provided by Brandpoint Yields: 3 cups
