Digital Promise League of Innovative Schools Visits the ESUSD

A couple of weeks ago, members of the prestigious Digital Promise League of Innovative Schools [DPLIS] delegation dropped in to visit the school sites of the high-achieving El Segundo Unified School District [ESUSD]. While they were in the area, the delegation also visited school sites in the Compton Unified School District and held their 2022 convening meeting.

Now, while the League of Innovative Schools may sport a moniker that might best describe a new *Marvel Studios* action-adventure movie, the DPLIS is a "national coalition of school district superintendents working together to solve challenges facing K-12 schools through learning technologies and education research," shared ESUSD Superintendent Dr. Melissa Moore.

"League members represent more than 151 districts in 38 states serving more than 4.4 million students," she continued. "Their diverse experiences reflect the advancements, challenges, and vital work of public education in the United States. Twice a year, the League convenes in person to solve pressing educational challenges and share successful strategies and best practices. During the Fall 2022 meeting, approximately 375 attendees including education leaders, researchers, and technologists, participated.

"The tours focused on the three themes of student-driven thinking," Moore emailed, "cultivating global citizens, and innovation for college and career readiness. Students demonstrated all the amazing things happening in their buildings and classrooms daily, including innovative projects allowing them to learn new skills."

The day before, on October 19, Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services Marisa

Janicek and ESHS student Nicole Ungaro were part of a panel at the League of Innovative Schools conference. "They spoke about the progress they are seeing in ESUSD," Moore said.

Under Moore's leadership, the ESUSD has continued to garner recognition outside of the District, and recently was feted by a scholastic ranking service as not only one of the top twenty school Districts in the Golden State, but also landing in the top one percent nationwide.

Moore shared her thoughts on the recent League visits to the six schools, a visit that was supposed to occur in 2020 but was shelved because of the COVID school-site shutdown. "The visitors [educational leaders] were led on tours of each school by student ambassadors,"

she said, calling the ambassadors "the best hosts that they could possibly be." Each tour was approximately an hour, with the day being split up by a luncheon at the Dockweiler Teen Center.

While touring the school sites, the visitors were addressed by school principals and took a sneak peek into the classrooms to view the cutting-edge ideas being practiced in the ESUSD.

Here is what a few DPLIS visitors thought about their visit to El Segundo. Dr. Julie Mitchell is the Superintendent of the Rowland Unified School District. "One of the highlights of being an active participant in the League of Innovative Schools is the ability to visit

City Council Looks at Housing Issues and United Against Hate Week Acknowledged

Housing, density, and zoning were three subjects the El Segundo City Council discussed at Tuesday night's regularly scheduled meeting, specifically the adoption of a revised 2021-2019 Housing Element, continuing the city's Home Share pilot program through the end of 2023, and the potential residential redevelopment of properties in the R3 multi-family residential zone. Cities in California must submit Housing Element plans that the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) reviews to ensure they comply

with state law. Council also heard a report on a study of the city's R3 properties so the body can address how to handle new development in the R3 zones. Council member Scot Nicol joked that he'd asked for this study during his second city council meeting nearly four years ago when he was elected to council and that now at his second to the last meeting, the study was finally being presented. Council member Nicol did not seek a second term in the November 8 election. Tuesday night, the council received and filed the new report.

Utama Elegantly Depicts The Honoring of Family Traditions

Utama comes into my life at a time when I'm feeling extra sensitive toward the importance of honoring family traditions passed down from older generations. One's legacy can be appreciated while still earthside, but it's especially in death when their physical absence is felt, does their impact realize itself. Life, death, and how we spend the time in between is the thesis statement of writer-director Alejandro Loayza Grisi's subtle yet remarkably powerful debut feature, Utama.

Immediately taken by the colorful garments set against a dry and dusty landscape, we're transported to the Bolivian Altiplano, home of elderly Quechua couple Virginio and Sisa (José Calcina and Luisa Quispe). Presumably, in their late eighties or so, the couple spends their days following the same simple routine: he manages the llamas and she walks to town to gather water.

However, when their only source of drinking water goes dry, the effects of this ongoing drought begin to have real consequences for the townspeople. It doesn't help that Virginio is secretly battling a mystery cough, and a lack of appropriate resources like water could cause him grave danger.

Amidst the troubling prospects, Virginio and Sisa are in for a surprise when their grandson,

Basketball Team Looks to Return to the Playoffs

Head coach David March, a former standout Eagle, has been the head coach for the past six seasons. As the former All-Pioneer League center, who took over the program from coach Rick Sabosky, enters his seventh season, he looks to return the team to the CIF playoffs. He admits that losing Preston Engle, a two-time all-league player, to graduation will be a hard player to replace, but he's confident someone will step up. "I'm confident someone will step up like Preston did when the team needed direction," March said.

The Eagles return six players who either started or played significant minutes last season. "We have plenty of experience returning with some size that will help us out." Seniors returning for their third season are Ben Ali Watkins, a playmaking shooting guard; Jesse Gutierrez, another shooting guard; and Holden Coulter a forward/center. Second-year forward Dayveon Marino will give the team needed depth. Junior forward Jackson Pintens has a nice jump shot reminiscent of former UCLA great Lynn Shackelford. Liam Endo played valuable minutes as a freshman guard and looks to challenge for a starting spot this season.

According to Coach March, the team has been preparing for the season since February, after their last game. "We've been lifting since February and had our traditional spring/summer/fall camps. The team has worked hard in the offseason to prepare their bodies and

Girls Soccer Looks to Three-Peat

The Eagles didn't win their Pioneer League last season or even the season before. But for the two-time defending CIF champions, this could be an interesting season for the Eagles. They are gearing up to win their first league title since the 2008-09 team did it. Last season the Eagles went 17-5-1 and second place in the Pioneer League and lost 17 seniors to graduation. They'll miss starters Chelsie Charles, Michaela Turner, Kiki Doggett, Jaden Fode and Shelby Lyon. But according to head coach Skip Jones, in his eighth year leading the Eagles, they have some key returnees that make a run at a league title possible.

Keying this year's team are returning seniors Charlie Gerson (MF) and Abby Martinez (MF), juniors Holly Wilbanks (D), Tanner Ijams(GK), Barcelona Heredia (MF), and Bella Munoz (F) and sophomores Ava Adlam (D) and Lauren Nguyen(MF). Last season Gerson, Wilbanks, and Munoz were selected to the All-CIF Southern Section Division 3

First Team, while Ijams was selected to the All-South Bay first team.

The 2021-22 team had a defensive presence to it, allowing just 21 goals over 23 games, thanks in part to Tanner Ijams in goal. She is considered the top goaltender for the class of 2024, according to IMG Academy, and has already verbally committed to continuing her

education and playing soccer for the University of Washington Huskies.

With all of the success the Eagles have had, it hasn't gone unnoticed by the CIF. In the past six seasons, they have gone from Division 5, to Division 4, to Division 3. With the CIF tweaking their playoff division format by combining Division 1 and 2, with the top 16 teams playing for the Division 1 title, the Eagles could end up playing in the Division 1 playoffs.

The Eagles will lean on other newcomers to reload their team. Expected to make an immediate impact are Olivia McPherson (MF), Bella Recalde (MF), Payton Bemis(MF), Leila Jones (D) and Sam Stahl (D). Each has been working hard and has impressed with their individual skill set.

According to Coach Jones, the team has held informal summer workouts from June until August and just completed a month of strength training with Jason Parker. "The girls have put in a lot of time preparing for the season, and they know what it'll take to be successful."

This season's schedule is reminiscent of last year, and they'll be in the rugged South Torrance Tournament in early December. As for their run to a Pioneer League, Coach Jones says West Torrance and South Torrance will be their main obstacles, with Da Vinci also added to the league schedule. The Eagles open up their season at home on Wednesday, November 30, at 3 p.m. against Bay League favorite Mira Costa. •

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

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

In a special presentation, the council presented a special proclamation to acknowledge United Against Hate week, which runs Nov. 13-19 and "is a call for seven days of local civic action by people in every community to stop the hate and implicit biases that are a dangerous threat to the safety and civility of our neighborhoods, towns, and cities," according to the Not In Our Town website. The week "was created by civic leaders in direct response to the sharp rise in expressions of hate in our communities. We want to empower residents to take action in their local communities and alter the course of this growing intolerance."

'We live in very difficult times," said Avery Smith, accepting the proclamation as chair of the city's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion committee. Saying he was thrilled about the proclamation, he continued, "We have a pandemic that's been raging for three years. We've had a lot of social and cultural unrest, and the country is incredibly divided. And, you know, I was a history major at UC Irvine, and when I think about the times that we really looked at and analyzed, it was these really difficult times. Not just historians will look at this time, but it will be our children,

our grandchildren, our great-grandchildren, and they will ask themselves, 'Did poppa, did grandma, did nana stand united against hate?' And I hope that answer is 'Yes' for everybody. You know, hate comes in many forms. It can be the racial slur, it can be the swastika engraved in a bathroom stall. It can be many, many forms. But the reality is we tend to look at hate and love as binary. We tend to look at apathy and passion as binary. But the reality is there's a spectral nature to hate. And it's not just, again, the racial slur or the person driving down the street that cuts you off. There are many forms.

"And the forms that I want to talk about really quickly tonight, that I think are impactful, especially for the DEI committee, that we have faced is misinformation. And, you know, that also comes in many forms. And, unfortunately, recently, that has affected the city. And I think that it is our responsibility to stand up against that, and it is our responsibility to educate folks what DEI really means because, you know, DEI is trendy, it's a new label, but the reality is that the ideals are old, tried, and true. I think about DEI and some of the terms, and some of the thoughts. They're as old as the scriptures.

"If you look back to the 18th century, I take you back to 8th-grade history class. What was the phrase the colonists said when they were seeking independence? 'No taxation without representation.' That's a DEI statement. That is a statement that says, 'Hey, if you're going to take money out of my pocket, I want to be able to represent myself and say be able to dictate what's going on. A century later, if you look at Abraham Lincoln, what did he say, 'A house divided against itself will not stand.' That is a statement of diversity, equity, and inclusion. So DEI, new label, right, but the theories, the values, tried and true. I think about a century later, this young Baptist preacher, walking up to the stage, to the podium, August 28, 1963, what's the first thing Martin Luther King says? during his "I Have a Dream" speech.' I have a dream. It is deeply rooted in the American Dream. That all people are created equal. So, once again, DEI's new label, right? Tried and true values and statement."

To keep its Housing Element submission more on track to conceivably avoid having HCD staff start over on it rather than simply addressing only any changes made to it, the

city council voted unanimously to adopt the "Revised 2021-2029 Housing Element (6th Cycle)".

The city's Home Share Pilot Program was extended for a year to allow city staff and council to see how the city can work to secure more compliance from residents who rent out rooms in their living quarters but have not secured a city permit to do so. City staff said 20 properties had pulled the proper permits from the city and paid the associated business licensing fee.

Consultants Darren Smith and Rod Hall of Economic and Planning Systems delivered a presentation that showed what different density levels per acre look like in nearby cities and Seattle, noting that the city's R3 zone is currently developed at 32 units per acre. However, the current R3 zoning calls for 27 units per acre. Nicol noted that there are "some random R3 properties" in the city, including those located near the 600 block on Penn Street, where addresses in the 500 block are single-family residences. He said while density may need to be increased to meet new standards, it should be added in a way that doesn't "change the lifestyle" of those living nearby. •




