Former LA Kings Star Enjoys El Segundo and New Coaching Gig

Those who are long-time followers of the Los Angeles Kings will surely remember Jaroslav Modry. The Czech defenseman spent a total of 10 years (over two different stints) playing for the franchise before wrapping up his 15-year NHL career in 2008. He then headed back to his homeland for four more seasons until hanging up his skates for good at the age of 41. In 2017, Modry accepted a new job with the Kings' organization as an assistant coach with the team's minor league affiliate, the Ontario Reign. And perhaps unbeknownst to most, he and his family happily reside in El Segundo. Modry is the father of three teenagers, one of whom graduated from El Segundo High School last year. The other two, a freshman and senior, currently attend the campus. "We lived in El Segundo in 1996 before we had our kids," Modry noted. "After I finished playing hockey, we decided to move back to LA since our family had some experience living in the South Bay area. We tried to find the right fit for our kids - schools, activities. El Segundo was a great fit with its size and it is such a nice community. We enjoy living in this town." Modry noticed that El Segundo has changed quite a bit since he initially lived here, specifically due to "all the businesses" that have arrived in recent years. The Los Angeles Kings continue to call El Segundo their headquarters, with the Toyota Sports Center facility entrenched on Nash Street. Upon returning to the South Bay after retiring from playing, Modry coached for the Los Angeles Jr. Kings "AAA" program and led the 16-U team to a California Amateur Hockey Association state title last year.

He also remained involved with the Kings Alumni Association to help out with charity events. "I do enjoy working with youth," he said. "I learn a lot and try to give kids good experience to play this game."

However, Modry heartily welcomed the chance to return to a professional hockey environment. Prior to joining the Reign, he also coached with the Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute as an assistant in 2011/12. But he admits that coaching wasn't something he specifically plotted out to do. "It just happened," he said. "I have been around the game all my life and it's just another step to stay involved and pass some of the in 1992-93. He made his NHL debut with New Jersey in the 1993/94 season and then came to the Ottawa Senators via trade two years later. The Kings acquired Modry just before the end of the 1995/96 season and he bounced around between the big squad and the minors for a few seasons. But by 2000/01, he finally settled in full-time as a key cog in the Kings defense with his playmaking skills, quickness and savvy. He left the Kings for the first time after the 2003/04 season and had brief stints back in Czechoslovakia and with two other NHL teams before returning to Los Angeles for one more go in 2006.

experience to the next generation. I am just getting started in coaching."

Meanwhile, Modry discovered hockey at a very early age growing up in a country that is a hotbed for the NHL and the birthplace of many notable star players such as all-time greats Jaromir Jagr and Dominik Hasek. Born in Ceske-Budejovice, Czechoslovakia, he started playing the sport at the age of eight and reported that he loved it from day one. Did he realize as a kid that he might make a successful career out of it? "As for thinking of doing it for a living, I guess later I wanted to represent my city club and then my country," he said. "But when the opportunity came to go to try out in the training camp of an NHL team, I did jump on it."

While still a teen, Modry indeed joined his local club and played for three years before moving on to Dukla Trencin in 1990. The New Jersey Devils made him the NHL's 179th pick in the fourth round of the 1990 entry draft and he played a full year for their minor league affiliate team in Utica

Hijacking the New El Segundo Pool

As many in El Segundo eagerly await the opening of the new swimming facility, I would like to share, make that warn, what has happened at other local pools during recreational swim hours. Those who seek to enjoy a quiet relaxing swim, soon find themselves unable to find a swim lane as organized swim programs take over the pool to conduct full-scale workouts. Such was the case on Saturday, November 24, when my wife and I arrived at Hawthorne pool to see a large 40 plus in number group of Master's swimmers at the front gate. Fortunately, we were in our swimsuits and immediately headed to a swim lane only to be told to move by members of the swim group (several of whom we never seen at the Hawthorne pool before).

Using the power of social media, these Master's swimmers, which I know for a fact did not have their coaches approval, had organized a take over of the Hawthorne pool, forcing the regular recreation swimmers out of every lane. Those forced out included seniors, disabled swimmers and other just nice regular folks who were stunned at the size and rudeness of the group. My wife, who is recovering from ACL surgery, and I stayed in our lane.

When I exited the pool, I took out my cell phone to take a picture of the organized workout, which included swimmers doing swim sets in unison. One Master's swimmer, seeing me film the packed pool workout, suddenly jumped out of the pool and raced towards me spewing profanities and then put his hand on me. Fortunately my phone taped his yelling and my saying, "don't touch me." As I moved away, I heard a swimmer taunt from the pool, "You going walk away?" I did. As the taunt continued, I thought of the words of Abraham Lincoln, "People will do things in groups that they would be mighty ashamed to do by themselves."

As a former El Segundo Master's swimmer, and one who worked forty-two years as a Los Angeles County lifeguard, I was saddened to witness such rude and thuggish behavior. Before the new facility is opened, I hope a plan and strategy will be in place to prevent the hijacking of the beautiful pool by those seeking to run full-scale swim workouts during our community's recreational swimming time. – Arthur C. moments, he was all about the team concept and did not even mention his selection to the 2002 All-Star squad played before an enthusiastic and supportive home crowd at Staples Center. That season was statistically his best, with a career-high 38 assists and 42 points. "My best moment of being in a Kings uniform was advancing against Detroit in the playoffs," he recalled of the April 2001 series when the underdog, seventh-seeded Los Angeles upset the second-seeded and heavily favored Red Wings in the Western Conference quarterfinals. He also singled out a seven-game match-up against Colorado in which his team fell just short but showed incredible moxie. "We had a very good team and it was lots of fun to be part of it," he said. Modry was pleased to note that he stays in touch with many of his ex-teammates, several of whom still live in the South Bay area. One of them, goalie Jamie Storr who played nine years with the Kings, is a fellow El Segundo resident.




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<u>Police Briefs</u> **Kiwanis Good Citizen Award Andre Robinson**



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

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

The El Segundo High School girls soccer season enters the 2018-19 schedule with high expectations on improving upon last season's overall record and second place Ocean League finish. Head coach Skip Jones has good reason for having high hopes. "We have seven returning starters, so there's a lot of experience," he said.

Coach Jones will lean on the seniors for their leadership to help what looks to be a young team with experience. The group includes Kaela Little, Natalya Lozano, Vanessa Segura, Chloe Chavez, Alivia Kelly, Liliana Romero and Claire Mahon. Each of the seniors has vast experience and should see plenty of action in a wide-open rotation.

Last season, the Eagles relied on a strong

Her presence alongside Annika Nelson, Emily Nagamine, Suey Diep and Marcela Martinez makes for a great group of talented athletes at the midfield position.

Up front for the Eagles are all quick and skilled athletes. Chloe Brown, the Eagles' top scorer last season, returns to lead the offense up. With Mahon, sophomore Julya Garcia and freshman phenom Chelsie Charles, the depth the Eagles have will ensure fresh legs without any decline in talent.

Defensively the Eagles will welcome back Delaney Jones, a talented junior who missed her sophomore year due to an injury. Jones was a standout and showed promise as a freshman starter. Her speed and knack for being in the right place will help the back line. Jones will be joined by returning All-Ocean League player Katie Callahan as well as Kylie Keens. Little's experience and senior leadership will help calm the back line.

The Eagles have 11 players who are juniors, sophomore or freshman expected to be impact players with considerable playing time. The employ. Coach Kemp will have plenty of help from former Eagle standouts as assistants. Coaching the JV team is Tyler Contarsy, while Emily Fuller, Coral Kemp and boys head coach Dave Williamson will assist on both levels.

The team is full of talented seniors who have plenty of experience. Three-year starters and co-captains Jenna Olson and Maya Weiss lead a squad that finished as Ocean League co-champs last season and reached the CIF Southern Section quarterfinals.

Other seniors returning include Sophia Caravello in the cage. Though Caravello split time last season in goal, this year she will be the starter and looks to improve on her two shutouts. She is regarded as one of the top goaltenders in the Ocean League. Other returning seniors include Sarah Alexander, Alisa Flores, Savannah Ghale, Christina Grenke and Alexa Modry. Rounding out the roster is junior Natalie Cloutier-Chaine, sophomore Christina Mullane and freshman Avary Torres.

Last season, the Eagles had an incredible scoring per game average and tallied 338 goals to best a 10-year-old school record by one. The 2006-07 team with the high-scoring duo of Coral Kemp (115 goals) and Elle Quane (94 goals) set the school record. Last season, the top two scorers were junior Jenna Olson (106) and freshman Christina Mullane (86). With both returning, the offense should be wide open.

The Eagles opened their season at home on Tuesday against South Torrance and host Palos Verdes today at 3 p.m. With the new pool at the El Segundo Aquatics Center set to open soon, El Segundo High water polo and swim meets at a very proud Urho Saari Swim Stadium will be coming to an end.

Though the official opening of the new Aquatics Center isn't slated until early January, Coach Kemp has scheduled a first game that is also a fundraiser for the water polo program. On Saturday, Dec. 22, the current girls team will face a roster of alumni at 3 p.m. At 4 p.m., the boys team, coached by Dave Williamson, will face off against an alumni team.

The Eagles had a great season and members of the team were honored for their play. Team MVP was Mason Jaeger. The Eagles Award went to Cameron Dornblaser. Top Offensive Player was Jaden Van Der Woude and Top Defensive Player was Danny Gonzalez. The Eagles were represented on All-Ocean League teams that included Van Der Woude being named Ocean League Most Outstanding Player. Brian Schodorf was named to the All-Ocean League first team, while Caden Kastigar and Kalan Smith were named to the second team.




Senior Sophia Caravello returns and could be one of the Ocean League's top goalkeepers.

Quinoa Tabbouleh Salad with Grapes

Recipe provided by Brandpoint Prep time: 15 minutes • Cook time: 15 minutes • Yield: Serves 6

Ingredients

• 1 1/2 cups water

- 3/4 cup quinoa, rinsed
- 3/4 cup halved red California grapes
- 3/4 cup halved green California grapes
- 2 cups diced English cucumber
- 2/3 cup chopped flat leaf parsley
- 1/2 cup chopped dill • 1/4 cup chopped mint
- 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon lemon zest
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- Freshly ground pepper to taste





Preparation

- 1. In a medium-sized saucepan, bring the water to a boil and add the quinoa.
- 2. Reduce the heat and simmer until quinoa is tender, about 10 to 12 minutes.
- 3. Drain any excess water, then fluff the quinoa and transfer it onto a baking sheet to cool for 10 minutes.
- 4. In a medium bowl, combine the grapes, cucumber, parsley, dill, mint, olive oil, lemon juice and zest, salt and pepper.
