Council Considers Banning Plastic Straws, Utensils Except on Request

Restaurants, coffee houses and convenience stores were served notice Tuesday night that El Segundo might ban the giveaway of plastic straws and utensils, though customers who ask for them will still be provided the disposable plastic items.

Several members of the city's Environmental Committee urged the City Council to reduce the waste stream of plastic on the beaches and coastal waters. Committee member Corrie Zupo said that by taking action with a single-use plastics ban, El Segundo would set an example for inland communities to follow.

Manhattan and Hermosa Beach have enacted their own plastics-free laws. Their ordinances go much further than the "upon request" rule El Segundo is considering. Those cities have banned plastic and polystyrene packaging wrap, plates, bowls, and egg cartons, according to El Segundo city staff. Balloons are banned, too. Diners in the two beach cities even must request non-plastic straws, along with coffee stirrers and eating utensils.

Environmental Committee Chairwoman Tracey Miller-Zarneke hoped the proposed El Segundo law would go further and restrict more types of consumer plastic items, she said. Still, the ordinance affecting food and beverage providers is "on the right path," she said.

The ordinance would forbid restaurants, coffee shops, and convenience stores with fountain-drink dispensers from automatically handing out plastic straws, utensils and coffee stirrers. If approved, the new law would go into effect 90 days later. The businesses need that time to make the necessary changes to their operations and to train their employees.

"I hope after you support this ordinance you will also allow our committee to help educate our local community about the fact that going plastic-free is not as painful or expensive as people may think it is," Miller-Zarneke said.

No one spoke Tuesday in opposition to a food-service plastic ban. Eateries that serve food and beverages, along with private caterers, food vendors, and civic groups with kitchens, bars and drink stations, could ask the city manager for up to one year to comply with the ordinance. Requests must be submitted in writing, and must explain why the new code section causes undue hardship on the business, organization or individual.

The city manager has 10 days to decide whether to grant a delay or exemption, the drafted ordinance says.

The council voted unanimously to advance the item for action at its next regularly scheduled meeting on Jan. 21. When the council reconvenes, it will be without Councilman Don Braunn who is resigning early before his term expires in April because of a new state law on Jan. 1.

Braunn cannot serve on the city council and keep his board position with the DaVinci schools, under the new law. He announced in November he would give up his council seat - one of three that will be open in the next election on Tuesday, March 3.

Having an plastics-reduction ordinance would give El Segundo more control over the amount of single-use plastic, Public Works Director Ken Berkman advised the council in the agenda packet. And, El Segundo is on solid legal footing, based on other court cases, according to City Attorney Mark Hensley.

Courts have backed civic ordinances to curb consumer plastics as long as the intent

was to protect a natural resource, he said during the council discussion of the legality of telling food and beverage operators how to run their businesses. The California Supreme Court upheld Manhattan Beach's plastics-free law, ruling that it was exempt from further environmental review because the reason for the ordinance was to protect the beaches.

The California Legislature considered a plastic-reduction measure this year, last but the legislative session ended in September without the bill reaching the governor's desk.

Miller-Zarneke said the "upon request" policy being considered for El Segundo's food and beverage businesses isn't as radical as it might sound.

"The chemical and restaurant industries already acknowledge that moving toward sustainable food products is a necessary effort, and we want to inspire the community to make the switch before the state imposes the restrictions on cities," she said during public comments before the council voted to advance the single-use plastics ban.

Food providers that sell prepared or raw food, or beverages, to the public for consumption would come under the new ordinance. That includes grocers, supermarkets, drive-throughs, cafes, farmers markets and snack bars. And, it would apply to food trucks and carts, caterers, vending machines and any organization or group that serves its members as part of its activities, according to the ordinance. The same applies to beverages.

Any business, organization or person who serves liquid, slurry, frozen or semi-frozen or other types of beverages would be held to the new plastics-free policy.

Wiseburn School Board Tabs Mora as new President

Last Thursday evening the Wiseburn Unified School District (WUSD) School Board selected Israel Mora to succeed JoAnne Kaneda as president. Mora, who also serves on the board of trustees of Da Vinci charter schools brings a wealth of experience to the post, having served on the WUSD board since 2001.

Dr. Neil Goldman will serve the next year as vice president/clerk. The 2019/20 board is rounded-out by Kaneda, Roger Banuelos, and Nelson Martinez.

Superintendent Dr. Blake Silvers said that "I have really thoroughly enjoyed working with JoAnne Kaneda." He said he views her as a mentor and touted her "professionalism." Silvers added that "I have great respect for Israel, he is just a really engaged member of the community. His focus is kids and Wiseburn."

Kaneda said that she was honored to serve the Board as president for the past two years. "It has been a challenge, a privilege, an opportunity," she said.

Mora thanked the Board for their "confidence" that they showed in him. He noted this will be his second tenure as president, saying the experience was "very enjoyable, but a lot of hard work." He lauded his fellow Board members, noting that their decisions are always based on what is best for the students.

Juan de Anza Elementary principal Albert Paredes and assistant principal Katie Masterson made the only special presentation of the evening. The pair spoke about the strides being made at Anza in the STEM program, focusing on Project Lead the Way (PLTW). Paredes dubbed 2019 as the "year of the Anza," noting multiple school accomplishments. "We are a future-ready school," he said. "We want to continue to utilize technology as a learning-tool."

Masterson delineated what the PLTW program entails, citing classroom experiences, teacher development, and parental engagement. She showed slides portraying how the Anza students are embracing PLTW and developing 21-st century learning skills.

Said Kaneda: "I love the idea of including the parents," which Paredes said is a focal point of the Anza PLTW program.

Board member reports followed. Nelson Martinez spoke about attending the recent California School Boards Association (CSBA) conference. He noted the value of attending the meeting, and how coding and engineering may be the future, but was also curious how



AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 15 (ZONING REGULATIONS) OF THE EL SEGUNDO MUNICIPAL CODE ESTABLISHING A PUBLIC ART OR IN-LIEU FEE REQUIREMENT AND A CULTURAL DEVELOPMENT FUND

SUMMARY OF ADOPTED ORDINANCE The intent of the Ordinance is to promote the public arts in the City of El Segundo by creating a collection of visual artwork and providing artistic and cultural services, such as performing arts, literary art, media art, arts education, art events and temporary artworks, by recognized artists, and of the highest possible quality, throughout the City, for the public's benefit. As of the effective date of the Ordinance, the City shall require that certain private developers use a portion of building development funds (equal to or exceeding one percent of the project cost) for the acquisition of publiclyaccessible artwork, or pay to the City an in-lieu fee, as a condition of project approval. The requirement shall apply to all commercial or industrial development projects where the project cost exceeds

NOTICE OF URGENCY ORDINANCE CITY OF EL SEGUNDO **ORDINANCE 1610**

ORDINANCE OF THE EL SEGUNDO TEMPORARILY PROHIBITING EVICTIONS WITHOUT JUST CAUSE THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2019 FOR RESIDENTIAL REAL PROPERTY BUILT PRIOR JANUARY 1, 2005 AND DECLARING THE URGENCY THEREOF SUMMARY OF ADOPTED URGENCY

ORDINANCE

Assembly Bill 1482 ("AB 1482"), the Tenant Protections Act of 2019, was signed by the Governor and on October 2019 and becomes effective on January 1, 2020. The bill limits "rentgouging" in California by placing an upper limit on annual rent increases (5% plus an inflation adjustment). To prevent landlords from engaging in rentgouging by evicting tenants, the bill also requires that a landlord have and state a just cause, as specified, in order to evict tenants who have occupied the premises for at least one year. Both the rent cap and the just cause provisions are subject to several enumerated exemptions.

AB 1482 can have the unintended effect of incentivizing landlords to evict longterm tenants without cause in order to raise rents before AB 1482 becomes effective. Tenants have reported receiving notices of termination of tenancy without just cause, as defined herein, and threats of eviction without just cause since AB 1482 was signed into law. This Ordinance temporarily prohibits evictions without just cause from October 8, 2019 through December 31, 2019 for those resident real properties that will be covered by AB 1482 beginning on January 1, 2020.

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

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



to best serve students who may not be geared towards or interested in high-tech fields, but may be interested in more hands-on areas like plumbing.

Silvers thanked Banuelos and Martinez for their attendance and help at the CSBA conference and spoke about the recent facilities master plan meeting.

Next up were three discussion items. Chief Business Official Dave Wilson briefed the members on the Districts first interim financial report. Wilson gave the members the "Cliff notes" version of the changes since the last budget numbers were crunched in July. Upshot: District financing looks good, with the WUSD to file a "positive certification." Securing funding is always a hot-button issue in school districts. Mora said he foresees"

tough years ahead, with limited increases in funding." Kaneda questioned if state revenues were down, to which Wilson replied, "for the most part, we are still on target."

Noting the positive financial certification, Silvers said that "one of the pillars in the District is to be financially strong so that we are good moving forward" to combat a possible future economic slowdown

Next-up was the Child Development Center (CDC) financial report. Prior to the meeting, Silvers had mentioned the need to "look at the books," that the goal was to run a "break-even" program, but is facing a structural deficit, which triggered the District to take a look at multiple facets of running the CDC. "We need a plan for what we want to do," Kaneda said.

The final discussion item involved exploring

a proposed District history project. Jack Goode penned a thesis when he was a college student that covered the WUSD historically from the late 1800's until 1960. Dr. Don Brann, who currently is on the Da Vinci schools board, and has served the WUSD as a Superintendent, has championed the idea of continuing the documenting of WUSD history from 1960 to the present. The cost to the District for the update would be in the 20k range. Initial comments from the Board members evinced that they would like to explore a more economical way to get the work done.

Later in the meeting, the Board approved an agreement with Barber & Barber, Inc. to provide the independent evaluation of the CDC and before/after school programs. The evaluation should wrap-up no later than March 15 and is not to exceed 30k.

The Board also approved the extension of Silvers contract, which will now run through June 30, 2022. Goldman said approving Silvers contract extension was "a no-brainer," and noted that the Board was "appreciative of your leadership, especially through some difficult decisions. You have our full confidence."

The 90-minute meeting was adjourned in memory of longtime R.H. Dana Middle School teacher Vincent Barnett, who passed away on Nov.17.

Upcoming District events include multiple school-site musical festivities, and the start of winter break at the conclusion of the school day on Friday, Dec. 20. The next regularly scheduled Board meeting is set for Thursday evening, Jan. 16 •

from front page and Walnut Street: 30 mph.

In other action, the council agreed to set higher speed limits in some areas of El Segundo based on the findings of a traffic study. On the recommendation of consultants Garland Associates, council members agreed to keep current speed limits on 39 streets and establish new speed limits on six street segments that have no posted speed limits.

Just two of those streets, Allied Way south of Hughes Way and Park Place east of Pacific Coast Highway, will be posted at 25 mph. The traffic consultants recommended slightly higher speed limits for the following:

- · Apollo Street between Park Place and Rosecrans Avenue: 30 mph.
- · Atwood Way between Nash and Douglas streets: 35 mph.
- · Selby Street between Imperial Highway

• Walnut Avenue between Pacific Coast Highway and Selby Street: 30 mph.

The traffic engineers reported that on the majority of streets they surveyed, 85 percent of El Segundo drivers were traveling close to the posted limit. That convinced engineers the speed limits were justified, taking into consideration the amount of traffic and crash risks.

The council also honored Dick Wyckoff as the ESVP of the year. It's the second time he's been recognized as a retired volunteer with the El Segundo Police Department. Retired Senior Volunteers provide assistance to the police department by checking houses for people on vacation; provide support for public events, and provide a variety of other valuable services to support the community. •

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
