A Look Back at the 2022 Year in Sports

With just a few days until we welcome 2023, it's time to reminisce on the sports scene in El Segundo. It was another year of championships, close calls, heartbreaks, and a time to reflect on sports in our community. Once again, high school and youth sports took center stage as we supported our teams and kids. So with that in mind, let's revisit the first six months of 2022 and relive the excitement of some extraordinary and precious memories that had our community buzzing and outside communities in envy.

January: High School Sports Resumes after Covid Period Shutdown

Before we turned the page to 2021 and the Eagles returned to their respective sports, the uptick in Covid and the new Omicron virus changed things again to start 2022. Games were canceled or rescheduled, and alternative plans were considered for winter sports to complete their respective seasons.

After a Covid relief period, there was some rust to shake off. For some teams, it was the first time they had played a game before Christmas. For others, it was a layoff of two or more weeks. Teams were apparently struggling to return to game conditions after their respective layoffs. What was also noticeable was the player's efforts. The girl's water polo team had played one game since December 18. Both boys' and girls' basketball teams had played just two games since December 23, and the girls' soccer team played one game since defeating Santa Monica 2-1 on December 20. In each case, the spirit and energy each displayed in their return to action showed that their competitive spirit hadn't dampened.

The Eagles prevailed through all the Covid adversity, especially the girls' soccer and water polo teams. The water polo team averaged 20 goals per contest in the Pioneer League and placed third in the Claremont Tournament. The girls' soccer team finished second in the Pioneer League after their 4-1 win over South Torrance. The Eagles advanced to the postseason and an opportunity to defend their CIF Southern Section Division 4 championship.

The boys' soccer team's push for a playoff berth meant taking down North Torrance, the two-time defending Pioneer League, 2-1. With their playoff hopes still alive, the Eagles needed a win against South Torrance, one of the top-ranked teams, to keep them alive; their 3-2 overtime win did just that.

February: Busy Sports Calendar

February is a busy sports time in El Segundo. The El Segundo In-Line Hockey Association crowned its champions in three divisions, including the Bronze Division, Silver Division, and Gold Division. The Devils won the Bronze Division (5-8-year-olds) in OT; the Gladiators, led by Brayden Le won the Silver Division (9-11-year-olds), and the Wyld Stalyns held off the Fantams for Gold Title (12-17-year-olds). The El Segundo Little League held its annual parade to commemorate the start of its sixty-seventh season.

Both soccer high school teams advanced to the playoffs, and the girl's water polo team was one of the top-seeded teams for their playoff tournament. The water polo team won the CIF Southern Section Division 4 championship. Their 13-7 win over the Oxnard Yellow Jackets gave the program its first title since 2007.

The girls' soccer team finished second in the Pioneer League but peaked in the CIF playoffs to reach their second consecutive final. They went on the road to face top-seeded West Torrance in the CIF-SS Division 3 finals and came away with an emotionally charged and physically draining 2-0 win over the top-seeded Warriors.

Unfortunately, both boys and girls' basketball teams missed out on advancing. The Lady Eagles pulled off a huge 58-54 win over Lawndale. On Senior Appreciation night, the three seniors Paris Gravett, Bo Takehara, and Kristina Tsukahira led their team to victory over the Cardinals. The upset win wasn't enough to get an invite to the postseason.

March: Soccer and Water Polo Teams Lose Regional Final

The girls' soccer team reached the Southern California Division III Regional championship game, where they played the West Torrance Warriors. On a blustery cold evening, the Warriors took a 2-0 lead before Chelsie Charles took a pass from freshman Lauren Nguyen and crossed it into the net in the 75th minute to cut the deficit to 2-1. But the Eagles couldn't make up the difference and fell.

After marching through and winning the CIF-SS Division 4 girls water polo playoffs, the Eagles defeated La Costa Canyon and Carlsbad in the Southern California Division III Regional. In the final, they fell to nationally ranked La Jolla.

The baseball team started their season by finishing 2-2 in their own tournament. Seven student-athletes signed their Letters of Intent to play their respective sport at the

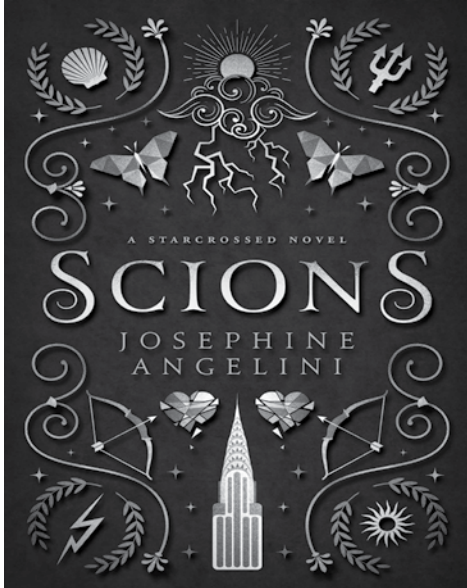

Teen Title Roundup

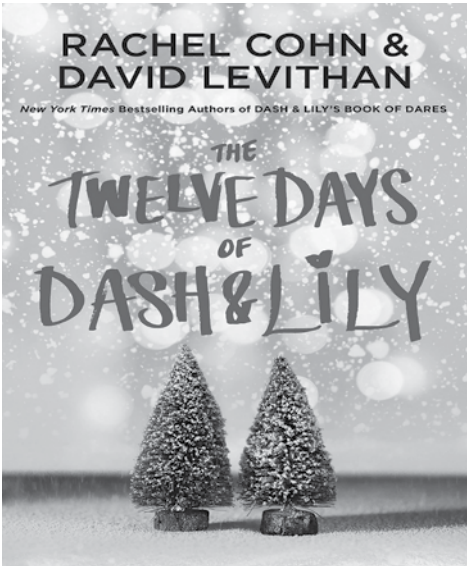

Film Review

Mija Gives Two Mexican American Musicians the Spotlight

Four-time Emmy-nominated, Mexican American filmmaker Isabel Castro makes her documentary feature debut with *Mija*, an emotionally-charged portrait of daughters of illegal immigrants paving their own path in America. Our protagonist is Doris Anahi Muñoz, a music-obsessed entrepreneur and the only daughter in a family of four. Her parents

and brother immigrated from Mexico to San Bernardino before Doris was born and her U.S. citizenship means she's the only one in her family with documentation. This pressure to provide for her family while simultaneously attempting to pursue her own passion as a music executive can be overwhelming at times, but Doris is a nurturer at heart and takes the responsibility in stride. Sure, she inherited her family's fears but she has also inherited their dreams.

Music became her sanctuary. Since the thought of ever returning to Mexico seemed impossible, Doris and her family would listen to songs that re-connected them to their Mexican roots. This sense of pride and commitment to uplifting her community lead her to singer-songwriter Omar Banos aka Cuco, whom she spotted and managed throughout

the majority of his rising success. When 2020 hit and the tours stopped booking, Cuco and Doris went their separate ways – a devastating blow that put her stability in jeopardy. Resilient as she is, it didn't take Doris long before spotting her next artist: Jacks Haupt, a Pop-R&B artist from Dallas, TX.

Despite being essentially strangers at first, Jacks and Doris' shared backstory – that of being a young, Mexican American woman in America following a dream – creates a bond that ignites the other. *Mija* follows their relationship and individual journeys of what it means to "make it" and what success looks and feels like to them. *Mija* is ultimately a feel good film but not without an emotional curveball or two thrown in.

Isabel Castro weaves *Mija's* dual storyline of immigration and entrepreneurship together so beautifully. It's a specific story on the surface but one that will no doubt resonate universally, appealing to anyone who has ever felt like the odds have been against them. At the center of it all, *Mija* asks the rhetorical question: Who is allowed to dream? Doris, Jacks, and all immigrants deserve the opportunity to pursue their passion without guilt. Their perspective on the world, and their contribution to the arts, is vital to creative prosperity.

Mija is available to stream on Disney+. •

- 1 tablespoon plus 1 teaspoon horseradish sauce

Directions

- **Step 1:** Heat oven to 325°F. Place beef, fat side up, on rack in shallow roasting pan. Rub garlic halves over beef. Spread 1/4 cup mustard over top and sides of beef. Mix remaining Rib Roast ingredients except oil; stir in oil. Spread herb mixture over top and sides of beef.
- **Step 2:** Insert meat thermometer so tip is in center of thickest part of beef and does not touch bone. Roast uncovered 1 1/2 to 2 hours for medium doneness (155°F).
- **Step 3:** Meanwhile, mix all Peppery Horseradish sauce ingredients. Cover and refrigerate at least 1 hour to blend flavors.
- **Step 4:** Cover beef loosely with foil tent and let stand about 15 minutes before carving. (Temperature will rise about 5°.) Serve with Peppery Horseradish Sauce.
