Contractor Found For Dominguez Channel Catch Basin Full Capture Device Project

United Storm Water Inc. has been awarded a contract as the lowest bidder for the Dominguez Channel Catch Basin Full Capture Device Project. The agreement, which amounts to \$110,234.60, includes a contingency of \$11,100 that will be made available through the sewer fund.

An invitation to bid was published on July 2 in various publications, the Inglewood Chamber of Commerce and the city's website. As a result, two firms, G-2 Construction, Inc. and United Storm Water, Inc., attended the mandatory prebid meeting at the Public Works office on July 14. The actual bid opening was hosted by the City Clerk's office on July 29 and only a United Storm Water, Inc. submitted a bid.

"United Storm Water, Inc. has already completed the Ballona Creek Catch Basin Inserts Project Phase 2 for the City in 2013," states the staff report signed by Public Works Director Louis A. Atwell. "United Storm Water, Inc. installed Connector Pipe Screen (CPS) and Automatic Retractable Screen (ARS) in several cities within Southern California."

After evaluating the bids and references, the public works' staff moved forward with the recommendation for Mayor James T. Butts and the members of the Inglewood City Council to award the contract to United Storm Water, Inc. The money for the contract was obtained by the city through staff's submission of an application to receive funding through Cal Recycle for a Used Oil Competitive Program. The application submitted by city staff detailed the installation of every catch basin insert, as well as every automatic retractable screen in the city's catch basins, which flow into the Dominguez Channel.

Catch basins, also known as storm drain inlets and curb inlets, are storm drain system and are usually a grate or curb inlet designed to trap sediment, debris and other pollutants. Catch basins are mainly used as pretreatment to another storm water management process. Many localities across the United States have begun retrofitting existing catch basins in order to improve their effectiveness. One such step to ensure better results is to modify all

catch basins with a hooded outlet to prevent floatable materials, such as trash and debris, from entering the storm drain system. The City of Inglewood (City) storm drain system consists of 54 miles of pipeline and 1,285 catch basins.

"There are two watersheds within the City; the north portion, which drains to Ballona Creek and the south portion, which drains to the Dominguez Channel," indicates the staff report. "The ownership of the system is split between the City (27 miles of storm drain pipeline and 493 catch basins) and the County of Los Angeles Public Works Department (27 miles of storm drain pipeline and 792 catch basins)."

Of the Dominguez Channel's watershed, the City of Inglewood owns and provides maintenance to 223 catch basins while the County of Los Angeles owns and maintains the 474 catch basins.

"The City-owned catch basins need to be maintained and operated by the City for Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) permit compliance and therefore will be retrofitted with full capture devices," states the staff report. "The full capture devices are either a Connector Pipe Screen (CPS), an Automatic Retractable Screen (ARS), or a combination of both."

Permit Process For Small Residential Rooftop Solar Systems To Be Expedited

Ordinance No. 15-22 has been adopted by the Inglewood and City Council in order to amend Chapter 11 of the city's municipal code to expedite the permitting process for small residential rooftop solar systems.

Last year state legislators adopted Assembly Bill 2188, which requires all cities to adopt ordinances to create a faster, more streamlined permitting process for small residential rooftop solar systems.

These systems include "solar photovoltaic systems that are less than 10 kilowatts alternating current and solar thermal systems that are less than 30 kilowatts," states the staff report signed by Senior Economic and Community Development Manager Christopher E. Jackson. "The City currently expedites the review of such applications by reviewing and issuing the majority of applications over the counter."

City staff was already in the practice of expediting the review of such applications, so the only step left to take was adopting the ordinance mandated by the state in order to demonstrate compliance. Furthermore, AB 2188 requires that the expedited process also conform to the California Solar Permitting Guidebook, which was adopted by the Governor's Office of Planning and Research. •

WEST BASIN WATER HARVEST

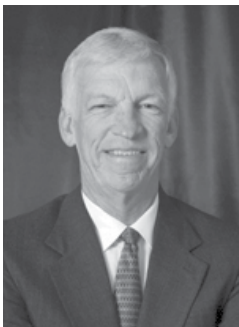



Morningside Rallies Past Peninsula in Bay Opener

Morningside High's football team is off to one of its best starts in decades at 6-0 overall and 1-0 in the Bay League after rallying for a 24-21 win over host Peninsula High last Friday in Rolling Hills Estates.

Playing without starting quarterback Jerome Rosebrough, head coach LaFayette Fletcher, who also was celebrating his birthday, went to Travion Magee. Magee had to get adjusted as a starter as he struggled at first as the Panthers, who are 2-4 overall and 0-1 in league, took a 14-0 lead early in the second quarter.

Magee finally got things going by midway in the second quarter as he finished the game, completing 17 of 34 passes for 382 yards, two touchdowns and one interception. Wide receiver Adarras Wilson scored the Monarchs' first TD on a 15-yard pass from Magee and, later in the second quarter, Jontrell Hogan ran 51 yards for a score as the Monarchs cut Peninsula's lead to 14-12.

The Panthers brought their lead back up to 21-12 when quarterback Daniel Schubert found Jack Grimes in the clear for a 77-yard touchdown play. Morningside, though, got within three points with 48 seconds before halftime when Jaylin Wright completed a 50-yard drive on a two-yard run into the end zone.

Monarchs finally took their first lead when Magee found Wright for a 47-yard TD play. Morningside sealed the game on an interception off Schubert with 2:45 left in the game. The Monarchs had a pair of key first downs to successfully run down the clock for their sixth win, already the most since their 2003 squad went 11-3 and made it to the CIF-Southern Section Northwest Division championship game before falling at Lompoc. That squad was also head coached by Fletcher, who was with Morningside's football program since the late 1980's before stepping down after the 2011 season, then returning to replace the departed Derwin Henderson, now head mentor at Long Beach Millikan.

"The Bay League is all tough," Fletcher said. "Peninsula did a real good job on us. I'm glad we pulled this game out. These kids are pretty happy to be 6-0. We had no spring football. We have no junior varsity or freshman team, so we have a lot of young players (on the varsity)."

Fletcher knows that the Bay League will be a tough road. The Monarchs will take their unbeaten record to Redondo, which is 5-1 overall and 1-0 in league after breezing past host Inglewood 37-13 last Friday at Coleman Field. Despite just a 34-player roster, the Sea Hawks

done well against a tough preseason schedule where their only loss was on September 25 against Mission Viejo (7-0 overall and 1-0 in the South Coast League), the top ranked team in the tough CIF-Southern Section West Valley Division and rated seventh in California, 35-16. Redondo is currently ranked third in the Southern Section Western Division and is led by the passing combination of quarterback Jacob Silvera and six-foot-five wide receiver Warren Jackson. The Sea Hawks' defense is led by returning first team all-Bay League end Cedric Muzick and linebacker Preston Faecher, who is another key receiver.

MURRAY LIFTS LAWDALE OVER CULVER CITY

Lawndale High's football team had a shootout against host Culver City but it was dominating quarterback Chris Murray that helped the Cardinals top the Centaurs 48-41 in their Ocean League opener last Friday. Murray figured on six of Lawndale's seven touchdowns. He rushed for 250 yards and five TD's on 17 carries, and completed five of eight passes for 56 yards and one score. That touchdown was on a 28-yard pass to Jalen Walker.

Bryant Perkinson rushed for 168 yards and one TD on 13 carries. Perkinson, though, left in the third quarter due to cramps and an injured ankle. The Cardinals improved to 5-1 overall and 1-0 in league. Lawndale faces Santa Monica High, head coach Travis Clark's former team, at Santa Monica City College Friday at 7 p.m. The Vikings are off to their worst start since their 0-10 squad of 1992 at 0-6 after losing at Hawthorne 20-6 last Friday.

COUGARS GET FIRST WIN

After going 0-5 in non-league, Hawthorne High's football team is off to a good start after topping Santa Monica 20-6 last Friday at Hawthorne. Quarterback Marte Mapa scored a touchdown and passed for another in keying the Cougars (1-5, 1-0) to their first win of the season. Hawthorne will be seeking to begin league at 2-0 as it hosts Beverly Hills, which is 0-6 overall and 0-1 in Ocean play after a 35-6 loss to El Segundo last Friday,

Friday at 7 p.m.

LEUZINGER FALLS TO WEST

Leuzinger High's football team played host West Torrance tough before being worn down by the Warriors 41-20 in their Pioneer League opener last Friday. West surged to a 21-0 lead before the Olympians scored two TDs on passes by quarterback Malik Jackson to Andre Hunt (74 yards) and Earia Culpepper (nine yards). Adrian Galeria added a 36-yard touchdown run. He rushed for 100 yards on 14 carries.

The Olympians had trouble holding down West running back Brylen Baucham, who rushed for 135 yards and two touchdowns on 15 carries. Leuzinger (1-5, 0-1) will seek its first league win as it hosts Torrance (0-6 overall and 0-1 in league after a 21-14 loss to South Torrance Friday) Friday at 7 p.m.

INGLEWOOD LOSES TO REDONDO

Inglewood High's football team lost its Bay League opener at home to Redondo 37-13 last Friday. After seeing the Sea Hawks (5-1, 1-0) jump out to a 37-0 third quarter lead, the Sentinels came back with two touchdowns to make the game a little more respectful. Inglewood stays at home against Palos Verdes, which began Bay action with a 9-7 home win over Mira Costa Friday, Friday at 7 p.m. •

NASA Orbiter Views Sites of Fiction Film’s Mars Landings

Based on press releases from NASA and the White House, provided by Bob Eklund

Images from a NASA Mars orbiter’s telescopic camera reveal details of real regions on Mars where the new Hollywood movie The Martian, places future astronaut adventures. The novel of the same name, originally self-published by Andy Weir in 2011, used actual locations on Mars for the landing sites for its “Ares 3” and “Ares 4” missions. The landing site for “Ares 3” is on a Martian plain named Acidalia Planitia. The base for the “Ares 4” mission was set inside a crater named Schiaparelli.

Views of these two sites, and other locations pertinent to the fictional story, are in the latest weekly release of images from the High Resolution Imaging Science Experiment (HiRISE) camera on NASA’s Mars Reconnaissance Orbiter. They are available online at http://uahirise.org/martian

Each observation by HiRISE covers an area of several square miles and shows details as

small as a desk. More than 39,000 of them have been taken since the Mars Reconnaissance Orbiter reached Mars in 2006. They are available online for anyone to explore, from the comfort of home, at http://hirise.lpl.arizona.edu.

all students in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) education to inspire students to pursue careers in science, technology, and innovation-driven disciplines.

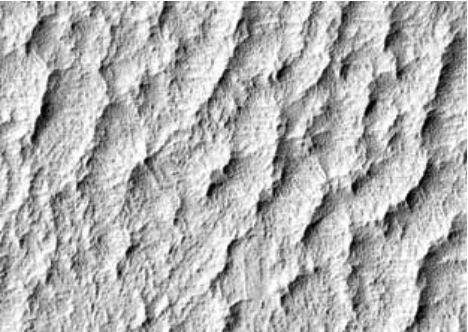
