Gloria Gray Elected Chair of Metropolitan Water District

In a vote by the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California (MWD) Board of Directors, West Basin Municipal Water District (West Basin) Director Gloria D. Gray was elected to serve as chairwoman of the MWD board. Gray is the first African-American woman in Metropolitan's 90 -year history to hold the position.

"It's a tremendous honor to have been selected by my fellow Metropolitan board members to serve as chair," said Gray. "I look forward to continuing the board's important commitment to providing reliable supplies of high-quality water both now and in the future." She added, "I am committed to an open and transparent decision-making process."

In 2006, Gray was first elected to the West Basin Board of Directors to represent Division II, which includes the City of Inglewood and areas of unincorporated Los Angeles County including Athens, Ladera Heights, Lennox and Westmont. She has served as a West Basin representative on the MWD Board of Directors since 2009.

Starting Jan. 1, 2019, Gray will commence her two-year term as chairwoman of the MWD board, becoming the 19th board chair of the primary water importer and wholesaler for nearly 19 million people in six counties. As the head of the 38-member board, Gray will represent district policies and programs at national, state and local levels. She also will preside over monthly meetings of the board and its executive committee. In addition, she will appoint all members of the MWD's nine

standing committees, as well as the leaders of any special committees or task forces.

Gray was also the first African-American woman to serve as vice chair of the MWD Board, chair of Water Planning and Stewardship Committee, and serves on the Executive Committee, Personnel and Technology Committee, Special Committee on Bay-Delta, and Communication and Legislative Committee.

In addition, in 2014, the West Basin board appointed Gray as their representative to the ACWA Joint Powers Insurance Authority and Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA) Region 8, where she serves as the 2018-2019 Vice Chair. She was also appointed to represent West Basin as a voting board member on the Santa Monica Bay Restoration Commission, and the Commission elected her to the Executive Committee and the Commission's Authority.

Gray was also appointed in March 2009 by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors to serve on a water quality Community Task Force, which is part of the County's Clean Water, Clean Beaches Initiative to address pollution in our local waterways that include rivers, lakes, bays, beaches, and coastal waters. In April 2010, Gray was appointed to the Delta Stewardship Council by former Assembly Speaker Karen Bass and served a four-year term.

In 2018, Gray was recognized as Visionary of the Year by Playa Vista Jobs for her work in the water industry. In 2017, Gray received the Esther Williams Award of Excellence for her continued commitment to community


service and water reliability from the South Bay Workforce Investment Board. In 2012, she was honored by the Southern California Water Committee with the "Honorable Harriett Wieder" award for leadership in water.

West Basin is a member agency of the Metropolitan Water District and is governed by a five-member board of directors who are publicly elected to represent nearly one million people in 17 cities and unincorporated areas throughout its 185-square mile service area in coastal Los Angeles County. West Basin is also an industry leader in producing recycled water, implementing effective water conservation programs, desalting groundwater, exploring ocean water desalination and providing education programs. Film Review

It's a heartbreaking thing to sit helpless watching a loved one struggle with inner turmoil and grief. And short of that person being oneself or a family member, watching two of the big screen's most beloved stars -Steve Carell and Timothée Chalamet – play out this heart-wrenching story as father and son is a not easy to watch without letting your emotions surface.

Carell and Chalamet star in Beautiful Boy, the new film based on the pair of memoirs written by David and Nic Sheff -- a father and son whose stories show the painful perspectives of a son's ongoing struggle with drug addiction. Beautiful Boy depicts David's desperate determination and Nic's recurring relapses, revealing there may be no escape from rescuing someone from something as merciless and addictive as harrowing chemical dependencies.

It's nothing short of expert casting to see these actors inhabit these real-life roles. You might even wish Carell and Chalamet were part of your own family. Few other actors could make you feel as crushed as seeing a heartbroken Steve Carell playing a forlorn father figure. And which other young actors could make you feel as torn up inside as Hollywood's latest heartthrob, Timothée Chalamet, throwing his promising life away?

There have been other films about the consuming nature of drugs and addiction, and there are familiar notes to Beautiful Boy that don't exactly differentiate themselves from those other films. But what

distinguishes Beautiful Boy, making it so moving and impactful, is its ability to show how addiction affects more than just the drug user, but also the user's larger circle as well. Other stories of addiction might have focused solely on Nic and his journeyof substance abuse --but in seeing his father David, meandering around his son's empty bedroom consumed in thought and worry, we see the fractures from all sides. David calls the police to report his son as a missing person early on, but eventually is resigned to accept that

Nic's reliable absence signals that he is no longer missing, but altogether lost.

What distinguishes Beautiful Boy further is that we see the moments where Nic momentarily recovers, rather than in a total downward spiral. Short-term stints of sobriety are an honest part of the experience. Nic rides the waves as best he can until he is all but swallowed up by the sea. Seeing a strungout Nic at the end of the film at his absolute worst stands as one of the most tear-jerking moments I've had this year.

There is such heart brought to this adaptation by director Felix van Groeningen. It's felt in the chemistry of its stars, who also include Maura Tierney and Amy Ryan as Nic's worried step-mother and mother (whose contributions in the film are effective but largely underutilized, being a story of father and son grief). The flashbacks of Carell as David with the younger Nic (Kue Lawrence, Jack Dylan Grazer) paint the entire picture of this family's story as even more affecting.

Beautiful Boy is a powerful, heart-wrenching story that offers the most sympathetic portrait of addiction that I've seen in recent times. David and Nic's stories of recovery, relapse and the hope for redemption paint a poignant picture of what makes life so beautiful.

120 min. Beautiful Boy is rated R for drug content throughout, language and brief sexual material. Now playing at ArcLight Hollywood and The Landmark. •

The annual Hawthorne President's Council BBO Dinner will be held this



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Choline Breakfast Skillet

Recipe provided by Brandpoint

Ingredients

- 6 Eggland's Best Eggs (large)
- 2 tablespoons milk
- 2-3 tablespoons butter
- 1 pound lean ground beef
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 1/2 cup chopped red bell pepper
- 2 cups chopped cauliflower florets
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 cup low-fat shredded cheese

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Preparation

- 1. Whisk eggs in a small bowl. Add milk and set aside.
- **2.** Melt 2 tablespoons butter in large skillet. Add ground beef, breaking it up as it cooks. Cook for about 5-7 minutes over medium-low heat, or until cooked through. Move cooked ground beef to a plate.
- **3.** Add remaining tablespoon butter to skillet if needed. Add onion, pepper, cauliflower and spices. Cook for 5 minutes, or until veggies are cooked through.
- **4.** Pour egg mixture over veggies and cook on medium-low heat for 3-5 minutes, until eggs are cooked through and scrambled.
- 5. Add ground beef back into skillet and top with cheese.
- **6.** Optional toppings/add-ins: greens, mushrooms, avocado, oregano, parsley, cilantro, sour cream, Greek yogurt.



Wiseburn Board Hears Pleas for Mandarin Immersion Program

At last Thursday evening's meeting of the Wiseburn School Board, the assembled members heard the pleas of residents who continue to champion a district-wide program of Mandarin Immersion. The Board also approved the promotion of administrator Dr. Aileen Harbeck and witnessed two special presentations.

Seven members of the public approached the presentation podium during the "from the public" portion of the meeting to express their views, with six of the speakers beseeching Wiseburn Unifies School District to implement a Mandarin Immersion after-school program. Each speaker was to be limited to three minutes, with some continuing a little longer and others limiting their comments.

Board meeting rules to do not allow member discussion after the public comments. Said Board President JoAnne Kaneda prior to the public comments: "Just so you know, it is not the Board's intent or obligation to respond to public comment. We are willing to listen and take notes.'

In an email sent after the meeting, Wiseburn Superintendent Dr. Blake Silvers responded, "We truly understand the value of learning languages for students at a young age. Because the number of students interested in Mandarin as an after-school program was low for this year, we must allocate our expenses in other programs. We will revisit an after-school option next school year and will communicate with our families to ensure that they have the time to make the decision. We are very happy to announce that an enrichment program for Spanish Language

is being held at Cabrillo Elementary School and facilitated by Cultural Bytes. There are currently 48 students enrolled and we are expecting the number to increase."

During the action-item, personnel section of the 75-minute meeting, the Board passed the promotion of Dr. Harbeck, retroactive to July 1, to the position of Assistant Superintendent, Educational Services. Harbeck, a long-time District employee who has served in multiple positions in the school system, was recently touted by Silvers as "very, very smart. Brilliant probably, is how I would describe her. She is committed to curriculum and instruction, but she might be mad if I said that. Her focus is teaching and learning. The value that she provides at the organizational level is very systemic in her thought processes -- a relationship-builder who is able to see the big picture and methodically plan the steps that you need to get to that big picture." Silvers added that Harbeck's promotion will be "huge" for the District because she "brings a wealth of knowledge and willingness to learn. Her commitment to building teams is what sets her apart." When the Board members announced they had approved Harbeck's new position, both they and those in the audience gave a hearty round of applause for the promotion.

Wiseburn Education Foundation (WEF) Executive Director Carolyn Niman announced funding for 30 District Innovation grants awarded to educators, totaling \$34,000. The funds will go towards classroom enhancements, including flexible seating, mobile whiteboards, rugs and classroom storage. Of the total, 4,000 will be utilized for teacher

professional development, with \$20,000 on the books for "innovative delivery of curriculum." She noted that the WEF has bestowed more than \$93,000 to Wiseburn educators since the group's inception in 2015.

Maria Garcia from Dana Middle School helmed a presentation in concert in with what she termed the "STEM Sistas:" Educators Summer Graves (Peter Burnett Elementary), Trisha Maano (Burnett), Emma Rennick (Anza Elementary) and Jordan McKenna (Anza). Silvers was impressed by the cadre of teachers tackling the STEM Initiative, noting, "We have five amazing teachers that have taken over this challenge. The goal is to keep evolving STEM, capturing all the schools."

The educators spoke about Wiseburn's 2018/19 STEM Initiative. Garcia and her co-presenters quickly detailed the roll-out of the program and targets, and talked of the "big deliverables." Those include a Hacka-Challenge, Project Lead the Way teacher training, a Girls Who Code Club, a Girls Who Code Mother/Daughter Event, and a MathCounts Video competition.

During the truncated Board member reports, Dr. Neil Goldman thanked the Mandarin Immersion supporters and promised to continue to ramp up District communication. Kaneda evinced that the community should soon receive updated communication about the progress made towards completion of the aquatics center.

During his comments, Silvers made note of the recent passing of long-time Wiseburn employee Sue Mills. Mills was first hired as a playground aide at Dana Middle School in the mid-'90s and served as a food service worker at Cabrillo Elementary as well as at Dana until she resigned in 2014. Said Silvers: "Our thoughts go out to Sue's family, as she was a Wiseburn treasure and will be forever missed."

Silvers also spoke of the recent fundraiser held at the aquatics center, as the hoped-for actual opening continues to have a mid-November target date. He mentioned that the District is working hard to initiate and embrace proactive communications with the community and is "very close" to launching new websites. He also updated Wiseburn's emergency response protocol. "Safety is obviously really important," he said, and shared that the District was looking to work with an expert to provide a full security assessment of facilities and "harden our sites."

Action items passed included an agreement with Dave Klug of Actus Consulting to provide the security assessment that Silvers had mentioned earlier in the meeting, which Goldman called "very important and very exciting to see." Kaneda added that she was "comfortable" with the agreement.

Also passed Thursday evening: An agreement with Loyola Marymount University's School of Education; the addition of turf surrounding the pool at the aquatics center; the continuation of GATE programs at elementary schools; a middle school field trip to Catalina Island; and an agreement with P.S. Arts to continue to perform the duties of District Arts Coordinator.

The next regularly scheduled Wiseburn School Board meeting is calendared for Thursday evening, Oct. 25. •

ORDINANCE 2159 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF HAWTHORNE, CALIFORNIA, ADOPTING A CATEGORICAL EXEMPTION UNDER THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACTANDAPPROVING CHANGE OF ZONE 2017CZ03 CHANGING THE ZONING MAP FOR PROPERTY LOCATED AT 11415 YORK AVENUE FROM THE Regional Commercial (CR) ZONE to the High Density Residential (R-3) ZONE AND MAKING FINDINGS IN PORT THEREOF

WHEREAS, on August 16, 2017, Tommy Murakoshi ("Applicant") filed a complete application requesting to change the zoning of a commercial property to residential in order to develop a viable use that is compatible with the surrounding neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, on August 16, 2017, the Applicant also filed a complete and concurrent application requesting approval of Conditional Use Permit 2017CU15 and Vesting Tentative Map 78256 for the purposes of developing four for-sale residential units; and
WHEREAS, Change of Zone 2017CZ03

would result in a change in the Zoning map from the Regional Commercial (CR) zone to the High Density Residential

zone (R-3) as shown on Exhibit 1 ("Project"); and WHEREAS, the Project applies to a 13,253 square foot property located at 11415 York Avenue, Assessor Parcel No. 4047-007-024 as

AVENUE, ASSESSO I FAICE INC. 4047-007-027-03 shown on Exhibit 1 ("Property"); and WHEREAS, final approval of the concurrent applications, Vesting Tentative Parcel Map 78256 and CUP 2017CU15, are contingent upon City Council approval of the Project; and WHEREAS, land use policies have an immediate and direct impact on economic activity and quality of life within the city; and

WHEREAS, the City of Hawthome seeks to establish a balanced and functional mix of development consistent with the long-range objectives and values of the City through the thoughtful implementation of the General Plan: and

WHEREAS, Goal 2 of the Land Use Element states that: "Every effort shall be made to ensure that both existing and future development will be and will remain compatible with surrounding desirable uses;" and

WHEREAS, Policy 2.1 of the Land Use Element states: "The design of future development shall consider the constraints and opportunities that are provided by adjacent existing development;" and

WHEREAS, Policy 2.2 of the Land Use Ele-

ment states: "The construction of very large buildings shall be discouraged where such structures are incompatible with surrounding residential development;" and

WHEREAS, the Property is currently zoned as Regional Commercial (CR) on the zoning map, as shown in Exhibit 2. This land use designation allows regional. freeway-oriented commercial development and is intended to accommodate land uses characterized by large amounts of visitors and traffic and requiring regional accessibility and visibility such as hotels. regional shopping centers, and large office complexes; and

WHEREAS, the Property is located at the end of York Avenue between 116th Street and where it cul-de-sacs against the I-105 Freeway. In this location, York Avenue is designated as a "local street" and only provides access to a residential neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, commercial development of the Property is infeasible due to the fact that it is not located on a commercial corridor, there is no feasible public access except through a residential neighborhood, the lack of public visibility, and the small size of the property (.3 acres); and

WHEREAS, the commercial development of the Property at the end of a residential cul-de-sac would be incompatible with the surrounding residential neighborhood in terms of use, scale, noise, odors, and illumination. In addition, commercial traffic would have to access the property through a residential neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, the Project would allow for residential development of the Property, which would allow development similar to the residential character of land uses located along

WHEREAS, for the foregoing reasons, the Project is consistent with Goal 2 and Policies 2.1 and 2.2 of the Land Use Element of the

City's General Plan; and WHEREAS, pursuant to HMC 17.10.050, the City may amend the boundaries of the zoning map and these changes shall be made by ordinance; and

WHEREAS, based upon the information received and Staff's review and assessment, the Project is determined not to have a significant impact on the environment and is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15305; and

WHEREAS, the City provided published notice of a public hearing on May 3, 2018, and the Planning Commission held a duly noticed public hearing on the Project on June 6, 2018 and recommended approval of the Project; and WHEREAS, the City provided published notice of a public hearing on June 14, 2018, and the City Council held a duly noticed public hearing on the Project on June 26, 2018; and

WHEREAS, on June 26, 2018, the City Council enied the Project; and WHEREAS, on September 11, 2018, the

City Council directed that the Project be reconsidered; and WHEREAS, the City provided published

notice of a public hearing on September 13, 2018, and the City Council held a duly noticed public hearing on the Project on September 25, 2018; and

WHEREAS, at the public hearing on September 25, 2018, evidence was heard and presented from all persons in favor of the application, from all persons opposed to the application, and from members of the City staff; and that the City Council having heard and received all of said evidence, testimony, and statements and being fully informed of the application hereby approves Ordinance 2159 approving Change of Zone Application 2017CZ03.
THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY

OF HAWTHORNE HEREBY FINDS DETERMINES, RESOLVES, AND OR-DAINS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The City Council finds that all of the facts set forth in the recitals of this Resolution are true and correct. SECTION 2. The City Council considered the proposed change to the City of Hawthome General Plan Map and Change of Zone which constitute a project within the scope of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and the City's CEQA Guideli The City Council has determined that the proposed Project is exempt from review under CEQA. Pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15305, this Project is covered by a Class 5 Project (Minor Alternations in Land Use Limitations) Categorical Exemption for actions that do not change the land uses allowed on areas of slopes greater than 20% and do not change allowable land uses in a manner that could create a potentially significant impact on the environment. The Project would change the zoning on flat land and will allow residential development consistent with current land uses in the vicinity. The approval of this Project will not result in cumulative adverse environmental impacts or

any other potentially significant impact described in State CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2. The Project is therefore exempt from the provisions of CEQA. Upon City Council's action, Staff will file the Notice of Exemption with the Los Angeles County Clerk's office in compliance with CEQA.

SECTION 3. The City Council finds that the Project is consistent with the following goals

and policies of the General Plan:

1. Goal 2 of the Land Use Element states that "Every effort shall be made to ensure that both existing and future development will be and will remain compatible with surrounding desirable uses;" and 2. Policy 2.1 of the Land Use Element states:

"The design of future development shall consider the constraints and opportunities that are provided by adjacent existing development," and 3. Policy 2.2 of the Land Use Element states The construction of very large buildings shall be discouraged where such structures are incompatible with surrounding residential development," and

4. The Project would change the commercial zoning of the property to a residential zoning that would be consistent with the surrounding neighborhood and one that would be appropri for the limited access, size, and visibility of the Property. In doing so, the surrounding residential neighborhood would be protected from the intrusion of commercial traffic, noise, odors, and activity that a commercial project

could bring.

SECTION 4. Based on its independent judgment and analysis, the City Council hereby approves Change of Zone 2017CZ03 to change the zoning designation for the Property from the Regional Commercial (CR) zone to the High Density Residential zone (R-3) as shown on Exhibit 2.

SECTION 5. The documents and other materials that constitute the record of the proceedings upon which the City Council's approval are based, which include, but are not limited to, the staff reports for the Project and all of the materials that support the staff reports for the Project, are located in the office of the Planning Director and the City Clerk of the City of Hawthorne, at 4455 West 126th Street, Houthorne, Colliforia (2020) Hawthorne, California 90250.

SECTION 6. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Ordinance and shall forward a copy to the City Manager and City Attorney.


