Inglewood City Council Agrees To Issue Tax-Exempt Revenue Bonds by CalPFA

With no comments from residents in attendance during the scheduled public hearing on Tuesday, members of the Inglewood City Council and the Mayor voted to adopt a resolution approving the issuance of tax-exempt revenue bonds by the California Public Finance Authority (CalPFA).

The approved resolution will allow the City of Inglewood to issue one, or a series of, tax-exempt bonds worth no more than \$17 million, which are to be used for the acquisition of a rental housing property at 510 and 512 Centinela Avenue. In order to be in compliance with state and federal law, the City was mandated to conduct a TEFRA public hearing prior to issuing any bonds. According to the staff report, these bonds are considered limited obligations of CalPFA and are to be paid in full by the borrower. "TEFRA stands for the Tax Equity and Fiscal Responsibility Act of 1982, which states that the public has the authority to be heard prior to the issuance of tax exempt bonds," said Acting HUD Programs Manager Harjinder Sing. "It is important to stress that the City is in no way responsible for the payment of these bonds, as they are solely the responsibility of borrower, Good Shepherd Home Preservation." CalPFA was established by the State of California as a political subdivision under the Joint Powers Act for the sole purpose of issuing tax-exempt bonds to both public and private entities. However, the law prohibits CalPFA from issuing bonds for any project that has not first conducted a TEFRA public hearing, in addition to obtaining permission from the

governing body for the jurisdiction where the property is located.

The staff report signed by Sing and City Manager Artie Fields describes CalPFA as being "empowered to promote economic, cultural and community development opportunities that create temporary and permanent jobs, affordable housing, community infrastructure and improve the overall quality of life in local communities." In January of this year, CalPFA financed the Pacific Rim Apartments in the City of Inglewood. CalPFA is also responsible for providing a 10 percent annual payment of the

City's administrative fees.

Good Shepherd Homes Apartments (the project's name), which the bonds will fund, is a 70-unit, senior-multifamily rental housing complex owned by Good Shepherd Homes Preservation, L.P. With the funds, Good Shepherd Homes will be capable of acquiring and rehabilitating the complex and in turn provide local senior residents with additional affordable housing units.

"Staff recommends that the bonds be issued

El Camino, Northrop Grumman to Sponsor "Global Innovation Summit"

The El Camino College Industry & Technology Division is partnering with Northrop Grumman Aerospace Systems (NGAS) to sponsor an exciting morning of innovation, science and creativity.

The Northrop Grumman Global Innovation Summit is an intern and student demonstration activity similar to a live-action video game. The summit is scheduled for 9 a.m. to noon July 28 in El Camino College's Murdock Stadium. The event is free and open to the public--everyone is encouraged to attend!

Five teams of ECC/Hawthorne High School students and Northrop Grumman interns will battle together to save the world from simulated wildfires ravaging the planet. They'll accomplish this feat using RC planes, quad copters, and rovers (with silly string!) they have spent their summer designing, building and flying.

"This is a great opportunity for our students to incorporate their technical skills and critical thinking, along with communication and teamwork," said El Camino College Industry & Technology Division Dean Stephanie Rodriguez.

One of Northrop Grumman's initiatives to encourage STEM education across the globe, the event is designed to bring student teams together to solve problems.

"The NG mentor team noticed that while many schools and workplaces focus on teaching technical skills, what often is the pivotal factor is the ability communicate and work as a team," said Katie Halmagean, NGAS aerospace engineer and demonstration program lead. "We constructed a fun project with technical challenges, yet it requires collaboration, rapid innovation and creativity from all five teams to succeed."

At the summit, wildfires will be represented with six-foot-tall fabric flames on a football field-sized map of the world. Each vehicle has a critical and unique role to extinguish the fires, as each of the teams use technology, and above all, cooperation, to support this simulated disaster relief.

Airport Board Approves Projects Connecting All Nine Terminals Beyond Security Screening

Los Angeles Board of Airport Commissioners (BOAC) this month approved a project to modernize Terminals 2 and 3, as well as connect them to the Tom Bradley International Terminal (TBIT). The group also voted in favor of a lease agreement with Southwest Airlines for a new building (Terminal 1.5) that will include a connector between Terminals 1 and 2, as well as space for additional ticket counters, baggage carousels, a bus gate and an additional Security Screening Check Point.

BOAC took a number of actions as it approved the Terminal 2 and 3 Modernization Project, including certification of the Final Environmental Impact Report and adoption of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Findings of Fact, the Staatement of Overriding Considerations and the Mitigation and Monitoring Reporting Program (MMRP). The commissioners also recommended that the Los Angeles City Council concur with their actions. Delta Air Lines plans to invest as much as \$1.9 billion in the modernization, which would include upgrading the Terminal 2 concourse, demolition and reconstruction of the Terminal 3 concourse building, demolition of the southern appendages of the Terminal 3 satellite, and demolition and reconstruction of the passenger and baggage processing facilities (ticketing buildings). According to the environmental impact statement, reconfiguration of the gates

as part of the projects could add as many as four gates between the two terminals.

The BOAC also approved two actions related to Southwest Airlines, amending its Terminal Delta Air Lines' plan for Terminals 2 and 3 includes a connector to the Tom Bradley International Terminal Facility Lease and License Agreement for space in Terminal 1 while approving a new lease for the future Terminal 1.5.

The new building is a 417,515-square-foot, six-level facility that will span the gap between Terminals 1 and 2, and require demolition of Gate 10 in Terminal 1. In addition to providing space for baggage claims, ticket counters, a Security Screening Check Point, and two floors of office space, the building will connect Terminals 1 and 2. There will be connections between the non-secured areas of the terminals on the Lower/Arrivals and Upper/Departures levels, while the connection on the Concourse Level will be on the secured side of the building, allowing passengers to more easily transfer between the terminals. Terminal 1.5, estimated to cost \$490 million and expected to open in 2020, will also include a vertical circulation core to connect it to the future Automated People Mover, and feature a bus gate that will allow Southwest Airlines to transport passengers to TBIT for international flights. • - Content: Abridged from LAWA Press Release



- 1 pound pizza dough

- 1 cup cherry tomatoes halved, tossed with extra virgin olive oil, salt and pepper
- 1/4 cup thick chunks of ham
- sea salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 4 eggs
- Parmesan cheese, to taste



Preparation

- **1.** About 30 minutes before baking the pizza, preheat the oven to 500 F and place a large, rimless baking sheet in the lower third of the oven; for the most even cooking and optimal heat distribution. Place a large sheet of parchment paper on a work surface and dust the parchment lightly with flour. Stretch dough using hands or rolling pin. Pierce the dough firmly all over with the tines of a fork.
- **2.** Slide pizza with parchment onto a baking sheet, then slide it onto the hot rimless baking sheet in the oven.
- **3.** When the dough is slightly puffed, at about 7 minutes, take out of oven and spread on pesto mixture, top with mozzarella cheese, cherry tomatoes, Parmesan and ham. Place back in oven for another 3 minutes until cheese is melted. Slide pizza out, crack four eggs (one on each quarter of pizza), place back in oven and broil for about 4 minutes or until egg cooks to over easy.
- **4.** Grab the edge of the parchment and transfer the pizza from the oven to a cutting board. Drop ricotta cheese by rounded teaspoonful over top, sprinkle with salt and pepper. cut and serve.





Staff Directed to Set Parameter for Social Media Policy

In a 5-0 vote, the Mayor and City Council agreed to provide staff direction to establish the foundation for a social media policy for City employees and the general public regarding public outreach, communication and information. "The City's goal is to use social media sites, such as Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, YouTube, etc., to distribute information to the public about City events and services in order to foster community engagement and civic participation," states the staff report. "Accordingly, the City has a substantial interest in protecting the integrity of its social media sites and any content posted on such sites."

Through direction from City Manager Artie Fields, the Video and Social Media Manager was to establish a social media presence. Through collaboration with the legal department, a social media policy has been drafted and presented to every City department with each encouraged to provide input. With all input considered, the staff was able to present a policy that dictates a general and content policy. In an effort to address concerns regarding employee time

spent on social media-related activities, Fields suggested that each department assign a liaison to handle all social media activities.

In the content policy, the City claims full "permission or rights to any content posted by the City, including photographs and videos." In addition, the City claims the right to implement or remove the functionality of its social media sites, including the ability of people to post comments. The policy mandates that official City business cannot be discussed on comment threads, but if a City official or employee responds to a comment it is their responsibility to provide their name and job title. However, no City official or employee will be forced to share personal information and it is prohibited for any City official or employee to disclose personal information of coworkers and colleagues. All policy guidelines are available in the social media policy, which can be obtained on the City's website.

"Content published on these sites will be information for the public about City events and services in order to foster community engagement and civic participation," states the staff report. "Under the direction of the City Manager, the VSM Manager will be responsible for the content that is published to its social media sites." •





Should Los Angeles Football Fans Choose the Rams as Their Team?

Since the Rams packed up their bags and headed west for Los Angeles, it has been no secret that they have failed to incite excitement within their newfound fan base. A far cry from "The Greatest Show on Turf" that used to call St. Louis home, the Los Angeles Rams have been subpar so far, to say the least. Whether it has been management moves, coaching decisions, or simply just a roster full of bad players, the Rams debuted in Los Angeles with a 4-12 season last year, failing to excite a city that has been salivating for football ever since the Rams (and the Raiders) left after the 1994 regular season. This year's Rams team is obviously still not a Super Bowl contender. They should be better, however, and in doing so will manage to give Los Angeles fans more of a reason to feel proud to enjoy football once again.

Last year's Rams fan base crowded the Coliseum in Los Angeles for many reasons, but none of those reasons were because the Rams were actually good at football. Whether it was because it was the first year that the game was back in L.A. or simply because Sundays are meant for watching the NFL, Los Angeles had the second best home attendance in the entire league last season. Ineffectiveness has its own way of keeping fans away, especially when a second team (the Chargers) makes itself available to the masses and moves into the area. Rams fans shouldn't scare easily, though, because this year's team plans on being much better the second time around. This year's Rams roster could boast as many as 10 new starters when the NFL season begins. Those new starters will be most easily recognized on the offensive side of the ball and specifically under center. Though quarterback Jared Goff eventually made a few starts once head coach Jeff Fisher got fired, he didn't start the season as the main signal-caller of the team. This year should bring with it added responsibility for Goff, which will either make or break the quarterback's future with

the team. Goff was in an awkward spot last season with uncertainty surrounding the entire organization and a cross-country move that had just taken place. This year, Goff is in charge and it's time for the former number one overall pick the in draft to take control of the franchise.

Not only will many of the starters be new to the team, but Sean McVay is entering his first year as a head coach in the NFL. McVay has tabbed new wide receiver Robert Wood as a perfect fit for his offensive system. Woods used to play at USC, so at least he'll be used to the scenery. He has yet to catch more than 65 passes in a season, but seems destined to do so in his first year in Los Angeles.

The Rams also beefed up their offensive line this offseason, which was a major liability one season ago. Look for Toddy Gurley and the running game to become much better this year than last with the additions of left tackle Andrew Whitworth and center John Sullivan. Rookie wide receiver Cooper Kupp and second-year tight end Tyler Higbee will also look to add depth to a passing game that lost Kenny Britt, but still looked absolutely anemic last year on the football field. On the defensive side of the ball the Rams have welcomed in outside linebacker Connor Barwin, who most recently played with the Philadelphia Eagles but had his best season in Houston under new Rams defensive coordinator Wade Phillips. Phillips is also bringing over Kayvon Webster from the Denver Broncos to compete with E.J. Gaines for the starting spot at cornerback opposite Trumaine Johnson. Any addition to a defense that is already lethal and features the likes of Aaron Donald and Robert Quinn is a good move. The defensive side of the ball won't necessarily be a problem that the Rams will struggle with this season. It was no question that the Rams needed to shake things up on the roster after a four-win season in a very competitive NFC West division. Los Angeles has done its part to strengthen the roster with new coaches

McVay and Phillips plus a relatively new offensive line. That same offensive line is what will be instrumental to the team's success and Goff's growth as an NFL quarterback. As the line goes, so goes Gurley, the running game and Goff--with what little passing attack he presumably has. New players don't necessarily mean more wins for the Rams. A starting job for Goff doesn't mean that he'll necessarily be good either. But a fresh start for everyone involved should only help to improve what was an agonizing second half of the season last year.

The Rams are 13 years removed from the playoffs and 14 years removed from their last winning season. Now is the time to show that they are on course for a future playoff appearance. The team may not have what it takes to beat out their divisional opponents this season, but they can certainly begin to make a mark on the league and on the city of Los Angeles before another team bolts in and steals their thunder. • - Asixlion@earthlink.net
