Healthy Budget Shaping Up for Lawndale

The mid-year budget report found the City of Lawndale in good shape, as Director of Finance Ken Louie reported on positive adjustments to the general fund at Monday's meeting of the Lawndale City Council. Louie said the City has taken in \$279,000 in unplanned revenue, including motor vehicle, encroachment and planning and building fees. Salary savings in unfilled positions within the City and Sheriff's Department have netted another \$173,000 in unspent general funds.

The Council approved policy changes on the use of parks and recreation facilities. The action cancels open space permits, revokes the use of jumpers and bouncers in all parks, and requires groups of over 100 to have security through the county police department. The action also changes the fee structure: instead of 100 percent up front, reservations will now require a 25 percent non-refundable fee. Reservations will still be taken for athletic fields and space in the Lawndale Community Center. Monday's vote was unanimous, with Councilmember Jim Osborne absent.

Community Services Director Mike Estes explained the action separates out the policies governing parks from those of the Community Center. "In 2012, when the Community Center opened, the policies were combined. We've had several new facilities open since," said Estes. "Now we are working on a new Community Center

policy."

In the public safety report, the attending officer gave an overview of bullying on school campuses, citing the national statistic that 28 percent of sixth to 12th grade students report being bullied at school. The officer cautioned parents to look for signs of harassment and injury and to question their school-aged kids about relationships at school.

Library Manager Jose Parra reported the Helping Hands project was a success. He said the youth group created prosthetic hands to donate to underdeveloped countries. Helping Hands donated a 3-D printer to the library. Parra noted programming for Black History Month will include a mask-making workshop on Feb. 20. On Feb. 21, the library will sponsor a drum circle and a jobs skills workshop.

Steve Koonz reported on traffic violations and drug activity. Marge Heineman asked the Council to consider getting another code enforcement officer. She cited a stalled car on Inglewood Avenue that snarled traffic for several hours.

Sam Pena, formerly of Republic Services, announced he has accepted the position of executive vice-president with the Inglewood/LAX Chamber of Commerce. He thanked the Council for his 10-year stint as municipal relations manager. "It was a great partnership. It never felt like work," said Pena.

"In your job, you have to become a part of the city. Sam, you've done that," said

Mayor Robert Pullen-Miles. Republic Services provides recycling and trash and solid waste collection for the city. It sponsors an annual Bucks for Bulk contest.

In his new post, Pena said he hopes to also promote business in Lawndale. The mayor thanked Pena for his service and commitment to the city. "You understand economic development and business retention," said Pullen-Miles. "We do welcome collaboration with the City of Inglewood."

The consent calendar was passed unanimously, after discussion on two items. Item #4, a proposal for a natural gas station for city vehicles, was tabled. Initial planning costs are estimated at over \$50,000. City Manager Steve Mandoki noted that staff drive over two hours to fill up their service vehicles. Councilmember Pat Kearney suggested waiting to see if state funding grants would be available in the future.

Pullen-Miles asked that the Lawndale Rotary Club be added to the list of non-profit vendors approved to sell Fourth of July fireworks. Mandoki said the matter could be brought back at the next meeting, but the organization has missed the application meeting and deadline before.

The Lawndale City Council meets every first and third Monday, unless otherwise noted. As the President's holiday will fall on Feb. 19, the next meeting of the Lawndale City Council is Tuesday, Feb. 20, at 6:30 p.m., in the Lawndale City Hall Council Chambers at 14717 Burin Ave. •

Film Review

The Original Story of the Irreverent National Lampoon Finally Gets Its Due

While you've likely heard the name National Lampoon, or may count *Caddyshack* or *Animal House* to be among your favorite movies, do you know who Doug Kenney is? Until now, Kenney – the comedy genius who co-created National Lampoon – has remained mostly unknown, while the comedians who were launched from it (among them Bill Murray, Gilda Radner and Chevy Chase) have come to overshadow Kenney's own fame. The new movie, *A Futile and Stupid Gesture* (now streaming on Netflix) highlights the life of Kenney and the wild rise of this new school of comedy. Both a silly send-up as well as a sentimental tribute, *Futile* is sure to delight both the purist comedy nerds looking to get their history fix of the birth of National Lampoon as well as those just looking for some low-stakes laughs.

Based on the novel of the same name by Josh Karp, the story begins back in Doug's (Will Forte) undergrad years at Harvard, where he meets fellow wisecracking slacker Henry Beard (Domhnall Gleeson). Together, the duo would create the first iteration of the Lampoon – a comedy collective that was "really just an excuse to party." It's Kenney who wants to keep the party going post-graduation, convincing the more levelheaded Beard to create a national magazine of their irreverent comedy for all juveniles. As it turns out, there was a counterculture of college-aged kids waiting to embrace a publication like this, whose shocking magazine covered politics and culture through raunchy comics and cheeky nudity.

It's around this time in the movie that we start to meet the people who would form National Lampoon's original writing staff (Thomas Lennon, Natasha Lyonne, Tony Hendra). One of the hilarious devices that *A Futile and Stupid Gesture* utilizes is a clever use of meta-awareness, especially when it comes to commenting on the actors who are playing the real-life comedians of Christmas past. It's this level of self-reflexive non-seriousness that director David Wain (*Wet Hot American Summer*) wonderfully incorporates into the movie, which conjures the anarchic and playful spirit of the Lampoon and back into the movie itself.

As a biography movie, Wain does service to both Kenney and the story by hitting every

major milestone of the Lampoon's successes and wobbly setbacks, straddling the balance of funny and worry. The flighty Kenney moves on to bigger and grander ideas: a National Lampoon radio hour, which introduces new players Bill Murray (Jon Daly), John Belushi (John Gemberling) and Chevy Chase (Joel McHale), who would go on to star in such films like *Animal House* and *Caddyshack*.

It's around this time that *A Futile and Stupid Gesture* explores Kenney's darker period. It doesn't shy away from showing his crippling anxiety and growing competition (a certain late-night weekend sketch show is accused of stealing all of his players). But not to bring down the mood, as Wain and Kenney and the rest of his wild team would surely object if they felt their story was getting too sentimental. Adding further delight to the movie is a smattering of visual sequences that bring iconic Lampoon magazine covers to life right before our eyes. If Wain was attempting to tell the purest and most honest form of Kenney's story, then he wildly succeeded. If he was looking to make a silly, wacky comedy with a little bit of heart for audiences everywhere, then he did that too. With *A Futile and Stupid Gesture*, we finally see the merry madness that Doug Kenney went through in search of a laugh – however futile and stupid it may have seemed.

Buckle Up for the New Passenger Economy

(BPT) - A hundred years ago, few thought that the clunky automobile that broke down so often would ever replace a horse. In the 1970s, people wondered if the personal computer that a few eccentrics were using would have any use beyond storing recipes. It's safe to say that these innovations, along with many of the technologies we now use daily, were once considered impossible dreams.

Right now, the most-talked-about piece of technological innovation that is poised to transform our lives is the autonomous or self-driving car. As self-driving cars gain widespread adoption, analysts are predicting the rise of what is known as the passenger economy - a term coined by Intel - that is expected to be worth \$7 trillion by 2050 as validated in a new report by analyst firm Strategy Analytics.

The following are five big areas of opportunity that will unfold in the passenger economy era.

Time will be on people's side. One of the most obvious benefits of a self-driving car is the amount of time it frees up. Drivers become passengers, and so will be able to concentrate on other tasks. Not only will people be able to work or watch a movie on their way to work, but the commute itself will be shorter, since traffic congestion will become a thing of the past. With smarter analytics, it's estimated that by 2050, the widespread use of autonomous cars will free up over 250 million hours of commute time per year in the most congested cities. With self-driving cars, we are poised to

see powerful new opportunities that deliver personalized messages to consumers. For instance, algorithms can compute routes and route history to hone in on passengers with specific onboard advertisements from surrounding businesses or attractions. This could be a huge boost to local businesses and will be much more effective than the primitive billboard. Mobility-as-a-service. Imagine ordering take-out, or having your groceries or a package of diapers come to your door via a driverless car. This is something that we're likely to see fairly soon. Shipping and freight companies, local delivery services and internet giants will make use of autonomous vehicles to transport goods across the country. These types of services will likely generate \$3 trillion in revenues by 2050. New business models. Today, many companies offer perks such as work-from-home days or the option for people to leave the office to work in a cafe or wherever is most suitable for them. In the not-too-distant future, the workplace will further transform as the commute evolves. The self-driving car will blend with the office, turning the commute into a productive part of the workday. In turn, this will allow people to go home earlier and spend more time with their families. The advent of the passenger economy will contribute to a safer and more efficient world. Those who can imagine and anticipate the coming changes will be in the best position to get the most out of it. •

Trade of Griffin Signals End for Clippers

If being a fan of the Los Angeles Lakers has taught anyone anything over the course of the past few years, it's that if you're not going to field a competitive team, at least try to field an entertaining one. Perhaps it's fitting to begin an article about Blake Griffin and the Los Angeles Clippers by talking about the Lakers. The Lakers have, incidentally, always been L.A.'s team, no matter how much relative success the Clippers have gained. With the trade of Griffin to the Detroit Pistons just over one week ago, the Clippers did once again what the Clippers seemingly always tend to do – shoot themselves in the theoretical foot. Now, a team that was already struggling to compete in a loaded Western Conference not only just got worse, but also lost the face of the franchise that a dwindling Clipper fan base still came to the Staples Center to see.

First it was Chris Paul and now Blake Griffin? After Griffin signed a five-year contract for \$173 million in July, it was clear that the Clippers were trying to make a statement. Griffin would be the face of the franchise not only now, but also in the years to come. Well, somebody in the organization changed his mind and it caught Griffin off guard just as much as it caught fans of the NBA off guard. "Basketball is a business, the NBA is a business and they made a decision," Griffin told ESPN after finding out that he had been traded by Clippers through Twitter. "The only thing, I just wish I had known or had the opportunity to talk to somebody beforehand.

Finding out through Twitter, through other people, is a tough way to find out when you've been with a franchise for so long."

Well, that's the Clippers for you and now, besides DeAndre Jordan and maybe Lou Williams, the rest of the roster is somewhat unrecognizable. That's before the likes of Avery Bradley, Tobias Harris and Boban Marjanovic arrived through the trade. Those players and first and second round draft picks were all part of the return for the Clippers, who fittingly lost their first game after the trade to the Portland Trailblazers. It's rather difficult to evaluate trades in the NBA these days, but as of last weekend the Clippers were positioned narrowly outside of playoff contention in the Western Conference standings with now seemingly little hope of ascending up the ranks.

Even with Griffin on their side – and Chris Paul, for that matter – the Clippers weren't getting anywhere near sniffing the competitive levels of the Golden State Warriors, Cleveland Cavaliers or even the San Antonio Spurs. Likely, that was the main reason in the team's front office changing its philosophy so hastily. Whether the pieces that the Clippers received in return for Griffin pan out or not, getting a team to take on the humungous salary that was given to Los Angeles's former first round pick less than a year ago opens things up, if you're an optimist. Now, the Clippers have enough cap space to go out and sign LeBron James, Paul George or any other big-name free agent

in the offseason. With that flexibility, it may not be long before the team returns back to the rim-rocking "Clip City" team of years past that formerly (almost) filled the arena to capacity on a night-in and night-out basis.

The one flaw in that reasoning or philosophy change comes in understanding the fact that most, if not all, big-name free agents who want to come play in Los Angeles will likely choose to play for the Lakers (who will also have enormous amounts of cap space) instead of the Clippers. Unfortunately for the Clippers, aside from Jerry West now having some unknown role in the front office, there is nothing alluring about the team. Sure, unloading an injury-prone player in Griffin who was owed a ton of money may have been the best thing that the Clippers could have done from a business perspective. From a fan and team perspective, however, the move could have just locked the Clippers into becoming a team that will now be stuck in mediocrity for years to come.

Speaking of mediocrity, ever since the Pistons beat the Lakers in the 2004 NBA Finals, the former team has failed in multiple attempts to set the rest of the league on fire. In this latest attempt, it is clear that the Pistons received the best player in the trade, but even in a less talented Eastern Conference, Griffin's arrival may fail to do more than move Detroit up a spot or two in the standings to the eighth seed, at best. While the Pistons may not all of a sudden transform into a championship team overnight,

though, they'll at least have a player who is worthy of putting fans in the seats.

As it currently stands, Clipper fans are clinging to optimism and cite Jerry West as their savior. Hopes filled with Paul George and LeBron chants ring eternal. George did, after all, root for the Clippers as a child, right? But why play in a dimly-lit Staples Center on Clippers game nights when you could don the purple and gold and have movie stars from all over Hollywood in the stands watching your every move under the bright lights of "La La Land?" Why go out of your way to say that Jerry West will save the day when just down the hallway, Magic Johnson is showcasing that bright-eyed smile and the promise of "Showtime" returning to the Staples Center floor as he stands in front of 16 polished and glistening championship trophies?

Now that all of the dust from the trade that caught everyone off guard has officially settled, Clippers fans can continue banking on the future. That's what true fans do. An increased amount of cap space now brings with it the hope and opportunity of landing a prized free agent to come and represent the Los Angeles Clippers. With that hope better also come faith that the Clippers can do something that the franchise has seemingly never done before, even with Griffin in Paul sporting the logo across their chests. That one thing the team has never done is succeed. •

The tweet has since been deleted, but Ryan put out in the Twittersphere that, "A secretary at a public high school in Lancaster, Pennsylvania said she was pleasantly surprised her pay went up \$1.50 a week...she said [that] will more than cover her Costco membership for the year." While it is not surprising that Ryan has since deleted his words, it is infuriating to know that this lawmaker who earns \$223,500 wants to come out and comment on a worker's \$1.50 weekly increase in pay. He wants to tell us how great that is for the worker and the economy. The man is out of touch with reality. He is delusional if he really believes that a \$1.50 raise is going to improve anyone's lifestyle.

If Ryan wants to lower the standard for a better life at being able to afford Costco membership, then how little does he think of our nation? Let's do Ryan's math: A \$1.50 raise a week, multiplied by 52 weeks in a year, will total \$78 a year. With 78 extra dollars, how can anyone improve their quality of life? What big-ticket item that will stimulate the economy can a person buy with an additional \$78 a year? What type of investment can a worker make with \$78 that can provide some financial security? None. There are no viable options with that amount of money. That might be one-week worth of groceries, but it

does not improve the living conditions for the worker. Personally, I would rather keep paying that extra \$78 each year so that the low-cost clinic that saved my life can stay open. The extra \$78 will be of greater benefit to the senior citizen who's waiting on his Meals-On-Wheels delivery. I'm not losing my Costco membership without that money, but many people will be losing their community resources because some weasel in Washington who earns more than \$200,000 a year wants to "save" a receptionist \$78 a year.

As frustrating as Ryan's tweet is, there is nothing surprising about his out-of-touch comments. Spend Next New Year's Eve with New Horizons

Joint Press Release from NASA, Johns Hopkins University, and Southwest Research Institute, Provided by Bob Eklund

The New Year's celebration to usher in 2019 will include an event like no other—more than four billion miles from Earth.

In a little under a year—shortly after midnight Eastern Time on Jan. 1, 2019—NASA's New Horizons spacecraft will buzz by the most primitive and most distant object ever explored. New Horizons' encounter with Kuiper Belt object 2014 MU69, which orbits a billion miles beyond Pluto, will offer the first close-up look at such a pristine building block of the solar system—and will be performed in a region of deep space that was practically unknown just a generation ago.

"The Voyagers and Pioneers flew through the Kuiper Belt at a time when we didn't know this region existed," said Jim Green, director of NASA's Planetary Science Division at Headquarters in Washington. "New Horizons is on the hunt to understand these objects, and we invite everyone to ring in the next year with the excitement of exploring the unknown."

"Our flyby of MU69 on New Year's Eve and New Year's Day 2019 will be an exciting sequel to the historic exploration New Horizons performed at Pluto in 2015," added Alan Stern, New Horizons principal investigator from Southwest Research Institute (SwRI) in Boulder, Colorado. "Nothing even like MU69

has ever been explored before."

As with the hundreds of thousands of other small worlds in this zone of icy bodies, MU69 is shrouded in mystery. In fact, the all we know about it has come from the Hubble Space Telescope (used to discover the object

in 2014) and a comprehensive observation campaign last summer, in which the New Horizons team gathered data on MU69 as it passed in front of three stars. Those observations indicated that MU69 could be two objects, perhaps accompanied by a moon.

"That tells us this object is going to have a lot of surprises in store for New Horizons," said Marc Buie, the New Horizons science team member from SwRI who led the observation campaign. "We're going to see something that dates back to the formation of the solar system."

New Horizons will fly about three times closer to MU69 than it did to Pluto in July 2015, allowing the spacecraft's cameras to provide a more detailed look at the object's surface. Project Scientist Hal Weaver, of the Johns Hopkins Applied Physics Laboratory (APL) in Laurel, Maryland, pointed out that New Horizons' vantage point from about 2,175 miles from MU69 will allow it spot details about the size of a basketball court.

"Combining images with the measurements we make of the composition of and environment around MU69, should teach us a great deal about objects like MU69 that built dwarf planets like Pluto," Weaver said.

The MU69 flyby is the centerpiece of the current New Horizons extended mission that also includes observations of more than two-dozen other Kuiper Belt objects, as well as measurements of the plasma, gas and dust environment of the Kuiper Belt. "This post-Pluto mission is a complete and comprehensive exploration of the Kuiper Belt," said Alice Bowman, New Horizons mission operations manager, also from APL. "The spacecraft is collecting data out there throughout each year while the mission team works together to plan and shape the MU69 flyby." •
