Council Appoints Youth Advisory Committee Members

The Lawndale City Council reviewed the applications submitted by 11 interested parties to serve on the Youth Advisory Committee, which was formed in October 2013. The reappointments of several of the original members were the first orders of business in this agenda item, as the formation of the Committee was completed well after the City Council approved the committee. Students from 6th to 12th grade, who are residents of Lawndale, are eligible to apply and upon appointment serve the city for a one-year term that begins each October 1 and ends on September 30. Appointees are: Kiara Cuevas, Sandy Garcia, and Karina Reyes (12th grade, Lawndale High School); Sarah Gomez and Kaleb Hofner (7th and 6th grade, respectively, Jane Addams Middle School); Katelyn Maheia (9th grade, Wildwood High School); Emily Vargas (10th grade, Environmental Charter High).

The City Council presented a plaque to Otis Ginoza, who has served as the Deputy City Manager since 2005, to honor his retirement from the city of Lawndale on October 2. Ginoza was lauded for his dedication and his abilities to train his staff in many aspects of the running of the city, preparing for any new position they may seek.

Residents were reminded about the end of the semi-annual Clean-Up Week on September 21 and that the City Yard at 4722 Manhattan Beach Boulevard will be open on Saturday, September 20 from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. to accept large items, electronic waste, and anything else the residents want to drop off that they did not sell at a garage/yard sale. Garage and/or yard sales do NOT need a permit this Saturday, September 20. No hazardous waste will be accepted however. In addition,

the Volunteer Clean-Up event will be held on Saturday, September 20, beginning at the Der Wienerschnitzel, 14900 Hawthorne Blvd. at 9 a.m. Volunteers will be sent out to clean up as many areas around the city and be treated to a free hot dog and soda. Parents are encouraged to bring their children and educate them on the effects of keeping their city clean and the importance of volunteering for your community.

The public safety report included the arrest of a male burglar who was caught climbing through a bedroom window at a residence on Inglewood Avenue and was detained by the Sheriff's Deputies when he was leaving the residence through the main door. Also, a suspect who failed to make a Stop at a posted sign at 156th Street and Freeman Avenue was subsequently arrested for possession of marijuana, driving with a suspended license, and having \$4,000 worth of stolen electronic musical equipment in his vehicle.

Lt. John Hocking, from the Lawndale Service Center of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department introduced the two new deputies assigned to Lawndale as special assignment officers. Deputy Gabriela Nidro and Deputy Barbara Weingert have worked for the Sheriff's Department for nine and 13 years, respectively.

The Council heard a staff report on the need for a revision to the permit process for plumbing fixtures for existing residential and commercial buildings, which requires water-conserving fixtures to be used in replacement of old fixtures or when new buildings are constructed. Low-flush toilets and low-flow showerheads are currently on a self-certification process, with a report and receipts to be filed with the Building Department. As of January 1, 2017, as a result of California Senate Bill 407, all inspections will mandatorily require

water conservation fixtures. The city website will include the specifics of the new law for plumbing fixtures, including exemptions that do apply when it is just a maintenance matter or site work for other compliance issues.

Mayor Robert Pullen-Miles requested that the staff put a plan together including costs for a Lawndale Wall In Memoriam of those that have died and were volunteer contributors to the betterment of Lawndale.

The new state law regarding the requirement of vehicles to yield three feet to bicyclists on all streets, roads, freeways will be put on the city website to remind drivers. The new law went into effect on September 16.

The no left-hand turn at 162nd Street has resulted in Condon Avenue now being used as an "alternate" route by commuters. It was suggested that a patrol car be posted in that area on Inglewood Avenue to control the traffic. Sheriff's Department is continuing to patrol Hopper Park and monitor drug dealing and other violations being committed in and around the park.

A gang-related assault with a deadly weapon on September 2, on 147th Street and Prairie Avenue resulted in a positive identification of the suspects by the victims and an arrest and booking. On September 8, arrests were made of two suspects who had committed vandalism on several properties with tagging and spray painting. The suspects were discovered with the spray cans in their possession.

The mayor requested that the city website include information for filming scouts to contract with Lawndale to film commercials, television, and films throughout the city, especially marketing the Lawndale Community Center with photos of the exterior and interior, as well as other areas of the city, such as the painted retaining wall along the railroad tracks, etc. •

Inglewood Receives Residential Noise Mitigation Grant

Congresswoman Maxine Waters (CA-43) announced that the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) awarded a \$10 million grant to the City of Inglewood for residential noise mitigation. The grant extends funding for the City’s Residential Sound Insulation Program, which provides assistance to Inglewood families to mitigate the impact of noise from aircraft flying into and out of

Los Angeles International Airport (LAX). The grant may be used to provide residential noise mitigation for up to 480 dwellings in the City of Inglewood. 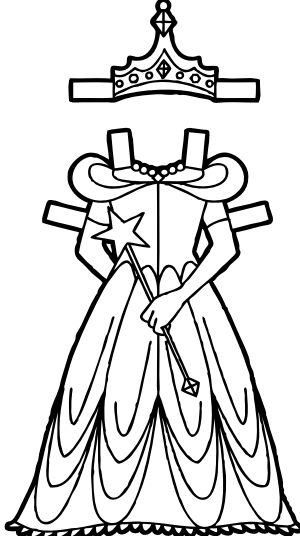
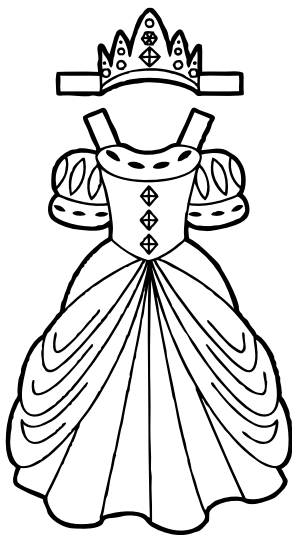
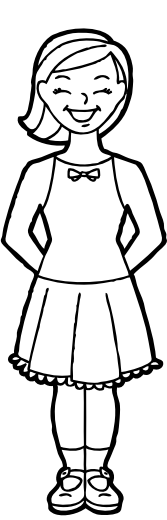

Wiseburn After-School Program Developing

The Wiseburn Unified School Board invited Wiseburn Child Development Center program director Melissa Coughlin to their September 11 meeting to share with the public a recap of the changes going on at the center and what’s in store for its future. It’s been just over a year since the Wiseburn Unified School District took over operations at the Wiseburn Child Development Center (WCDC), with the goal of providing low-cost, educationally appropriate summer and after-school programs. Superintendent Tom Johnstone said that while there have been a few complications with the center’s launch, most notably on tuition costs, the center has overall improved since the district’s takeover. “I think that there were a lot of challenges and a lot of growing pains during the first year,” said Johnstone. “But I’d also say that we’re doing outstanding over there, we are light-years ahead of where we were at this time two years ago. We are very happy.” One of the changes Coughlin shared were the changes to curriculum at the WCDC. She said the new lessons are research-based and line up more appropriately with what students are learning in the classroom during the school day. The more rigorous lessons are being supported by additional training for the staff. “Our teachers are getting great training,” said Coughlin. The WCDC has also been working on reaching out to new families. The center put out a new brochure touting their new programs, and Coughlin said the response has been positive. Currently the center is at full enrollment, and Coughlin hopes the advertisement will keep it that way. “We are pleased to say . . . we still have people waiting to get in. We are very successful,” said Coughlin. The center has been calibrating its performance by conducting parent surveys covering topics like satisfaction with WCDC staff, value of the programs offer, and educational quality. The results show that parents of students in the WCDC are pleased with what their children are doing. “I’m thrilled to say that out of a 1-5 rating we were close to 5 in every single mark. Our families are very happy,” said Coughlin. “One of the best parts of the survey results is when I see what parents would say in terms of whether they would recommend the program. Out of all of them, a vast majority said they would.” While the WCDC’s first year of operation has seen the center make a number of

changes, there are still more planned for the future. Coughlin said there are plans to continue making activities and lessons more academically based, along with possibly adding more technology, a book club and a newsletter to what the WCDC offers. However, this doesn’t mean that parents are unhappy with what the center is currently offering. “My favorite [response to the parent survey] was when asked what we could improve, one parent said ‘Nothing. You guys rock,’” said Coughlin. The board also heard from budget and accounting director David Wilson on the district’s new food service program. While it has only been in place for a few days, Wilson said it’s already received rave reviews. “Everyone is very pleased, they are over the moon about it,” said Wilson. One person who spoke up about how pleased she was with the program was Laura Sullivan, principal of Peter Burnett Elementary. She said she’s heard from students, parents, even custodians about the improvements in the new lunches. “My students are eating more and they aren’t wasting food,” said Sullivan. “They like the food. My custodians said they could tell because the trash is so much lighter. The parents are saying they want to eat there. It’s a good program.” Similarly, Ana Elementary’s principal Sarah Nitsos said the new meals are popular with her students and have been replacing unhealthy meals. “It’s really a huge hit,” said Nitsos. “It’s a tremendous improvement to see our children eating food that is healthy.” In addition to the new healthier menu, the new program involves changing how lunch is served. Dana Middle School principal Blake Silvers said his school’s single wrap-around lunch line has been converted into a number of individual lines. “It was surprisingly very effective,” said Silvers. “It was very natural. They just walk up and order their food, and the food is great.” However, the rollout wasn’t completely without issues. Wilson said some schools experienced long lunch line delays as both students and staff adjusted to the new lunch system. There were also some complaints that the containers for the mac and cheese weren’t able to contain the food, although Nitsos said she personally didn’t have any problems. Wilson said he expects to iron out these complications as the program continues. “We’ve had a couple hurdles,” said Wilson. “I think we are going to work out those details.” •

Don't Make These Common Mistakes When Something Hurts

(BPT) - Managing pain can be tough, whether you're one of the 100 million Americans with chronic pain, or only suffer from the occasional backache or headache. September is National Pain Awareness Month, the perfect time to make sure you're managing your pain the best way possible.

While many people can manage pain on their own, or can be helped by a primary care physician, those with unrelenting, challenging pain should consider seeing a pain medicine specialist.

"One of the biggest mistakes patients make is not visiting a pain medicine specialist such as a physician anesthesiologist when they experience persistent, complex pain," says Dr. Richard Rosenquist, chair of the American Society of Anesthesiologists (ASA) Committee on Pain Medicine and chairman of the Department of Pain Management in the Anesthesiology Institute at the Cleveland Clinic. "Physician anesthesiologists and other pain medicine specialists can fully assess a patient's pain and prescribe a treatment plan. This may incorporate medications, injections that can control pain for up to a year, spinal



cord stimulation, physical and psychological therapies and alternative therapies, such as acupuncture."

The ASA and its physician anesthesiologist members note these five mistakes patients in pain often make:

1. **Taking medication incorrectly.** Whether you're taking opioids (narcotics) for chronic

pain or an over-the-counter pain remedy such as ibuprofen for a sore back, don't take more than prescribed or recommended by the manufacturer. With prescription pain medication, taking more than directed can lead to addiction or even accidental overdose. It's critical to follow your physician's instructions carefully. If you're still in pain after taking the prescribed dose, contact your physician to discuss other pain relief options.

2. **Choosing the wrong medication.** Over-the-counter pain relievers can help you manage the pain of a sprained ankle or twisted knee without seeing a doctor. But choosing the right pain relief medication can depend on your health history. If you have liver problems or consume three or more alcoholic drinks a night, avoid acetaminophen which can cause liver damage. And anti-inflammatory pain relievers such as ibuprofen and naproxen can make high blood pressure and kidney disease worse, so ask your physician or a pharmacist for an alternative recommendation.

3. **Demanding an X-ray.** Studies show tests such as X-rays and MRIs do not do a good job of pinpointing the cause of pain. For

example, you might have pain, but nothing shows up on the image. And vice versa - sometimes things show up on X-rays that aren't causing problems or pain. That's why it's so important to see a physician who can assess your symptoms and order the most effective tests when necessary.

4. **Not thinking outside the pill box.** Many treatments that don't involve taking medication help people in pain find relief. For example, spinal cord stimulation uses electrical signals to short circuit pain in the lower back and legs. Other alternative treatments that may help include injections, acupuncture, massage, meditation and physical therapy.

5. **Neglecting your overall health.** Studies show people who smoke are more likely to have chronic pain, so if you smoke get the help you need to quit. Also, be sure to eat healthy. Studies show following an anti-inflammatory diet of wholesome, unprocessed foods (vegetables and foods high in omega-3 fatty acids, such as wild salmon and walnuts) may help reduce pain. The healthier you are, the better you'll feel and the less pain you'll have. •

Hard Work Goes from Bottom to Top

Over the regular Hawthorne Parks and Recreation Youth Basketball season, the Hard Work Division IV basketball team struggled through a 1-9 slate. 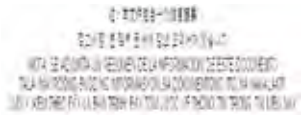

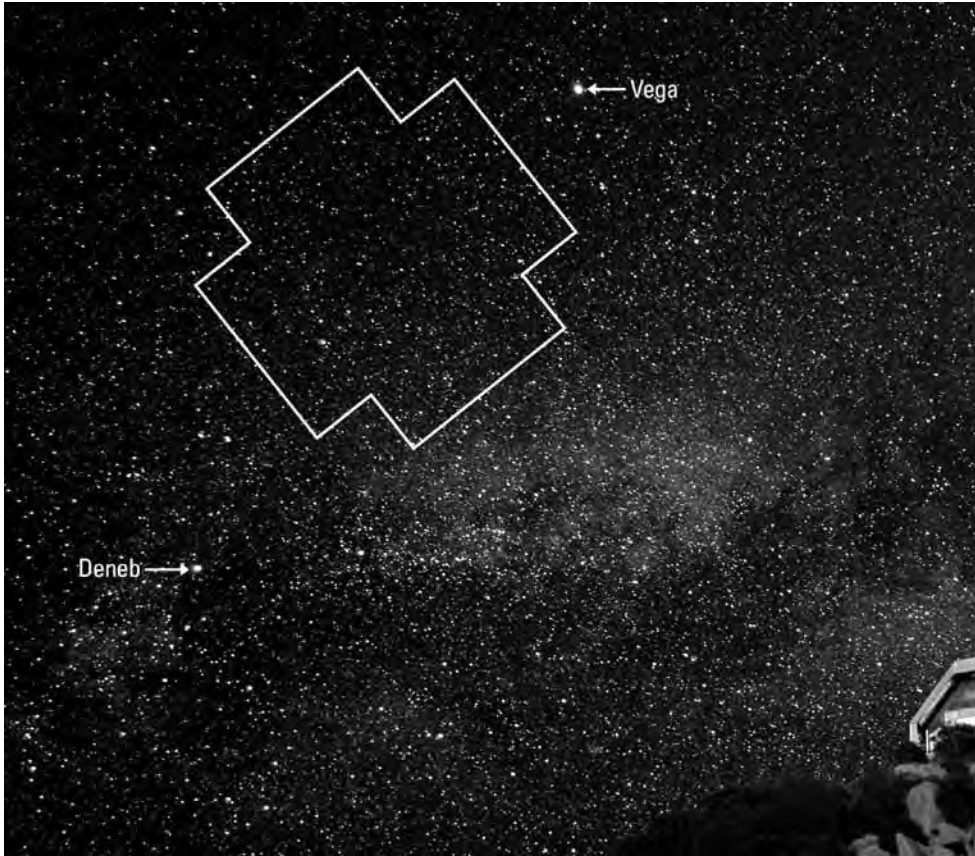

Looking Up

Half of All Exoplanet Host Stars Are Binaries

Imagine living on a planet that has two suns. One you orbit, and the other is a very bright, nearby neighbor looming large in

your sky. With this “second sun” in the sky, nightfall might be a rare event, perhaps only coming seasonally to your planet. A new study suggests that this could be far more common than we realized.

NASA’s Kepler Space Telescope has

confirmed about 1,000 exoplanets. Until now, there has been an unanswered question about exoplanet host stars: how many host stars are binaries, or double stars? Binary stars have long been known to be commonplace—about half the stars in the sky are believed to consist of two stars orbiting each other. So, are stars with planets equally likely to have a companion star, or do companion stars prevent the formation of planets?

The study, by a team of astronomers led by Dr. Elliott Horch, Southern Connecticut State University, has shown that stars with exoplanets are just as likely to have a binary companion: 40% to 50% of the host stars of confirmed exoplanets are actually binary stars.

Their study makes use of very high spatial resolution observations that were carried out on the WIYN telescope located on Kitt Peak in southern Arizona and the Gemini North telescope located on Mauna Kea in Hawaii. The technique used by the team is called speckle imaging and consists of obtaining digital images (15 to 25 times a second) of a small portion of the sky surrounding a star of interest. The images are then combined in software using a complex set of algorithms, yielding a final picture of the star with a resolution better than that of the Hubble Space Telescope.

By using this technique, the team can detect companion stars that are up to 125 times fainter than the target but only 0.05 arcsecond away. For the majority of the Kepler stars, this means companion stars

with a true separation of a few to about 100 times the Sun-Earth distance. By noting the occurrence rate of these true binary companion stars, the discoveries can be extended to show that half of the stars that host exoplanets are probably binaries.

Co-author of the study, Dr. Steve B. Howell (NASA Ames Research Center), commented, “An interesting consequence of this finding is that in the half of the exoplanet host stars that are binary we cannot, in general, say which star in the system the planet actually orbits.”

The Kepler orbiting telescope has discovered a number of circumbinary planets, that is, a planet that orbits both stars in very close binary systems. There also exist exoplanets that are known to orbit one of the stars in very wide binary systems. If the two stars are very close to each other and the planet far away, a circumbinary planet will be reminiscent of the planet Tatooine in “Star Wars.” If instead the exoplanet orbits one of the stars in a very wide pair, the companion star might appear simply as a bright star among others in the night sky. “Somewhere there will be a transition between these two scenarios,” Howell said, “but we are far from knowing where.” The accompanying figure marks out the Kepler Space Telescope’s field of view (the part of the sky being studied here), located between two bright stars in the “summer triangle,” rising over the Kitt Peak telescope in southern Arizona. •
