May The Workforce Be with You

There is real concern about a possible rescission in our future. While jobs still seem available today, and the unemployment rate is relatively low, the specter of a serious economic downturn, job losses, and the ripple effects is creating many apprehensions. Well, there's hope!

Over forty years ago, the South Bay Workforce Investment Board came into existence. The continuing efforts made by the Board and the resources it provides to the young and old, advantaged and disadvantaged employees and employers, are substantial. The goal of the Board remains plain and straightforward: "Putting people to work; helping business succeed."

Jan Vogel, CEO of the Board for over forty years, told me: "We are working more than ever to upgrade skills, so if the rescission hits and more are laid off, we can seek to assist them in transitioning into other opportunities. We also provide workshops, financial management, and assist people in applying for benefits."

Some of the details: The Board is a private, non-profit organization, which is a party to a joint power agreement with 11 cities in the South Bay: El Segundo, Gardena, Hawthorne, Hermosa Beach, Inglewood, Lawndale, Torrance, Lomita, Manhattan Beach, Redondo Beach, and Carson.

The Board has over 50 members representing a wide array of business, labor, education, and economic development. Its programs are implemented through four One-Stop Business

and Career Centers in Inglewood, Carson, Gardena, and Torrance.

One of the significant aspects of the Board is that it is both pro-employee and pro-employer. Through grants, courses, training, written materials and facilities, the Workforce Board seeks to help young and old find their way to good work and in turn, help employers

enhance their operations. One example only: Just last week, the Board announced that as a result of working in collaboration with the California Department of Rehabilitation, it has secured a contract valued at approximately \$1.1 million to train as many as one hundred individuals with disabilities to qualify for **See Workforce**, page 4

West Basin Invites Students to Participate in Water is Life Art Contest



"As historic drought conditions persist for a fourth year, West Basin calls on all student artists to think about the importance of our precious and limited water supply. We look forward to seeing students' beautiful artwork and renewing our inspiration to conserve water," said West Basin Board President Donald L. Dear.

This year, qualified teachers can request a free classroom art supply set (valued at \$80) and an in-person or live online art lesson to support their students' submission efforts. Limited art supply sets and art lessons are available. Art lesson reservation form, art supply set request form, and updated contest guidelines in English and Spanish are available online at www. westbasin.org/waterislife.

Fifteen student winners (one grand prize winner and four honorable mentions in each elementary, middle, and high school grade category) will be selected by a panel of judges in April 2023. Each winner is awarded a new Apple iPad, with Grand Prize winners additionally receiving a digital stylus pen and \$25 Apple Store gift card.

The contest is a collaborative water education program in partnership between West Basin and the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California (Metropolitan). Winning artwork from West Basin's local contest will advance to Metropolitan's regional competition and may be featured in the agency's 2024 student artwork calendar. •


Animals Go Vroom! by Abi Cushman

<u>Film Review</u> 'RRR' is An Explosive, Entertaining Epic

Next to the box office smashes that were The Batman, Top Gun: Maverick, and Avatar: The Way of Water, RRR was one of the most astounding theatrical experiences I had in 2022. And you might not have heard of

Clocking in at a towering 3 hours and 7 minutes long, RRR is certainly a long watch.

before fighting for their country in the 1920s.

So, who is RRR for? It's certainly for fans that want to see a single man defeat an entire mob of mercilessly angry protestors by himself. Or, see a man capture a lion with his bare hands. Or both of those men ride a horse and motorcycle and leap headfirst into battle while explosions ignite behind them. Or, to see both of those men do the best dance sequence of last year ("Naatu Naatu" is likely the lock for Best Original Song at

However, with the nature of streaming movies nowadays, you should remember that you can pause and break any time you like. I guarantee that you're going to be so wowed and captivated by the astounding action and visionary filmmaking that you're going to have a hard time pausing through this one.

Upon playing, it should be immediately clear what makes RRR one of the most fun, visionary, and action-packed films of last year. It's an Indian action-adventure blockbuster, which, if you're not familiar with Indian cinema, has a distinctly different feeling than American films.

In Indian cinema (or Bollywood films), there is so much life being expressed that it all feels hyper-real. The camera flies with soaring speed. The editing is fast, almost lightningquick. The characters and their emotions are so deeply felt - whether full of life or pain - that they burst with feeling. Yes, it's much more stylized and over-the-top than what you might be typically used to, but that is what makes these films so entertaining and fun.

RRR (which stands for Rise Roar Revolt) is a fictitious story about two legendary revolutionaries - Komaram Bheem (N.T. Rama Rao Jr.) and Alluri Sitarama Raju (Ram Charan Teja) – who, through a series of fate and lifechanging-events, meet and create a friendship and bond that will lead them away from home this year's Academy Awards).

Originally released in March of 2022, it was and remains an international hit. Upon its US release, it captivated fans in its theatrical runs, sparking sold-out audiences to cheer, laugh, and dance in their seats.

Director S.S. Rajamouli has wildly succeeded in giving American audiences a new taste of Indian cinema to love. So do yourself a favor. Queue up RRR. See what makes Indian cinema and this film so full of life, love, and dancing wherever you may be watching.

Top 3 Financial Resolutions Americans Are Making to Cope with Uncertain Times

(BPT) - While preparing to ring in the new year, many Americans make resolutions about their finances. Unfortunately, some are feeling less optimistic about the year ahead, according to Fidelity Investments' 2023 New Year's Financial Resolutions Study. Over one-third say they're in worse financial shape than last year, and only 65% believe they'll be better off in 2023. The good news? About half say they're ready to "live sensibly" or "plan ahead," making practical financial resolutions focusing on balancing short-term and long-term goals. Two-thirds of the survey respondents (66%) are considering a financial resolution for 2023.

Of those planning a financial New Year's resolution, 94% say they're approaching it differently, given the events of the last couple of years, focusing on practicality - with nearly half (45%) considering more conservative goals for the year ahead.

The top financial resolutions are:

- 1. Save more money (39%)
- 2. Pay down debt (32%)
- 3. Spend less money (28%)

For the first time in the study's 14-year history, more Americans resolve to save for short-term goals rather than long-term goals. Next generation savers (ages 18-35) are evenly split, with 50% saving for the short-term and 50% taking a longer view. Among those making financial resolutions, the top motivations are "achieving greater peace of mind" and "living a debt-free life."

Inflation was cited as the top financial setback experienced in 2022, and its impact is expected to continue. In fact, respondents ranked it their top financial concern for 2023.

Among those experiencing a financial setback in the past year, 44% had to dip into their emergency fund. Millennials led the way in this regard, with more than half (55%) reporting being forced to take this action. Additionally, 4 out of 10 (43%) Baby Boomers say they and their family are in worse shape financially compared to last year, possibly in part due to declining retirement balances.

While 2022 presented challenges, the study also reveals encouraging news: More people express having a positive relationship with money. When asked to describe their expectations for 2023, 29% describe their outlook for next year as "the year of living sensibly." Encouragingly, nearly half (49%) expect to maintain savings habits developed during the pandemic, and a similar number (46%) plan to get more involved in charitable giving in 2023.

"Even if your focus is on immediate needs, long-term goals and objectives are what keep us going - and planning can help," said Stacey Watson, senior vice president of Life Event Planning, Fidelity Investments. "Taking charge of your financial situation is a great way to help you feel a sense of control, even when external forces bring challenges. Saving more and paying down debt, even small amounts,



work experience assignment at LAX.

Testing for Osteoporosis: Assessing Your Risk for Bone Breaks

(BPT) - As people age, they become more likely to develop osteoporosis, a disease that occurs when bones lose density and mass. This can cause bones to be brittle, weak and at risk of osteoporosis, there are proactive measures you can take to monitor your bone health.

Osteoporosis is more common in women than men. For those age 65 and older, it affects about 1 in 4 women and 1 in 20 men. It is responsible for 2 million broken bones every year and studies suggest that approximately half of women and a quarter of men age 50 and older will break a bone, due to osteoporosis. The number of older adults with osteoporosis is likely to significantly increase as the U.S. population ages.

Osteoporotic bone breaks most often occur in the hip, spine or wrist, but other bones can break, too. Beyond significant and often permanent pain, these fractures can have many other consequences, including frailty and limited mobility, complications related to the broken bone itself or the surgery to repair it, plus the necessity of long-term care and institutionalization.

BMD tests are recommended for women age 65 or older and men age 70 or older.

Osteoporosis is more common after menopause, so women should begin talking to their doctor before menopause. Anyone with several of these risk factors - both controllable easily broken. The good news is, if you're and uncontrollable - should also discuss it with their doctor, even if they are younger than the general guidelines.

> Consider asking your provider if you should complete a bone density test to determine how healthy your bones are. Your doctor will discuss your bone density test with you, and help you interpret the results. If you are a pre-menopausal woman or a man under the age of 50, it is likely that your results will be compared to the average bone density of someone your age. If you are a man older than 50 or a post-menopausal woman, your bone density is measured against the typical bone density of a healthy 30-year-old of your same gender and reported in something called a T-score, according to the World Health Organization.

- A score of -1.0 or above is normal bone density.
- A score of -1.0 to -2.5 shows that calcium and other minerals in your bones are decreasing, a condition called osteopenia or low bone mass.

• A score of -2.5 or below with a history of a fracture is considered severe

BMD testing frequency depends on factors including age, past bone density results and whether you are taking an osteoporosis treatment. Those at a higher risk for osteoporosis (for example, estrogen-deficient women, those on glucocorticoid or some other steroid therapy and those with primary hyperparathyroidism) may need earlier and more frequent testing.

Medicare plans cover the full cost of bone mass measurement testing once every 24 months for people who meet certain criteria, but the test may be covered more often if deemed medically necessary.

There is no one single way to ensure healthy bones, but there are many great habits that can help put you on the right path:

- Incorporate enough calcium and vitamin D in your diet
- Avoid smoking and limit drinking alcohol or caffeinated beverages
- Take steps to minimize your risk of falls. Increasing the amount of exercise can also help, especially regular weight-bearing

If you have been diagnosed with osteoporosis or have had fractures, talk with your doctor about medication options, which can vary based on gender, age, bone health and other factors. •


