The City Council Skates, But Only for Awhile

The Hawthorne City's Council's second meeting of this new year had an Agenda that was notably shorter than most. Did this mean the meeting would only last an hour or two?

For once, is there not all that much to deal with? In fact, the meeting even started right on time! Mayor Pro Tem Angie Reyes gave the invocation and thanked God for directing the City Council to do the right thing. Mayor Vargas made clear that 2024 is promising to be a good year, and good things are happening, which led to what can easily be described as a joyous presentation:

Ladies and gentlemen, Louie Lopez is a professional and decorated skateboarder! His mom and dad accompanied him, among other family members. Last month, at Eucalyptus Park, with many in attendance, Louie said thank you to Hawthorne. The event had excellent sponsors, including Converse, FA World Entertainment, Noah, Spitfire, Stance, Yeti, Oakley, Skullcandy, SKF Skateboarding, CCs, Miles, independent, and Grown & Gifted.

No one went home empty-handed. This was an event about positivity and community spirit and included activities for residents of all ages. The City Council issued a Certificate of Recognition to Louie, posed for photos with him, and bottom line, encouraged this young man "to be our 2028 Olympics Skate Ambassador".

Brenda Williams, Recreation Supervisor with the City of Hawthorne, was part of the team that made the event at Eucalyptus Park so successful. Clearly, when there is teamwork of this kind, everyone benefits. Louie spoke of his bottom line: "Anything you are dreaming about, you can do it. My main goal is for

everyone to get something and everyone to leave happy. Follow your dreams..."

The Manager of the Hawthorne Library then came forward, another fine young person, Danny Grandaos. He encouraged the community to keep track online of when the library is providing free vaccines. He also wanted to ensure we knew about the Toddler Paint program on January 27 at noon. Then, on February 3 is a special guest storyteller at noon, which kicks off Black History Month.

Next, Marco Trejo. For fifteen years, and going strong, he has led Sweet Science Boxing and MMA in Hawthorne, which took two kids to the Olympic try-outs, and they got quite close.

Marco wants to keep working, in conjunction with the City of Hawthorne, to persuade young people away from gang violence and seek to guide them into productive lives. He proposed a gang prevention program, and just like that, a representative from the Hawthorne Police Department came forward to talk with him.

Also, a reminder given from the public presentation that April is Autism Awareness Month. An ongoing request is made that Hawthorne show its support.

Chris Brown then took the podium. In 2013, he became the youngest Mayor of Hawthorne and the first African American Mayor in the

Barking at the El Segundo Dog Park

It was about 105 degrees in Newberry Springs (near Barstow) that July morning when I traveled from the South Bay to pick up Jesse, a golden retriever, five months young, who was looking for his "forever home". The breeders were very kind and shared with me that he was from absolute champion stock, but seemed a bit too lethargic, so no one had come forward. To that point, Jesse was housed at their premises a distance away, which I would learn was out in the boonies.

So, in the early goings, it was clear that Jesse was a country bumpkin. He had no familiarity with common things like car horns or even stairs. At the start, I had to carry him up to our second story for bedtime, and my back paid the price.

The breeders also explained to me that Jesse was named after the Jesse Tree, which (at least as I heard it) is a symbol from the Bible of a tree stump from which grew a new tree, similar to the Old Testament, which gave rise to the New Testament. Some will tell you dogs are angels on four paws.

You will hear no argument here. Jesse transformed not just my life but that of my family and others who knew him and spent time with him, not the least of which was my aging mother, who resided in a "facility" that quickly welcomed Jesse because so many there enjoyed his affection and loving nature. He was a therapy dog without any training.

When I brought him home, Jesse weighed 35 pounds. He would grow




<u>Film Review</u>

Sometimes I Think About Dying: The Beauty of Being Mundane

At the intersection of Punch Drunk Love and Office Space lies Sometimes I Think About Dying, a dark comedy about the pains of navigating corporate culture from the point of view of a socially inept millennial. Directed by Rachel Lambert, the film uses subtle humor to show how one woman (Daisy Ridley), stuck at a dead-end job, temporarily escapes the invisible chains of her cubicle by letting her mind wander into absurd territory. Anyone who has ever worked a humdrum 9-5 will be able to relate to the angst our protagonist feels, contributing to a reflective yet hilarious watch. Making its World Premiere at the 2023 Sundance Film Festival, Sometimes I Think About Dying is

A beautiful harp sequence plays over images of a crisp, foggy morning along the Oregon coast. Idyllic in both soundscape and landscape, it seems like this place is heaven on earth. However, the beauty of the day doesn't make even a dent into Fran's (Daisy Ridley) downcast disposition, whose beige cardigan matches her workplace's beige interior. Given this visual, we can safely assume that her wardrobe acts as an outward reflection of her beige life.

Fran works in a small, nondescript office with nice enough co-workers, yet she stays at arm's length and remains non-receptive to their half-hearted attempts at small talk. New life is breathed into the office when the friendly new hire, Robert (Dave Merheje), joins the team. He voluntarily initiates contact with Fran, asking her for help with simple tasks like ordering office supplies, and doesn't give up engaging in conversation despite her lack of enthusiasm towards him. Their connection isn't instantfar from it, in fact- but over time, Robert begins to peel away Fran's protective layers and starts to understand who the real

This isn't a traditional love story, but more of a self-love story for the emotionally challenged. When we first meet Fran, she is working through self-doubt and criticism by envisioning all of the different ways she could die, depicted through vivid daydreams. These surreal montages incorporate risky and absurd undertakings, like standing toe to toe with a snake. These images-visceral in nature-seem to give Fran a sense of ownership over her autonomy. She may not have control over many aspects of her life but here, in her dreams, she is the boss. The film dips into this psychological aspect but doesn't linger too long in her psyche. Rather, director Rachel Lambert uses this outlet as a means of expressing Fran's quirkiness and dissimilarity to her peers.

Sometimes I Think About Dying crafts a tender and affectionate story that hits all of the right notes with conviction. The ensemble cast is made up of mostly lesser-known actors and similar in form to Jury Duty, they all have their own amusing quirks, making the group feel more like an improv team than co-stars. Daisy Ridley gives a stellar performance as the apathetic Fran, teetering on the edge of pity and arrogance with such finesse. Her command over the role is impressive, reminding everyone why she deserves to remain a top-billed star.


<u>Check It Out</u>

Open Throat by Henry Hoke

Designated as one of the best books of 2023 by the Washington Post, and described by the New York Times as a "slim jewel of a novel," Henry Hoke's Open Throat is not to be missed. Narrated by a mountain lion in the hills above Los Angeles, we see humans through the perspective of an unwitting victim to our avarice and selfish destruction of the natural world we profess to treasure and admire. Written in sentence fragments, this wickedly smart and humorous observation of the vapid lives led by a world of influencers and strivers is a joy to read. As our mountain lion declares, "I try to understand people but they make it hard."

On the other hand, it is heartbreaking to witness the cost of human disregard for nature and the wildlife we have continually pushed

to the brink of extinction. These animals are driven to increasingly desperate measures to feed themselves. Silently watching hikers pass within feet of him, the narrator drools and muses how long he could feed on a human, fighting his ever present hunger, instinctively knowing it would be the end of him even as it sustains him. "I don't know if I feel good or bad... if hungry is bad then I almost always feel hungry, so maybe I almost always feel bad." Our mountain lions' journey is an adventure of surprising discoveries and narrow escapes.

Despite the unconventional construction of the novel, Hoke's prose is remarkably expressive. Referring to the freeway as "the long death" and "a scorched world" in the aftermath of a forest fire, Hoke gives us a completely different picture of the world we pass through daily. Despite having read this book some months ago, I simply cannot forget its effect upon me. I hope your experience is as lasting. •



Self-Care Isn't Selfish

Welcome to 2024! Every year, at this time of New Year's resolutions, I suggest that my clients don't make unrealistic resolutions to start something new (like losing weight) or change a routine (perhaps giving up coffee or some other vice) but instead resolve to cut themselves some slack and take better care of themselves. So many of us worry constantly about our loved ones with dementia that it affects our health. We stress about their care and often take on an unfair share of caring for them.

The demands of caregiving, combined with worry and stress, can tremendously affect your health and well-being. Stress causes cortisol levels to rise, leading to metabolism and weight gain changes. Other effects of cortisol include inflammation, high blood pressure, high anxiety, interrupted sleep, and even diabetes.

Stress and worry are widespread among those of us who are natural caregivers. Our loved one needs help, and we are the one person on the planet best suited to provide that help. In many cases, our loved one needing assistance is someone who raised us or otherwise cared for us in the past. We feel we owe them. Focusing on ourselves means not focusing on them, leading to guilt, a worry that only leads to additional stress.

The trouble is that many caregivers are so focused on their loved one's care that they forget to care for themselves. You might not sleep enough, exercise enough, or eat well. You may also feel depressed or anxious. All of these increase your risk of develop-

ing severe health issues. The emotional and physical demands of caregiving can be very strenuous, even on the strongest person. I often say, "If you don't take care of yourself, who will take care of your loved one?"

At the core of many caregiver's circumstances is a feeling of obligation. I'm not suggesting that anyone abandon their feelings or their loved ones. Caring for the person who once cared for you can create a tremendous feeling of obligation.

However, it's equally important to be compassionate to yourself. You are likely providing the best care and making the best decisions for your loved one, given what you know when you know it. Feeling guilty about not doing enough or about making difficult decisions is where I interrupt. My mantra for over a decade has been to give up the guilt.

Another aspect of self-care is asking for and accepting help. List people you feel can help, including immediate family, extended family, friends, and neighbors. You may not ask them to bathe your loved one, but they may sit with your loved one to watch television or go on walks, giving you a brief respite.

Finally, improvement in your diet can also help put some focus on you. Eliminate fast food and incorporate fruits and vegetables or exercise to reduce stress. A 10-minute daily walk is a great place to start, increasing your walk time weekly. And I can't emphasize enough that you need more sleep to deal with caregiver stress. Make a point of going to bed a half-hour earlier, turning off your phone, and reading a book. Do something weekly for yourself, keep to your routine, and let go of the guilt. •

City's then-91-year history. Chris noted the several deaths in the past four to six weeks, emphasized this is not the fault of the City Council, commended the Police Department, and stated, "I am just here to make sure you give the Police Department all the support its needs.... Keep up the good work. Ignore the noise!"

The City Clerk and each Council member in attendance (Ms. Manning was out that night) had their time to address matters of interest. Mayor Vargas spoke about "Hawthorne's own path." He emphasized that the City has real success, which should not be overshadowed by Inglewood (with SoFi and all the news the various developments in Inglewood have generated). One item of import here is the hotel corridor on Imperial Highway, which provides a more affordable alternative to the hotels along or adjacent to LAX. The Mayor commended the City Manager and staff and also reminded them that AYSO was basically founded in Hawthorne.

Then, at 7:17 pm, a bit more than an hour after the meeting began, the Council went into Executive (that is, closed) Session. Here,

then, are the positives, the high-fives, and the commendations temporarily put aside.

In November of last year, a civil lawsuit was filed locally by the Hawthorne Airport, LLC against the City of Hawthorne and others. The lawsuit is over 400 pages long, though perhaps some of that includes attachments. The myriad claims range from Breach of Contract to Accounting and Unjust Enrichment to Cancellation of Instruments.

An Executive Session is a special, closed meeting during which candid, confidential discussions can take place, often with counsel. While transparency is an integral part of government, as much as feasible, there simply are some matters - here, a possibly significant lawsuit - that are properly addressed behind closed doors.

What will be done with the lawsuit remains to be seen, to be heard, and to play out. In sum, this was a briefer City Council meeting than usual, and there was so much that was positive and gratifying. Invariably, though, there is tough stuff to deal with as well. Skating for a while, but not the whole time.



Hybrid Heating: Save Money and Reduce Your Home's Carbon Footprint

(BPT) - As temperatures dip across the country, homeowners are shifting their attention to keeping their indoor spaces comfortable during the cooler months. However, at very cold outdoor temperatures, many air source heat pumps need to rely on backup heating, which is either electric resistance strip heating or fuel combustion heating from a furnace.

Because electric resistance uses a significant amount of electricity, it is very inefficient and can place a large strain on the electric grid. This can create more harmful carbon emissions than utilizing a gas furnace for the limited periods that backup heating is needed - making hybrid systems a very sustainable solution.

"A dual fuel heat pump system is a proven, sustainable way for homeowners to heat and cool their home year-round while reducing their emissions and cutting energy costs,"

How You Can Stay Ahead of Diabetes

(BPT) - With diabetes on the rise, getting tested and establishing a healthy routine are more important than ever.

The high rate of diabetes in this country comes at a significant cost. If not well managed, diabetes can lead to many complications, including blindness, kidney failure, heart disease and more. Diabetes also increases the risk of developing serious complications or being hospitalized with respiratory illnesses such as COVID-19 and the flu. People living with diabetes incur an average of \$16,750 in medical expenses every year - more than double the typical cost of care for people without diabetes.

"While navigating diabetes can be complicated, the most important things you need to do are get tested regularly and develop a routine to manage your condition over time," says Danielle James, PharmD, a Walgreens pharmacy manager in the Chicago area. "Your pharmacist can help you with both of those things, whether you have diabetes, prediabetes or an elevated risk for diabetes. This is the perfect time to start that conversation with your pharmacist."

Testing and ongoing management look different for everyone, but they are both crucial to stay ahead of diabetes before it progresses or leads to complications.

Testing

The American Diabetes Association recommends all adults ages 35 and older get screened for diabetes at least once every three years. People living with diabetes also need to undergo regular testing to monitor their condition and adjust their care regimen as needed. Blood sugar tests are the most common form of testing for diabetes, and there are several different types:

 A1C testing measures your average blood sugar level over three months. This is the most common test to diagnose diabetes and monitor it over time to determine how well treatment is working.



into an 85-pound, handsome, gentle, sweet, kind, strong, and loving companion. Time after time, people would complement me on how well-behaved he was (not realizing that I had done nothing, that he "came out of the box" that way). And his supposed lethargy turned out to be a common issue, a Thyroid deficiency, which was and is readily treatable.

One of our very favorite spots was the El Segundo Dog Park on Imperial Highway. It has an area for big dogs and a separate space for smaller dogs. There are several impressive trees (which provide not only aesthetic benefit, but comforting shade).

There are benches, water fountains for both dog and person alike, sturdy fences, pooper scoopers, trash receptacles, friendly people, and ample room for dogs to romp, jump, bark, play, and take in the day. It is a place where you yourself can unwind, where "the human" can take a nice break, while the dog has playdates with all varieties of canines.

Jesse would "high paw" me as we walked into El Segundo's Dog Park (he was so excited and joyful). I always appreciated, and still do, that there was and is no entrance fee. Just come on in and enjoy!

Statistics indicate there are over five million privately owned dogs in Los Angeles County. Even so, dog parks are more recent than you may expect. The first dates to 1979, known as Ohlone Dog Park in Berkeley, California.



The El Segundo Dog Park

Like others, the Ohlone Dog Park started as a community project on public land that came (in time) to be officially sanctioned. While dog parks are common today, getting a dog park opened is no snap-of-the-fingers. El Segundo looked into the idea in 1998, but it was quite a few years later before the El Segundo Dog Park became a reality.

In the interim, a dog run on the nearby beach has never been approved despite considerable effort. This is not to criticize, but instead to remind us to count our blessings. The El Segundo Dog Park is a real find.

For so many of us, dogs are a part of the

pooch. I should also mention that the El Segundo Dog Park is more dirt than sod, so you probably don't want to go there in your Sunday best. It isn't perfect, but if a vote were taken, I would check "Yes" if we could rename this location: The El Segundo Human and Dog Park.

A short distance west is Clutter's Park, which has wonderful views of LAX and planes taking off. For many of us, sitting on a bench at the El Segundo Dog Park in the shade, stretching a bit and smiling, we think: "Fly away, big old planes, and safe travels! We are happy right here."

Granted, the car seat won't look any better as Jesse gets back in and later out, and my shoes and pants will, of course, show signs of wear and tear, but these are a small price to pay for the fun and comfort at the El Segundo Dog Park.

The noise dissipates there. The outside world tends to drain away. Many of the folks are easy to talk with. Invariably, as you probably surmise, we try to convince each other that our dog is completely unique and, all things considered, indeed, is the best of all time. Of all time!

Rebates and Tax Credits

There are many federal, state and local incentives available now that encourage heat pump adoption and significantly reduce the upfront costs of new equipment. For example, the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) expanded incentives for high-efficiency HVAC equipment, including the 25C tax credit. Many electric utilities also offer incentives for customers to install high-efficiency heat pumps, and these incentives can usually be combined with federal and state programs. Climate policies and incentive programs differ from state to state and even city to city, so rebate amounts and qualifications may change depending on homeowner location.

- · Blood glucose testing measures your blood sugar at a single moment in time and can also be used to diagnose diabetes or determine your risk of developing it. For some blood glucose tests, you will need to fast overnight before your blood is drawn.
- · Blood sugar monitoring is typically performed at home by people living with diabetes to monitor and manage their condition daily. It can be done via finger pricks throughout the day or by wearing a device called a continuous glucose monitor (CGM), which measures blood glucose levels every few minutes.

Other important tests for people at risk for or living with diabetes include cholesterol and blood pressure tests, routine kidney screenings, and eye and foot exams.
