# Orly Israel: the South Bay's **Listener and Connector**

Most of us tend to talk, some of us incessantly, about ourselves. But we typically spend much less time emphatically listening and comprehending what the other person might be sharing, right?

El Segundo's Orly Israel, who was raised in Pacific Palisades, attended Pali High School, and matriculated to Syracuse University to study Communications, is flipping the script on that. The 27-year-old Israel has embarked upon a program to listen and explore the thoughts of others, withholding judgment and allowing those so inclined to freely riff their thoughts to him.

Israel has set-up up his "listening table" in available spaces in swaths of El Segundo, in other South Bay cities, and the Westside. His table is draped with a banner that trumpets: "Here to listen. No judgment, no advice, no charge."

Now I have never been to a psychiatrist myself (some may say I should immediately sign-up for sessions). Still, I am guessing that the professional psychiatrists out there may charge a pretty penny for allowing one to spill their innermost thoughts to them? No charge is incurred from the time spent with Israel, though.

In our phone interview, Israel mentions classes that he has taken that have sharpened his listening skills, citing courses from communication instructors whose credo is "first you have to listen, then you do something."

He has spit-balled different ideas to help people communicate and connect, ideas that would also help Israel develop his skills and "get out of my comfort zone." He settled on his "listening table" gambit.

Israel thinks that his family upbringing may have spurred his interest in taking a deep dive into the field of communications. His Dad, David Israel, is an award-winning television producer and writer and spent a stint writing for the New York Mets, before

heading west to California some 30-years ago to start a career in Tinseltown.

Israel mentioned that he and his siblings, like most if not all families had their share of tiffs that escalated, noting that "there is a certain part of a conversation that (then) becomes an argument, then a certain part of the argument becomes a fight."

Why does Israel spend his free time trying to help and connect with others? "Because some people don't have anyone to talk to who will really listen to them without trying to fix their problems or tell them to get over it," he writes. "And some people don't have anyone to talk to at all. And I have also got my own listening skills to work on. I am trying to make people feel good by listening to them, and if they feel good, they might want to share that feeling of being listened to with their loved ones, friends, and family. And there will be a domino effect

of sorts, and people will start communicating with each other better. That is my big goal, to raise communication skills across

Israel's friend Tiffany Van Goey, who resides in the Cincinnati area, has joined Israel for "two or three" sessions at his table. Israel said that Van Goey participates as a neutral observer, "effectively a listener in training."

A mutual friend introduced Israel and Van Goey. She soon discovered that she and Israel had a similar interest in growing communication skills. Of her participation as a neutral observer, Van Goey said that she gained great insight in just listening and restraining herself from the very human trait of wanting to "chime in" to the conversation, calling the sessions spent with Israel and the folks who stopped by the table "very interesting and transformative."

# The Thing About Istanbul

It's New Year's Eve on Pera peak, the one-time Venetian quarter of Istanbul, and two beautiful Turkish girls in miniskirts, gaudy blouses, and five-inch heels race awkwardly down a steep street, yelling for a taxi. A group of old codgers barely glances up from their card game, but two young, male loiterers rouse from their torpor to hurl indignant insults at the scantily clad girls. The girls jeer and return the abuse, as they climb into their cab and speed away.

This is something you think about when you visit Istanbul. Pera and Galata; the business district and the university quarter; the famous old palaces and mosques; all sit in Europe. The Greeks settled Constantinople, the Romans civilized it, and for much of its history, liberal Europeans sporadically dominated its public affairs. After 1453, when the great Ottoman Sultans took over, they might have preached Islam, the Caliphate, and a weak Europhobia, but for the most part, they were the most tolerant and internationalist rulers of their age. And when Kemal Atatürk became the father of modern Turkey, his determined secularism set the tone for eighty years of religious and cultural tolerance.

But times do change, and in the last seventy-odd years, the lure of jobs and the big city has emptied the Anatolian countryside of millions of its underemployed youth. Today, Istanbul is a thoroughly Islamized city, with most citizens clad in headscarves, full-length sleeves, pants, and

# The Sweeping Musical 'Cyrano' Aims For The Heart, and Hits

Where to watch: 'Cyrano' is now playing in theaters.

The new movie Cyrano is a heartfelt romantic musical that turned me into putty in its hands. Based on the timeless tale of Cyrano de Bergerac-a man gifted with words yet fated with an unconventional appearance-it's the story of a heartbreaking and tragic love triangle. However, seeing the power of true love on screen also makes for one of the most uplifting movies to see this season.

When he learns that his friend and secret love, Roxanne, has fallen in love with another man, the gifted wordsmith Cyrano agrees to write his love letters to her. Concealing his own feelings, he resigns to living a life The most sweeping song that is sure to stick with audiences is "Someone to Say." It's a heartwrenching and beautiful song that's buried itself deep in my head since seeing it in the film's trailer.

As the title character, Peter Dinklage captivates and commands the screen. He showcases his trademark charm and wit. But seeing him long for Roxanne as a sort of doomed "Phantom of the Opera" shows even more range than what we've seen from him before. His chemistry with Roxanne-the centerpiece romance of the film-is also uplifting and heart-aching. As Roxanne, Haley Bennett is wonderful. Her singing voice is beautiful, her character desirable, and her character so pure-hearted.

where he hides away his love. Directed by Joe Wright (Atonement, Pride & Prejudice), Cyrano stars Peter Dinklage in the title role.

The original story goes back to the classic "Cyrano de Bergerac," written by Edmond Rostand. Director Joe Wright's Cyrano is based on the most recent stage play adapted and directed by Erica Schmidt (who's married to Dinklage). Previous versions of the story make Cyrano's comically long nose his character's tragic physical feature. Yet the film uses Peter Dinklage's short stature as the attribute that fuels Cyrano's insecurities and society's rebuke.

For such an open-hearted romantic musical to work, the music needs to be truly moving. And this score is. Written by The National (music written by Aaron & Bryce Dessner and lyrics by Matt Berninger & Carin Besser), Cyrano's soundtrack is brooding and moving in ways that fans of the band will recognize.

Rounding out the cast is Kelvin Harrison Jr. as the young Christian. As the one who Roxanne falls in love with, at first sight, his role is tricky. Christian needs to play the "dumb hunk" who needs Cyrano's words, but also someone with who we connect to and sympathize with. And Harrison Jr. plays both sides well, with a great singing voice too. The real villain role is saved for Ben Mendelsohn. As the powerful De Guiche, Mendelsohn snarls his way into banishing both Cyrano and Christian away from Roxanne-who De Guiche himself is set to marry–by sending them into a war that looms large over the country.

If there's anyone who knows how to make an impassioned romantic period piece film, it's Joe Wright. His most recent sweeping love stories Pride & Prejudice (2005) and Atonement (2007) are among the more recent classic love stories in modern cinema. Although



Single mother Sonya, once a glittering ingenue and celebrated actress, is now living on the dole with her young son Tommy. Still young and beautiful, her life has narrowed to Tommy, and the wine that eases her confusion and desperation, and wards off the angry swarm of voices in her head. A story of addiction and recovery, this deep dive into Sonya's psychosis and alcoholism is harrowing but ultimately a

tale of redemption.

Estranged from her father and having lost her mother at a young age, Sonya is struggling to raise Tommy on her own. She has no friends and no other family to help or support her, nor does she want any. Four-year-old Tommy was the result of a love affair with a callow man who had no intention of being a father. The daily demands of motherhood create a separation from reality while she struggles to raise Tommy on her own. Her obsessive, possessive love for him is second only to her love of the bottle. As she sinks deeper into intoxication, her sanity begins to slip. Riddled with profound

lack of self-esteem, always waiting to be found a fraud, Sonya becomes increasingly unhinged. Her "imp, bad fairy" takes over and she loses control, spewing vitriol to any who dare to question her parenting. She creates a fanciful world with Tommy that they alone inhabit. She fails to see that she is becoming a danger to Tommy. Speeding through traffic for the adrenaline rush, stealing groceries, burning the food she does attempt, failing to feed or bathe him leaves him neglected, starving and dirty. Lost in her fog, she fails to notice she is being monitored and one last careless act finally forces her to confront her demons.

Tommy is taken to live with foster parents while she attends a treatment facility. She may be there under her own volition, but Sonya does not think she really has a problem. In her mind, all she needs is Tommy. As she struggles, she begins to see more clearly and finds a mentor of sorts. Tommy struggles as well. He is angry and confused that Sonya left him without a good bye. Her journey to sobriety and back to Tommy is rendered in heartbreaking reality with a skillful hand. At times difficult and disturbing, this is a novel well worth discovering.

# **Stand Pat And Give Back**

Pat Donaldson was raised in her parents' Sunlight Mission Church in Santa Monica. Among the lessons she learned, one, in particular, is a good way of explaining her: "God blesses me to bless others." The Church also served as a shelter for many.

So, Pat started a non-profit organization years ago named Hope is Helping. One of its tasks is to assist people in learning how to get out of and stay out of poverty.

Now, to be clear, Pat makes a living, with her husband (a retired police detective), through Active Security Solutions, a security guard company based in Hawthorne. That said, one of the roles for which she is particularly well known is serving as President of the Hawthorne Chamber of Commerce. She has been with the Chamber for 22 years and is now in her 15th year as President. Unlike many, who are President of a local Chamber of Commerce, Pat takes no salary. Yet she works there Monday through Friday, typically from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

When she started with the Hawthorne Chamber, there were about 100 members. Today there are 250 to 300 members. Also, when she started, there were boxes and one desk. You are welcome to visit the Chamber office at 13355 Hawthorne Boulevard, Hawthorne. It is a whole lot more inviting today. One of Pat's focuses as President of the Hawthorne Chamber is to push for and oversee multiple give-a-way programs, including hundreds of Thanksgiving turkeys, Christmas toys and food, \$25 gift cards for low-income women on Mother's Day, Easter baskets, and helpful back-to-school backpacks.

A question does arise: What makes some people so dedicated to giving to others? (I should mention that Pat has provided funds out of her pocket to assist struggling businesses.) There must be a name for what Pat does other than "generous" or "kind." There must be!

Well, bottom line, she is a force to reckon with – for good, for better. Hawthorne's State of the City program was attended by about

70 to 80 people when she became Chamber President. Now 400 to 600 are there.

"The Chamber is for businesses," she emphasizes, "to help those that are struggling, to go to bat for those that are facing hurdles -- sometimes with the City itself -- and to provide a forum for members to cultivate friendships."

Wait a second: Did I mention Pat has two daughters, seven grandkids, and three greatgrand kids? When I interviewed her, I did not say out loud what I now realize and can say here: Pat sees the world as her family. Her role, to a truly major degree, is to help out, give, and lift up. I won't call her "mom." I might think it, but I won't say it out loud.

A few other pieces here: Pat is a Board Member of the South Bay Area Chambers of Commerce. She also is a member of the South Bay Work Force Investment Board. The website of the Work Force states its goal as "Putting people to work: helping business succeed."

"I am a people person, and admittedly I push. I push to try to help someone in need. I saw my parents do exactly that for years. By the way, they ran a Thrift Shop. Most of my clothes growing up came from there."

On March 17, at the Hawthorne Marriott, the Hawthorne Chamber of Commerce is having its first mixer in quite a while. Covid was not good for many local businesses, and concerns about Covid prevented get-togethers for well over a year.

So, it is fair to say that Pat Donaldson will have a huge smile on her face on March 17, and not just because it will be St. Paddy's Day. She will gather with one of the families to which she belongs, and she will have a key role in setting the table for all to enjoy and hopefully prosper.

Bottom line: It is the community family for whom she fights, for whom she is dedicated. As such, writing this article may spotlight Pat, but the hope is that it influences others to follow her lead. •

El Segundo School Board member Dieema Wheaton is an Israel neighbor. She shared about the time she was returning from a Starbucks run and noticed Israel and his table. She decided to stop and chat (she did all the chatting) and does not regret taking a little time out of her day.

"It was so beautiful," Wheaton said of the experience, "because he just listened. I opened up about all kinds of stuff that I was not expecting to. It was so organic and easy to speak with him. It was a blessing that I was not anticipating."

Israel also volunteers at a Freedom to Choose program, where he ventures into prisons and attempts to connect. He said that he is also training to be a volunteer for a suicide hotline.

"I felt like communication skills are only really brought in where there are crises involved," he writes, "and not really held in high regard for the regular everyday person with a family."

Israel started setting up his listening table in mid-November, trying to be available to passers-by at least once a weekend. "I've set up my table 30-or-so times. I've had deep conversations with somewhere around seventy people and chatted briefly with at least a hundred more," he said. After the listening sessions conclude, Israel said that he "writes about each one of them so that I can reflect on what I learned, how I felt, and maybe some lesson I took away."

He has also started a blog where he has been posting his thoughts on the conversations - "keeping them anonymous, of course." Checking the social media boxes, Israel also posts on Instagram.

He said he is "interested in becoming a writer," noting that he hones his writing skills "taking any opportunity to write anything," including forays into music blogs and making magazine submissions.

"I am passionate about communication," Israel said. "I have always been interested in why people say what they say."

He also created a comic called Space Whale. It is about two brothers who struggle to get along and are "lost in space." Israel draws on his trials and tribulations growing up as the oldest of three brothers to develop the characters, noting it is "a struggle that I've been through, which gave me a lot of reason to start learning about communication skills."

Israel moved to El Segundo in November of 2020. Why? "I surf El Porto," he said, noting that he has friends from college who also favor riding the waves in North Manhattan. He and his friends found a nice house in El Segundo, with a backyard pickle-ball court. from front page

Growing up in the Palisades, Israel said he was unaware of our small town. But he is more than satisfied with his current residence. "The people who are here want to be here," he said. "This really works for me."

He is still refining his approach to his nascent program. He said he is still seeking "a call to action" to expand his efforts. He said that at this point, he "does not have any magic answers...but I do have some questions...Listening is not everything, but it is the first thing."

Israel knows that, at 27, he does not have all the answers. But he decided to dive into his listening tour, anyway. "A wise man told me,"he said, 'if I wait until I'm ready, I'll never start.' I cannot say that I am ready, but there is the beginning of a story here."

"What can I do to help?" seems to be a fitting mantra for Orly Israel. •

loose robes that reach the floor. But you almost never sense the barely restrained hostility of the "Arab Street" ( it would be the "Turkish Street" here anyway, a distinction that westerners would do well to observe). In fact, one of the biggest issues of the last fifty years has been Turkey's desire to join the European Union—and its chances were torpedoed not in an intolerant alley in Istanbul, but in the governing halls of Germany.

Simply put, the "Thing" about Istanbul is that it has been around forever and has seen literally everything in the human experience. Long before Constantinople boasted not one, but two of the most successful empires in

history—the Roman-Byzantian Christians followed by the Muslim Ottomans—its position at the junction of the east-west Silk Road and the north-south Eurasian-African travel routes guaranteed that it would dominate the trade and culture of the ancient world. When London was still an Anglo-Saxon village and later, when Manhattan was still valued at \$24 worth of beads, the polyglot city of Constantinople already teemed with travelers from the fabled four corners of the Earth.

So with all that history and the lively, chaotic

activity of its modern streets, the only way we can conjure Istanbul is with an equally chaotic and random collection of observations:

#### The Hills:

When we pulled into Sirkeci Train Station, our first thought was to walk the 3km to our hotel. Little did we know, that the city was as hilly as San Francisco and as complicated as Hong Kong. You can reach anywhere on foot with good shoes and a half-gallon of sweat, but not with roller bags. The city boasts every kind of road and sidewalk surface except pristine.

#### The Names:

The Golden Horn and the Bosporus—separated at Seraglio Point across from the Galata For all the prowess of the Ottoman armies, it was the Ottoman Navy that ruled the waves through much of history. For most of the year, the only export routes for the Russian Empire ran through the 3km-wide Bosporus. With a perfect harbor in the Golden Horn and the ships to defend it, the Ottomans were guaranteed a seat at any gathering of world powers.

#### The Food:

We expected the cuisine you find all over Europe in Turkish cafés and restaurants—lamb, kebabs, hummus, grape leaves, and so forth. But in an ancient city with a trading history, you find every type of food and every style of preparation on the planet. Seafood takes

the prize in the restaurants, especially around the Galata docks. Our favorite local specialty is Meze, similar to Spanish Tapas, only with a much more inventive, international touch. Waiters trawl the restaurant with stacked trays, and you point. Just save room for the (smallish) main course.

## The Crowds:

Turks don't press in crowds. And it's a good thing, because anywhere you want to go, it feels like all 15 million Istanbullus want to join you.

## The Bazaars:

The two oldest and most famous covered markets in the world are the Kapali Çarsı (Grand Bazaar) and the Mısır Çarsısı (Egyptian or Spice Bazaar), both built in the 1660s. With the pressure of tourism, both have given over too much space to trinkets, but the original tenants are still there—you just have to look for them. We spent a couple of hours in a booth at the Mısır Çarsısı, sipping tea and getting an education in the wonders of Persian saffron. It only cost us a minor fortune, and we've never bought better.

## The Metro:

One of our first tasks in any new city is to figure out the Metro. Our first day in Casablanca, for example, we rode the entire network, even out to the beach, and met all kinds of polite citizens determined to give up their seat for Glinda. The Istanbul Metro is far more complicated, but easy to use, and it takes you everywhere, even out to the suburbs. If you get lost, don't worry—just cross the
