Joseph Pilates was born in Germany in 1883. He was not well as a child, suffering from asthma, rickets, and rheumatic fever. Joseph would dedicate his life to improving his physical strength, write several books about it, and gain a very devoted following that included many dancers. Pilates today is a well-recognized method of coordination of body, mind, and spirit. The methodology is enhanced by equipment in which Joseph also had a guiding hand.

This leads to Eva Texido Font, who hails from Catalonia, Spain (about 9,611 kilometers from Hawthorne, where she resides). The City of Hawthorne has some 87,000 diversified residents, nice parks, good schools, Space X, and is centrally located. I would also dare say Hawthorne includes some of the most unique and remarkable people on earth.

Eva (pronounced Ava) was one of six children. As a young girl, she liked to dance and became quite accomplished at it. So much so that in 1994 she contracted to perform in Japan as part of a Spanish-Japanese show. When that ended, she auditioned for a show to be performed in Las Vegas, Nevada (also quite a distance from Catalonia, Spain). She was told she was just too short and would never find a job in Vegas. Not only was she hired, but typically she was the shortest dancer hired for the show.


# 'Rock Bottom Riser' is a **Psychedelically Explosive Nature Doc**

Where to watch: Now playing in Los Angeles at the Lumiere Music Hall.

Having screened in 35mm at the Metrograph Theater in New York, experimental filmmaker Fern Silva's Rock Bottom Riser makes its way to Los Angeles tomorrow, March 12th, is expressed in so many different ways in this film, and the recurring statement that "Earth is our mother, Sky is our father" is one of the more easily digestible lines of impact.

Perhaps most striking is Silva's conviction that we, the audience, are all students of life on a never-ending journey towards sustain-

and-trust me-you don't want to miss it. With an explosion of piercing, hypnotic visuals set to a sensational score, Rock Bottom Riser is more of an experience than a traditional film, making for a truly unforgettable impression on the eyes, ears, and mind.

Fern Silva's psychedelic approach to showing the ongoing crisis indigenous Hawaiians face over scientific expansion into their most sacred natural mountains is not your average nature documentary. Silva uses different techniques to show the importance of ethnography, geology, and the cosmos in our evolutionary fight for survival. While at times its non-narrative structure can feel overwhelming, Silva's avant-garde masterpiece is to be interpreted literally or metaphorically as you see fit. The only worry I had was that if I blinked, I'd miss something spectacular. And so, I didn't blink.

From underwater volcanic eruptions to images of the stars in the night sky, Rock Bottom Riser holds the ethos of the Hawaiian culture close to its heart. The symbiotic relationship we have with the natural world ability and survival. "A bird is never lost with its internal compass," says one man in reference to the importance of astronomy. 



# How Many Couples Make Long-Term Financial Decisions Together?

(BPT) - Should married women and men be equally involved in long-term financial decisions? Your answer is likely a resounding yes! The problem is, although everyone agrees a joint financial approach is best for spouses, it's rarely happening in reality.

According to the 2021 "Own Your Worth" report from UBS, the world's largest global wealth manager, nearly 100% of women and men believe women should be more involved in long-term financial decisions, such as investing, financial planning and estate planning. What's more, women and men overwhelmingly believe that unless women are equally involved in these decisions, there will never be true gender equality.

Despite these strong beliefs, in heterosexual marriages, men continue to manage most of



overstuffed burritos made with flour tortillas and loaded down with cumin, yellow cheese, and refried beans. Restauranteurs like Felix Tijerina (of Felix's, since closed and reopened as Uchi, a gourmet Japanese eatery) and the Anaya brothers (of Don Jose Mexican Restaurant) have led the way in adapting Mexican cuisine to mainstream American palates.

If you crave true Mexican, the uber-imaginative, award-winning Hugo's on Westheimer is our favorite outside of Mexico City. Think of goat, pork, barbacoa, scallops, and shrimp, in all manner of vegetables and exotic sauces (especially their mole poblano and salsa terasca), with pyramids of flavored rice. Our favorite drink at the bar is la Tricolor, named



But as noted, the Mexicans came late to Houston. Long before them, the city was famous as a center of soul food (Esther's, This Is It), seafood (Christie's, Caracol), Cajun (Cajun Kitchen, Ragin' Cajun), BBQ (Corkscrew), and various in-betweens. And in recent times, the influx of Vietnamese and other Asians has infused the restaurant scene with all manner of new aromas and flavors.

Along with Hugo's, Don Jose, the Cajun Kitchen, and the Houston National Cemeterywhere Glinda's mother and father (a veteran of Okinawa) lie at rest-our regular stops in Houston include Galveston, the nearby beach town that has no business existing. Hurricanes have repeatedly tried to blast this historic community into the Gulf. Every decade or so, the locals evacuate to safer ground, then crawl back for yet another round of re-building. Our favorite marker on the Galveston Seawall recalls the Balinese Room, a nationally famous speakeasy we used to frequent, where the bartender invented the Margherita for the visiting Peggy Lee. In 1951, when Galveston County Sheriff Frank Biaggne was asked why he hadn't raided the club's casino, he complained that, as a non-member, he wasn't allowed inside.

But most of our time in town is spent visiting with scores of family and friends from the last half-century. And this is the "Thing" about Houstonians and maybe Texans in general—they make friends quickly, and they mate for life. To a longtime wanderer like Ben, the intense mutual gratitude and loyalty shown by nearly everyone you meet—not just to other individuals, but to the state and the country that nurtured them—can be a bit disconcerting. Until you make your own relationships and realize that they'll be with you forever. Sounds like the human-scale paradise many Houstonians like to think it is.
