Want to Visit Some Amazing Planes?

Here in the South Bay, we live fairly close to Los Angeles International Airport. As you probably know, a substantial amount of time, effort and money is going into significant improvements there. Hard to believe that LAX, as it is known, used to be onion fields back in the day.

The number of planes coming into and out of LAX is remarkable. So many locations around the globe can be reached from LAX. So many people come here through LAX, and so many of them visit our South Bay.

Aviation itself is a very storied industry. After all, we humans do not have wings. We are not birds, no matter how strenuously some try to flap their arms as if they were wings. It took considerable time, dreams, and sketches that were pieced together, people taking chances, intense determination, and eventually, machines were built. Today, planes can fly us just about all over the globe. And there are rocket ships that travel deep into space, land on other planets, and explore far reaches of the universe.

Statistically (and thankfully), flying has a credible safety record. But flying is not something that is ordinary. If you take flying in stride and feel it is no big deal, you know something many of us do not.

Even now, I cannot get over being up there around 33,000 feet, looking out that little window, thinking how incredibly fast

we are going, and yet someone comes down the aisle, smiles, and offers me a soda, beer, or wine, all very nonchalantly.

Sure, we sometimes fret about flying – there are limitations about what you can bring on board, how much weight is permitted for your suitcase, how many suitcases you can have, the food can be so-so, there can be delays, cancelations, scary turbulence, and we often scramble to get a good seat. Yes, we fret about going through security, let alone if our baggage is not where it is supposed to be. The cost of flying can be significant. Nonetheless, the bottom line is that airplanes are astonishing, although it really is not all that long ago the Wright Brothers made Kitty Hawk a place of legend.

Hawthorne, the City of Good Neighbors - which possibly could also be nicknamed "the City that Flies" -- has its own Airport (for decades).

The Hathorne Airport, home to Space X, among other fine companies, is a 24-hour operation with private VIP facilities, is close to the freeway, and has a free shuttle to LAX. There is more: The Hawthorne Airport boasts a 4,956-foot long, 100-foot wide lighted runway that can accommodate aircraft weighing up to 90,000 pounds (with dual tandem wheel loading).

Not too shabby.

With all this in mind, I visited the Western Museum of Flight at Zamperini Field in Torrance. There you will find historic aircraft, many of which were built in Southern California, and an extensive collection of vintage photographs and blueprints. There are several hangars with aircraft, part of a Goodyear Blimp, an excellent presentation about women in the aerospace industry, a very cool shop, and a lot of details about local aviation pioneers.

For example, Jack Northrop (he of Northrop Grumman fame) played a major role in what has become the Hawthorne Airport. Thus, the Museum has the second Northrop YF-23 Advanced Tactical Fighter 5th generation among its rare aircraft collection. In addition, the Museum houses the first Northrop YF-17 Cobra, which was the basis for the Boeing (originally McDonnell-Douglas) F/A 18 Hornet and which presently is in use by the United States Navy and Marine Corps.

As you think about it, the Aviation industry, and the South Bay, are a team. El Segundo is home to the Los Angeles Air Force Base, which houses the headquarters of the U.S. Space Force's Space Systems Command. Notably, the Base is the only active-duty military installation in the Los Angeles metropolitan area and has over two thousand personnel assigned.

Sometimes we think of the South Bay and focus on just about everything other than aviation: The beaches, SoFi Stadium, good

The Last Autumn Embraces the Art of Slow Living in Iceland

Now available on VOD and digital is the 2019 documentary The Last Autumn, a sweeping portrait of how a family of farmers encourages slow living in the Icelandic countryside. Directed by Yrsa Roca Fannberg, the film embraces the stillness of the present by centering its story around an elder couple, Úlfar and Oddny, who fight to preserve their ancestral traditions against an environment

of constant evolution.

Shot on 16mm film, The Last Autumn opens in black and white before transitioning into the colorful and picturesque image of Iceland we're used to seeing. Úlfar and his wife Oddny live in the quaint seaside parish of Árneshreppur, a town in the Westfjords of northwestern Iceland. They lead a quiet life and have settled into a nice little routine tending to their lambs, ewes, and dogs.

Úlfar is the last in a long line of farmers, going as far back as the first settlers to Iceland centuries ago. When Úlfar and Oddny's grandchildren visit from the "big city" of Reykjavik (population: 139,875) to help with the seasonal sheep herding for the summer, the couple recognizes that due to their children and grandchildren's lack of interest in rural traditions and a desire to assimilate into modern society, this will be the family's last communal farming obligation. That summer marked the end of an era.

This slice-of-life observational documentary is an ode to living in harmony with nature, animals, and the seasons. It poetically shows that life is like a spiral; seasons repeat themselves and new beginnings are always on the horizon. We cannot stop or slow down time, only embrace what we have in the present moment and be grateful for it.

The Last Autumn is a mood-setting film. It's not plot or exposition-driven. Rather, it has a meditative quality that feels like a long, deep exhale, bringing a sense of rejuvenation and gratitude to the viewer after watching. Visually, it is captivating from start to finish. At times the cinematography even dips into an eerie territory. If seen out of context, the shot of the farmers herding the sheep down from the mountain could easily be mistaken for an Ari Aster film. The score by multiinstrumentalist Gyða Valtýsdóttir is deep and bassy, breathing an ethereal quality into Úlfar's poignant odyssey.

An official selection at multiple festivals including CPH: Dox, HotDocs, and a Special Jury Mention in the New Visions Competition at the Reykjavik International Film Festival, The Last Autumn is a time capsule of a simpler time and a love letter to past generations.



This week, I'm reviewing one of my favorite types of books - reimagined fairytales. In Susannah McFarlane's Fairy Tales of Fearless Girls, Rapunzel, Little Red Riding Hood, Cinderella and Thumbelina are revamped to focus on problem solving and pursuing their passions. Purple font and classic background illustrations in the same plum tint lend a classic storybook feel while the updated ethnicities and character illustrations contribute to the modern focus.

Princes are also reimagined as multi-dimensional characters that may enjoy farming and bond with heroines over shared interests, not just

physical attraction. Even side characters such as grandma help contribute solutions to dilemmas, which encourages readers to think quickly and respond. No matter how minor a role, this assistance is invaluable and something anyone can do, no magic or superhero elements required.

Children often look up to fairy tale characters as role models and wish they could live in the stories. Having more realistic and empowered options helps them relate to and implement similar solutions in their own lives.

Benefits of Facial Care and Makeup

The most common advice I give to dementia caregivers is to engage loved ones in stimulating activities and to find ways to tap into long-term memory. Stimulating a person with dementia keeps them active and involved, which is essential to maintaining a healthy and happy lifestyle. Tapping into long-term memory brings happiness, joy, and heartwarming reactions even after short-term memory fails.

Having developed scores of activities for stimulation, one of the most rewarding involves something simple: facial care and makeup. I say rewarding because the emotional response from many people (often, but not exclusively, women) is an instant connection to another place and time.

Many women routinely wore makeup in their younger years. Over time, they gradually slowed, increasingly reserving their use of makeup for special occasions. Now faced with dementia, they aren't many special occasions to look forward to.

As an activity for those in the early stages of dementia, we focus primarily on stimulation and a sense of purpose. What better way to connect with your loved one than to get ready for an outing? First, participants can enjoy the anticipation of a scenic drive or even a stop for ice cream. The sense of purpose comes from their role in the activity: getting ready.

Even men and women who never (or rarely) used makeup can enjoy the build-up to an outing and the stimulation of getting prepared. The activity includes selecting clothing, washing, shaving, dressing, and focusing on personal appearance. Sit with your loved one and help them prepare, whether applying makeup or giving advice on what to wear. A new article of clothing might add just the right touch or a soothing hand massage.

Working on their physical appearance empowers our loved ones; a little pampering can do a world of good.

For those in the later stages of the disease, the same activity can evoke long-forgotten memories. I've seen women light up, seeing themselves in the mirror with lipstick for the first time in years. Who doesn't smile seeing Dad looking dapper as he poses proudly in front of the mirror? Make sure you have plenty of time and be prepared to hear stories from long ago. As I like to say, "Just roll with it!" You never want to lose the opportunity to connect with your loved one's long-term memory.

Self-care and pampering, with or without makeup, are easy to do with your loved one and require minimal planning. Combining them with a simple planned activity adds an essential sense of purpose for those in many stages of the disease. This helps to boost self-confidence and also pass the time productively. •




