### The Thing About Boston

The thing about Boston is its unique sense of history.

Many places boast a history, of course—history exists everywhere humans have trod the earth—but in too many communities, the past has been hastily buried in the lunge to the present and future. In Boston, the past lies right there at your feet and finger-tips. It radiates from the squares and markets, the clapboard houses and the brick and granite buildings—but more importantly, from the oddly accented New Englanders themselves. More than anywhere else, the history here exists in thick, vibrant layers, waiting to be peeled back to reveal to us where our American collective came from and who we really are.

Bostonians are great story-tellers. Maybe it's the Irish influence, but everyone you meet, from bartender to shopkeeper, from taxi driver to lay-about, has a gripping tale to tell. Is everything you hear 100% factual? Probably not—how could it be?—but it doesn't matter. Anyone who claims that history can be deconstructed into precise, verifiable bits of experience has spent too much time with television and not much time with the past. Some stories are just better than others, and that's why we keep re-telling them.

A handful of the more remarkable layers you'll uncover in Beantown, Titletown, the Athens of America, and the Hub of the Universe:

### The American Revolution:

The rebellion that started in Boston wasn't

the same Revolution that outlasted King George's patience and defeated Lord Cornwallis at Yorktown. Long before Washington and von Steuben converted their militias into a modern, well-trained army at Valley Forge, a rabble of New England farmers, dockhands, merchants, roustabouts, and ne'er-do-wells took on the greatest Empire in history, armed with nothing more than bloody-minded obstinacy, spectacular marksmanship, and an occasional swig of rum. And booted them out of town before the Revolution even got rolling.

That's the reason you won't find an individual hero dominating the narrative of the rebellion in these parts. A plaque here, an oddly named cobblestone street, a grave marker there, a crooked eave—if you search beyond the surface of events, you'll find thousands of personalities who arose, did their part, and then eased back into the mists of history.

### The North End:


American neighborhoods have taken a bad rap in the last couple of decades, as many confuse freedom and access to resources with churning all of us into one bland, massive blob. Boston has always been a city of neighborhoods—the North End and East Boston for the Italians, Southie for the Irish, Roxbury for the Blacks, and Beacon Hill for the Brahmins. Not to mention Chinatown and several smaller congregations. But from the beginning, the intent was never to exclude, but to protect one's own language, religion, and politics from the nastier rampages of an occasionally ugly democracy.

So the North End, which is where the Puritans are buried and the Revolution started, became home in quick succession to the Jewish, Irish, and then the Italian immigrants. Today, the Italians are struggling to preserve their heritage against an invasion of partying millennials who have no idea how Cotton Mather, Paul Revere, Rose Kennedy, and Sacco & Vanzetti came to be memorialized within a few blocks of each other. To the casual outsider, the North End might look



Drawings are accurate but also basic enough to break down complex biology systems into easily digestible facts that my four-year-old gobbled up. kids but really enjoyed sharing this book with them. There was so much for each to discover and lots of text to help me answer the inevitable "but why" questions that pop up. 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### 'Spencer' Imagines The Unbearable Duty of Being Diana

Since you, dear reader, likely aren't royalty, you might think that the holidays are a time for simply unwinding, relaxing, and being yourself amongst your closest loved ones.

For royalty, however, holidays are orderly affairs of the strictest manner. Meals are orchestrated and scheduled at exact times. You must be on your best behavior always, smiling courteously in your already-chosen outfit for each event (and don't even think about swapping your morning and afternoon world's largest stage.

How might the pressures of one's highly scrutinized life reveal over a holiday gathering? What sort of psychological horrors would hide behind those castle's looming doors and drape-drawn windows?

An impressionistically painted portrait

That is the question that the new film Spencer asks. Director Pablo Larraín, having last showcased John F. Kennedy's late wife in 2016's Jackie, once again returns to examining the inner sadness of a stoic

attires with each other).

Much like your entire life, it's a performance. A wholly lifeless charade where enjoyment and self-expression have no place at the table.

These dignified traditions continue from one generation to the next, as the Royal family sees the highly fashionable acts as fulfilling a duty to their country.

But times change, and pressures grow. They certainly did for Princess Diana, a young woman at the center of the media sensation and the public's fixation on the stateswoman.

This time around, though, Larraín (with a screenplay from Steven Knight) takes greater artistic liberties by inventing the events that happened over one holiday weekend.

Based on the factual accounting of a stay that Princess Diana (Kristen Stewart) spent at home with her large Royal family, Spencer imagines the conversations, events, and episodes that the Princess of Wales may have secretly suffered.

### Film Review

While the events themselves might not have happened in the way they are depicted in the film, the impressionistic portrait makes for a different kind of honesty: one that's more truthful of an emotional state versus events.

In taking such narrative liberties, *Spencer* is free to tread into dangerous, almost horrifically surprising grounds. Stuffy dinners aren't just seen as uncomfortable, but as grotesque nightmares in which we are trapped, panicstricken, and helpless as Diana. It's beautiful, but also an unshakeable fever dream of anxious, paranoid proportions.

And of course, the film holds together with a captivating and career-defining performance from Kristen Stewart.

Stewart might not be the first person you'd think of as being the choice to play the late figure (perhaps because she's only 31, and isn't British). But when you look at Stewart's career of playing anguished, grief-stricken women–along with her own history of being fixated upon by the media and public alike, the elements all come together. They make for an experience that feels spiritually connected (credit the costume and makeup department too, for masterfully capturing the look).

Stewart captures a wide range of emotions: the tender grace in her lighter moments, as well as a heavier sense of hurt in darker moments. *Spencer* builds to hallucinatory anxiety, in which she spirals over her lack of control in her life. Of not owning your

### **Housing Protection Department**

### WHAT IS HOUSING PROTECTION?

Housing Protection is a department that was created by the Inglewood City Council pursuant to Assembly Bill 1482 that was established by the State of California in 2019. The department was enacted to specifically address the concerns of the City of Inglewood's rental constituency by monitoring the regulations for rent increases and just cause eviction protections outlined in Ordinance No. 21-09 (Housing Protection Ordinance).

### WHAT IS REGISTRATION?

The Housing Protection Department will implement an online Inglewood Residential Registry System that will require all Property Owners and Landlords to register their residential property regardless if it is used as a rental or not.

WHY MUST I REGISTER MY HOME IF IT IS NOT BEING USED AS A RENTAL? All property owners and landlords are required to register their residential properties to enable the City to capture and maintain current data on the city's housing stock.

### WHO HAS TO REGISTER?

**ALL RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES** must be registered through the online Inglewood Residential Registry System, regardless if it is used as a rental or not. There are a number of property types that are exempt from paying registration fees; however, **the exemption is contingent upon timely registration.** The exempt property types are as follows:

- Single Family Homes and Condominiums owned by a natural person regardless if it is the owner's primary residence or it is being used as a rental property.
- Owner-occupied duplexes (2 residential units on one parcel) as long as the owner has established the residency prior to the tenant occupying the other unit, and the residency of the owner is continuous.
- 3. Housing that has been issued a certificate of occupancy within 15 years from the current date.
- 4. Properties/Units whose rents are less than 70% of Fair Market Value. 5. Affordable Housing developments with restricted deeds.

### WHEN AM I REQUIRED TO REGISTER MY PROPERTY?

The Program Fiscal Year is from October 1st through September 30th. For the initial year (October 1, 2021), the City Council delayed the registration date to January 7, 2022. The online Inglewood Residential Registry System will be open to property owners and landlords beginning January 7, 2022 through March 31, 2022. *Please note:* Registration fees for ALL properties registered from January 7, 2022 through March 31, 2022, will be waived.

### WHY MUST I PAY REGISTRATION FEES?

The fees are imposed on residential properties that are governed by the Housing Protection Ordinance, which are intended to recover the City's reasonable costs associated with enforcing its housing protection regulations as outlined in Chapter 8 (Articles 9 and 10) of the Inglewood Municipal Code, and related inspection programs. Fees will be waived for all residential properties successfully registered between January 7, 2022 and March 31, 2022.

#### The Kennedys:

In the 1960s, when we first arrived, Boston was a cultural backwater to New York. Harvard and Radcliffe were little more than finishing schools for the increasingly calcified elites. The Irish ran the city politics, the mob controlled the North End, and the

neighborhoods, which had done so much to make the city livable and interesting, were fossilizing into a bitter confrontation over education and busing.

For the visitor, the Kennedys changed everything. They made the city hip and likeable, and started an influx of young people who didn't give a damn for the old divisions. They bridged the divides between the elites and the Irish machine, between the pipe-smoking academics, the Brahmin bean-counters, and the Irish, Italian, and Black laborers who competed to toil in their temples. Nothing changed overnight, of course, but by the turn of the 21st century, Boston was a far more tolerant and easy-going place than the one that nurtured Jack, Bobby, Teddy, and that army of offspring.

#### **Fanny Farmer:**

It's no exaggeration to say that America learned to dine out in Boston. In the early taverns and oyster houses, drunks and travelers ate whatever the woman of the house fed them.






