Sacred Cows and Curries— Dining Out (or Not!) in India

It will either infuriate you or endear them to you, but the British, with their astonishing tin ear for foreign languages, have left a trail of odd monikers everywhere they've ventured on the globe. Venice, Florence, and Naples instead of Venezia, Firenze, and Napoli. Frogs for French, Jerries for Germans, Eyeties for Italians. Bombay and Mysore for Mumbai

In the 19th century Indian Raj, one favorite culinary mangling gave us the term "curry" from the Tamil "kari", which means nothing more than "sauce" or "stew". Even today, tikka masalas are all the rage in England, but the word "masala" means nothing more than "mixture". Neither of these terms, in fact, says a thing about the ingredients in

But they do key in on one timeless bit of foodie serendipity, which is that roasted and ground spices are the key to Indian cuisine—just like sauces to the French, pasta to the Italians, broiling to the Americans, and chopping and dicing to the Chinese. Every venerable Indian amah guards her secret masala recipe, passed down and augmented through Lord knows how many generations. And at the opposite extreme from fast food, every Indian meal you consume will be a unique product of that chef's family, culture, religion, personal tastes, and mood.

After five years of traveling in India, we no longer buy pre-mixed powders, but roast, grind, and mix our own. We still blend something you'd recognize as curry powder, but only for western and Jamaican dishes (deviled eggs, anyone?). For Indian food, there's nothing like the aroma that greets the visitor when you throw together a five-course meal with that morning's fresh spices. And it's really

The possibilities are mathematically endless, but savory Indian dishes start in two basic

Coriander—cumin—turmeric (in the Indian shops: dhanya—jeera—haldi). Mix in a variety of other spices, and you have something you'll recognize as western curry powder.

Cardamom—cumin—cinnamon (elaichi jeera—daalacheenee). Start here, and eventually you'll arrive at garam masala.

To these bases, Indian chefs and amahs add saffron (kesar), peppercorns (kalimirch), chili (laal mirch), fenugreek (methi), fennel (saunf), cloves (laung), nutmeg (jaiphal), anise (chakri phool), dried bay and curry leaves (karee pattee), and the seeds of celery (ajavaayan), caraway (shah jeera), poppy (khas-khas), sesame (til), and black mustard (raai). Not to mention asafoetida (don't ask). Not to forget garlic, ginger, onions, tamarind, and tomatoes. Not to neglect ghee (butter), coconut, and yogurt.

Like any other cuisine, there are distinct regional variations in Indian cuisine. On the west coast of America, you'll most likely be familiar with Punjabi, from Northwest India, Kashmir, and Pakistan (think lamb, tomatoes, marinade, Tandoor). The British started out in Bengal in Eastern India, so that tends to dominate their preferences (the color yellow comes to mind). One of our favorite styles originated in Kerala in the south—think seafood, chilis, and coconuts. In the big cities like Mumbai and Delhi, you'll find everything from extremely sophisticated (and expensive) inter-regional feasts to some of the most renowned street food in the world.

Four common threads run through most Indian cuisine:

Not a lot of chilis:

As Westerners, we naturally expected our



Best seat in the house for Mumbai street food from Bademiya. mouths to demand CPR after every blistering bite, but most Indian cooking is actually quite mild. And subtle. Even coconut, which can overwhelm a Thai curry, is held on a tight leash. There's a spice in everything you eat, but if one taste (cumin?) blows away the others, you might want to request an upgrade.

Not a lot of alcohol:

Alcohol isn't necessarily banned, especially at the big western hotels. And in Maharashtra and Karnataka, India boasts two of our favorite wine regions on the planet. And there's nothing for atmosphere quite like a gin and tonic on a steamy afternoon at a crumbling colonial tennis club. But Indians just aren't big drinkers. Most of the time, with our meals, we take a spectacularly refreshing mango lassi (mango, yogurt, cardamom, and mint).

Not a lot of meat:

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Film Review

In C'mon C'mon, Joaquin Phoenix Sees Life Through a Child's Eyes

Watching a Mike Mills film is always a very intimate experience because he draws inspiration from his own life. Beginners was for his dad, 20th Century Women was for his mom, and his new film, C'mon C'mon, is for his kid. Acting as a time capsule of childhood innocence, viewed from the perspective of the young at heart, C'mon C'mon is an earnest and delicate relationship drama that reflects on the importance of human connection.

Johnny (Joaquin Phoenix) is a middle-aged, single man who is consumed with his job as his own nuclear family, C'mon C'mon is an ode to the overall challenges of parenting in the 21st Century. It's easy to see the Mills' school of thought here - the uncertainty and amazement of raising a human being while you yourself are still figuring out how to co-exist in the world.

Joaquin Phoenix gives a phenomenal performance as Johnny (a man who Mills admits is partly based on himself). Phoenix's organic embodiment of the character and emotional translucency is on full display. British-born Woody Norman is the film's biggest revela-

a field radio journalist in NYC. His current project is interviewing young people about their candid thoughts on the future. His ability to connect with these kids is a foreshadowing of what the universe has in store for him next.

Johnny has a semi-estranged relationship with his sister, Viv (Gaby Hoffmann), so it's a little surprising that she calls him asking for a favor. Viv is desperate for him to watch her young son Jesse (Woody Norman) for the few days she will be gone. Hesitant at first, Johnny sees this as an opportunity to re-connect with the nephew he barely knows. What becomes revealed as Johnny and Jesse spend time together is the epiphany that, despite being generations apart, they are actually more alike than they know.

In addition to being a touching tribute to

tion; with his mop of messy hair, charming doe-eyes, and precocious sensibilities, his ability to hold his own against a Hollywood heavyweight like Phoenix is not only admirable but downright amazing.

Shot by cinematographer Robbie Ryan (The Favourite, American Honey), black & white gives C'mon C'mon an obvious "cinematic fairytale" look that is more intentional than simply for aesthetic purposes. Life, as well all know, is never black or white. We live in the grey. C'mon C'mon also lives in that grey, tackling philosophical issues that have no clear answer and proposing hypothetical questions that receive varied reactions. What Johnny and Jesse navigate throughout the course of the film is a whole lot of greyness-and it's

Your Neighborhood Therapist

Dear Neighborhood Therapist,

I feel like I am grateful for the things I have, but I still feel guilty about wanting more. And I do want more. I have tried to do a better job of practicing gratitude, but everything I try doesn't seem to be working. I know there are so many people having a hard time out there, and I am worried that I will come off as insensitive, or unfairly ambitious. I feel worse when I try to change the way I feel and can't do it, like there is something deeply wrong with me. Any ideas? Ungrateful? - El Segundo

Dear Ungrateful:

Have you tried eating at restaurants with the word "Gratitude" in their names? How about buying products with clever phrases about gratitude stamped on them? Have you meditated on it? Do you have a gratitude journal and a gratitude mantra hanging over your bed and another one in your kitchen? Try doing all that first. If it doesn't work, read on.

I kid, of course, but for a reason. It is indeed gratitude season, and gratitude is an industry, and if it helps then I am here to officially tell you that you don't have to practice gratitude if you don't want to.

Consider who benefits most from the social norm that we should be thankful for what we have and not want more: anyone who benefits from the status quo. You mentioned you are concerned about inequality, and that seems like a pretty unfair message for those people who live at the bottom of a society where inequality is at record levels.

If you're worried that you don't feel grateful enough, the best way to feel truly grateful is to first experience what it's like not to have comforts and luxuries for a period of time. Are you to spend some time living on society's minimums in wages, healthcare,

transportation, housing? Are you prepared to give away your material possessions until others have nearly as much as you do?

Instead of worrying about practicing gratitude, try making it a point to practice decency (I don't mean to imply that you don't do this!). The best way to practice decency is to treat everyone with dignity and respect, always.

That's not as easy as it's supposed to be. We all have our tribes, and as such we tend to think of others as a little bit less than members of our tribe. Yes, in our minds we all dehumanize others to one degree or another. But that doesn't mean we have to treat people as if they are inferior to us.

Even if you tell yourself it's ok for others to have less because - insert your reason here - you don't have to act like you feel that way. Look people in the eye. Thank them even when you are paying them to do a service for you. Ask what they would like and take their word for it. Choose to accept their sincerity even if it sounds ridiculous to you.

It is easier to practice gratitude than it is to help others, and I suspect that nagging feeling you have speaks to your understanding and dissatisfaction with that reality. So treat the problem, not the symptom: find a way to help people who need it. If you do, I suspect you won't find yourself worrying so much about being sufficiently grateful.

Credit Factors That Affect Auto & Homeowner's Insurance Premiums

(BPT) - People think of their credit scores when measuring their "creditworthiness," like when they're looking to take out a loan, buy a home or open a new credit card. But did you know your insurance credit score can affect your auto insurance premiums too?

Before auto insurers take you on as a policyholder, they might use your credit score as an indicator to evaluate how likely you are to file a claim. If your score doesn't fit within their standards, you may get charged a higher premium. On the other hand, some insurance scores are loss ratio models, so they actually rank you based on the probability that you'll be a more profitable customer.

According to Consumer Reports, the difference in auto insurance premiums related to credit scores can be significant. Drivers who only have "good" scores can end up paying from \$68 to more than \$500 more annually in comparison to those who have excellent scores.

Moreover, it's important to know that your credit score is not the only factor that determines your premiums. According to Experian, if you live in Hawaii, California, Massachusetts or Michigan, auto insurers can't even use your credit information to determine auto insurance premium.

Insurance companies say that a person's credit scores help them to better predict their risk of insurance losses. While a score evaluation can seem like a broad judgment, there are often certain factors auto insurers will look at when determining your monthly premium, such as:

The longer a person has credit and keeps that credit in good standing, the higher their score. However, while people who've had credit longer can stand a good chance at getting a lower premium, it's not a guarantee. Insurance companies may still view you as a risk if, for example, you have an excellent credit history but a poor driving history.

When you sign up for auto insurance, your provider wants to gauge whether you are in financial stress or not and how likely it is that you will file a claim. So if you regularly pay your bills when they're due and don't have any missed or delinquent payments reflected on your score, you should be OK.

However, with life's unexpected twists and turns, sometimes it's hard to maintain a healthy credit score, even if your score is historically excellent and you are seen as low risk. Fortunately, many auto insurers understand this and will offer you a reconsideration for the amount of your premium for what they call "extraordinary circumstances." Some of those circumstances may include:


- Death
- Divorce
- Serious illness/injury
- Temporary and involuntary loss of employment
- Military deployment

Situations often vary and insurers often have different policy guidelines. If you're curious, contact your insurer to see what circumstances they do and don't consider.

Auto insurers, like lenders, want to see the correlation between various factors, such as a good credit mix and a lower credit risk.

Applying for insurance can feel daunting. But when you have the right credit information in your hands, you should be able to get a better idea of what to expect. Generally speaking, a strong credit score can help you qualify for lower insurance premiums when you shop around.



14% of the country is horrified by the taste of pork. 80% reveres the cow for befriending and comforting the deity Krishna through his ancient tribulations. Unfortunately for fish, sheep, and chickens, their ancestors never made the honored (or dishonored) lists—but there's 30% of the population who don't much care for consuming any living being. So this is an easy (if less than doctrinaire) country to be a vegetarian. Again, there are exceptions, and you can find pretty much any meat in some obscure corner of the culture. But as a visitor, why would you want to? We consume as much as we want, but no one ever suffered a guilty conscience from gorging on vegetables.

Not a lot of drama:

In general, we expected a much more complicated relationship with food than we found in India. In a mega-state like Maharashtra, there exists the potential for every kind of misery (New York and London come to mind), but widespread hunger, at least in the urban areas, isn't the scourge it used to be. Obesity is rare, but so is visible malnutrition. Famine has all but disappeared. Indians might not over-eat, but they relish

the foods of their culture and will welcome your awestruck admiration.

As for the foreigner's digestive adjustment to put it delicately—that issue has never proved more than vaguely inconvenient for us. We both sport pretty weak stomachs, and face an amoebic challenge flying coast to coast in America, much less to Europe, Africa, or Asia. A week or so before arrival in-country, we start a regimen of probiotics, but only because we drop all inhibitions at the first exotic aroma. And as for ice cubes, brushing teeth, suspicious plastic bottles, and all the other water-based shibboleths, we keep meaning to start paying attention. Maybe someday we'll find out the hard way. Maybe we won't.

So...

As Indian-obsessed foodies, we're just getting started. We did take lunch with one of the premier chefs of India, where the chocolate dessert truffles were served suspended in a magnetic field (we have no idea why, but it took the waiter longer to suspend them than it took us to swallow). But our most memorable meals have been among the least gaudy and expensive. And that is the true secret of Indian food—simple ingredients blended with mouth-watering spices and cooked to perfection. So easy. So relaxed. So good.

CITY OF INGLEWOOD'S NEW

Housing Protection Department

WHAT IS HOUSING PROTECTION?

Housing Protection is a department that was created by the Inglewood City Council pursuant to Assembly Bill 1482 that was established by the State of California in 2019. The department was enacted to specifically address the concerns of the City of Inglewood's rental constituency by monitoring the regulations for rent increases and just cause eviction protections outlined in Ordinance No. 21-09 (Housing Protection Ordinance)

WHAT IS REGISTRATION?

The Housing Protection Department will implement an online Inglewood Residential Registry System that will require **all Property Owners and Landlords** to register their residential property regardless if it is used as a rental or not.

WHY MUST I REGISTER MY HOME IF IT IS NOT BEING USED AS A RENTAL? All property owners and landlords are required to register their residential properties to enable the City to capture and maintain current data on the city's housing stock.

WHO HAS TO REGISTER?

ALL RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES must be registered through the online Inglewood Residential Registry System, regardless if it is used as a rental or not. There are a number of property types that are exempt from paying registration fees; however, the exemption is contingent upon **timely registration.** The exempt property types are as follows:

1. Single Family Homes and Condominiums owned by a natural person regardless if it is the owner's primary residence or it is being used as a rental property.

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- 2. Owner-occupied duplexes (2 residential units on one parcel) as long as the owner has established the residency prior to the tenant occupying the other unit, and the residency of the owner is continuous.
- 3. Housing that has been issued a certificate of occupancy within 15 years from the current date.
 4. Properties/Units whose rents are less than 70% of Fair Market Value.
- Affordable Housing developments with restricted deeds.

WHEN AM I REQUIRED TO REGISTER MY PROPERTY?

The Program Fiscal Year is from October 1st through September 30th. For the initial year (October 1, 2021), the City Council delayed the registration date to January 7, 2022. The online Inglewood Residential Registry System will be open to property owners and landlords beginning January 7, 2022 through March 31, 2022. Please note: Registration fees for ALL properties registered from January 7, 2022 through March 31, 2022, will be waived.

WHY MUST I PAY REGISTRATION FEES?

The fees are imposed on residential properties that are governed by the Housing Protection Ordinance, which are intended to recover the City's reasonable costs associated with enforcing its housing protection regulations as outlined in Chapter 8 (Articles 9 and 10) of the Inglewood Municipal Code, and related inspection programs. Fees will be waived for all residential properties successfully registered between January 7, 2022 and March 31, 2022.


