## **Wiseburn School Board Tabs** Israel Mora as new President

Last Thursday evening the Wiseburn Unified School District (WUSD) School Board selected Israel Mora to succeed JoAnne Kaneda as president. Mora, who also serves on the board of trustees of Da Vinci charter schools brings a wealth of experience to the post, having served on the WUSD board

Dr. Neil Goldman will serve the next year as vice president/clerk. The 2019/20 board is rounded-out by Kaneda, Roger Banuelos, and Nelson Martinez.

Superintendent Dr. Blake Silvers said that "I have really thoroughly enjoyed working with JoAnne Kaneda." He said he views her as a mentor and touted her "professionalism." Silvers added that "I have great respect for Israel, he is just a really engaged member of the community. His focus is kids and Wiseburn."

Kaneda said that she was honored to serve the Board as president for the past two years. "It has been a challenge, a privilege, an opportunity," she said.

Mora thanked the Board for their "confidence" that they showed in him. He noted this will be his second tenure as president, saying the experience was "very enjoyable, but a lot of hard work." He lauded his fellow Board members, noting that their decisions are always based on what is best for the students.

Juan de Anza Elementary principal Albert Paredes and assistant principal Katie Masterson made the only special presentation of the evening. The pair spoke about the strides being made at Anza in the STEM program, focusing on Project Lead the Way (PLTW). Paredes dubbed 2019 as the "year of the Anza," noting multiple school accomplishments. "We are a future-ready school," he said. "We want to continue to utilize technology as a learning-tool."

Masterson delineated what the PLTW program entails, citing classroom experiences, teacher development, and parental engagement. She showed slides portraying how the Anza students are embracing PLTW and developing 21-st century learning skills.

Said Kaneda: "I love the idea of including the parents," which Paredes said is a focal point of the Anza PLTW program.

Board member reports followed. Nelson Martinez spoke about attending the recent California School Boards Association (CSBA) conference. He noted the value of attending the meeting, and how coding and engineering may be the future, but was also curious how to best serve students who may not be geared towards or interested in high-tech fields, but may be interested in more hands-on areas like plumbing.

Silvers thanked Banuelos and Martinez for their attendance and help at the CSBA conference and spoke about the recent facilities master plan meeting.


Next up were three discussion items. Chief Business Official Dave Wilson briefed the members on the Districts first interim financial report. Wilson gave the members the "Cliff notes" version of the changes since the last budget numbers were crunched in July. Upshot: District financing looks good, with the WUSD to file a "positive certification." Securing funding is always a hot-button issue in school districts. Mora said he foresees" tough years ahead, with limited increases in funding." Kaneda questioned if state revenues were down, to which Wilson replied, "for the most part, we are still on target."

Noting the positive financial certification, Silvers said that "one of the pillars in the District is to be financially strong so that we are good moving forward" to combat a possible future economic slowdown

Next-up was the Child Development Center (CDC) financial report. Prior to the meeting, Silvers had mentioned the need to "look at the books," that the goal was to run a "break-even" program, but is facing a structural deficit, which triggered the District to take a look at multiple facets of running the CDC. "We need a plan for what we want to do," Kaneda said.

The final discussion item involved exploring a proposed District history project. Jack Goode penned a thesis when he was a college student that covered the WUSD historically from the late 1800's until 1960. Dr. Don Brann, who

## A Hidden Life Dares to Celebrate, Examine the Costs of One's Ethics

After exploring the experimental edges of narratively formless cinema with films like Song to Song and Knight of Cups, director Terrence Malick returns with his newest film, A Hidden Life: a meditation on morality that, both intimate and expansive, achieves wondrous results.

Those familiar with Malick will know what his films have in store: melancholic humans searching for life's answers in stories that range Hidden Life feels like a film that's simultaneously unfurling in real-time as well as if remembered like a trace-memory, altogether an impressionistic tapestry of real feeling that cannot be imitated. Mixing this modernized look with its period-accurate era captures a timeless quality to the nature of ethics that gives it new life and resonance.

While Malick's latest experimental adventures didn't tap into the cultural conversation for their understandably formless structures, A

in vastness and ambition. At 2 hours and 53 minutes long, A Hidden Life, now playing in select theaters, ranks among his more ambitious works, and I'm happy to say that it's every bit as epic in its narrative and artistic scope.

What makes this meditation so transfixing is its setting and place in time: based on a true story of a German conscientious objector in WWII, A Hidden Life centers around the life of Franz Jägerstätter (August Diehl), a German villager and husband to Franziska (Valerie Pachner). It's a life that we see is full of infinite, simple beauties; they cut wheat in the most amazing golden fields, spin around vibrant green grass, and stare longingly into each other's eyes under the rich blue skies. Children soon form to show a happy family. But when the creeping subsiding of war slowly moves in like waves reaching higher tides, Franz is forced to assert an ethical stance that soon enough tears him apart from his family.

With a camera that gracefully glides through scenes, seeking and capturing spontaneous moments of Diehl and Pachner's quiet emoting and performing, Malick's distinguishable cinematography is on welcome display here. And assembled with its jump-cut editing, A Hidden Life is bolstered by having a narrative center that organically moves the film forward, which is a welcomed element. Putting forward a meditation on such a universally important question as morality and inspiring people to ponder it is an ambitious, if not just plain admirable, task. The artistic achievement that is A Hidden Life is one that – like the devastatingly moving quote by George Eliot that the film ends with - should be seen and celebrated. •



## Heroine by Mindy McGinnis

For this week's book review, I picked Mindy McGinnis' latest Young Adult novel, Heroine. This book deals with a heavy topic. Mindy does a powerful job involving the reader in the story as she describes in detail what the protagonist, Mickey, experiences in her struggles with opiate addiction.

Although heavy, this book has left me still pondering the story weeks later because I became emotionally attached to the young character and her struggle to overcome her opioid addiction.

Mickey is a star athlete on her high school's softball team. It is her senior year and Division 3 colleges seek to recruit her. Her high school career is halted when she is involved in a catastrophic car accident that lands her in surgery to repair damage done to her hip and leg. She is devastated by this news since she is the team's catcher. To help with the pain, her doctor prescribes her OxyContin. After taking the first pill she realizes that not only does the medicine help take the pain away, but she likes how it makes her senses feel. As she continues to take the medication, she feels an increased need for it. Once her prescription runs out, she finds another means to acquire it. She justifies the continued use by telling herself it is helping her get through the pain that physical therapy has intensified, and to help her body get where she physically needs to be for the season that begins in two months. As she spirals out of control, her addiction to Oxy soon becomes an addiction to heroin -- one of the hardest addictions to give up.

Heroine humanizes addiction and made me think about how easy drugs can take over a person's life. It is an eye-opening read that I will not soon forget, as it left an imprint on my mind. The Holiday Season – The true meaning of the Present



The Board also approved the extension of Silvers contract, which will now run through June 30, 2022. Goldman said approving Silvers contract extension was "a no-brainer," and noted that the Board was "appreciative of your leadership, especially through some difficult decisions. You have

our full confidence."

The 90-minute meeting was adjourned in memory of longtime R.H. Dana Middle School teacher Vincent Barnett, who passed away on Nov.17.

EVICTIONS) TO DIVISION V1 (CONSUMER PROTECTION) OF TITLE 9 (PUBLIC PEACE, MORALS AND WELFARE) OF THE HAW-THORNEMUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING A TEMPORARY PROHIBITION ON NO-FAULT EVICTIONS THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2019, FOR RESIDENTIAL REAL PROPERTY BUILT PRIOR TO JANUARY 1, 2005 WHEREAS, the California is experiencing

a humanitarian crisis of homelessness and displacement of renters of unprecedented levels; WHEREAS, the California legislature passed WHEREAS, the California legislature passed the Tenant Protection Act of 2019, Assembly Bill 1482 ("AB 1482"), an act adding and repealing Sections 1946.2, 1947.12, and 1947.13 of the California Civil Code, effective beginning, January. 1, 2020, which prohibits evictions without "just cause" and owners of residential rental property from increasing rents each year more than 5 percent plus the percentage change in the cost of living or 10 percent, whichever is lower, WHEREAS, AB 1482 will provide renter protections to approximately 20,954 households in the City of Hawthome; WHEREAS. in advance of the implementation

of AB 1482, no-fault eviction notices and threats of eviction have surged:

WHEREAS, the City of Hawthome wishes to protect renters from no-fault evictions through December 31, 2019, in advance of AB 1482's and displacement;

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and declares that adoption of this Ordinance is required for the immediate protection of the public peace, health and safety and its urgency is hereby declared for the following reasons: the City of Hawthome would suffer potentially irreversible displacement of tenants resulting from no-fault evictions during the period

before AB 1482 becomes effective.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE DOES

ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: Section 1. A new Chapter 9.71 (Temporary Prohibition on No-Fault Evictions) of Division VI (Consumer Protection) of Title 9 (Public Peace, Moral and Welfare) of the Hawthome Municipal code is hereby added to read as follows: CHAPTER 9.71

#### TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF NO-FAULT EVICTIONS

Sections: 9.71.010 9.71.020 Purpose Definitions Prohibition on evictions 9.71.030 Application

Purpose.

On October 8, 2019, Assembly Bill 1482 ("AB 1482"), the Tenant Protections Act of 2019, was passed to address a key cause of California's affordable housing crisis by preventing rentgoug-ing and arbitrary evictions. AB 1482 becomes

effective on January 1, 2020. The City of Hawthome is experiencing a housing affordability crisis, which is driving homelessness and displacement of residents to an unprecedented scale. The City of Hawthorne's most recent Housing Element indicates that 45% of renters are rent-burdened, and 61% of elderly are rent burdened.

Rapidly escalating real estate values provide an incentive to landlords to evict long-term, lower-income tenants, without cause, to raise rents and attract wealthier tenants, before AB 1482 becomes effective. Renters have already reported experiencing a surge of no-fault eviction imperative that the City implement temporary

strategies to keep people housed. This Chapter will temporarily prohibit no-fault evictions through December 31, 2019, for residential real property that will be covered by AB 1482 beginning on January 1, 2020.

9.71.020

The following words and phrases, whenever used in this article, shall be construed as defined in this section.

Owner. The term "owner" is any person, acting as principal or through an agent, offering residential real property for rent, and includes a predecessor in interest to the owner.

Residential real property. The term "residential real property" is any dwelling or unit that is intended or used for human habitation.

**9.71.030 Prohibition on evictions.** A. Through December 31, 2019, the owner of

residential rental property shall not terminate a lawful tenancy without at-fault just cause, unless the termination is required to comply with an order issued by a government agency or court necessitating vacating the residentia real property or to comport with due process federal, or state law, which shall be stated in the written notice of termination of tenancy. This prohibition shall also apply to an owner's action that constitutes constructive eviction under California law. An owner's failure to comply with this article shall render any notice of termination of tenancy void. This article may be asserted as an affirmative defense in an unlawful detainer action. An owner's failure to comply with this article does not constitute a criminal offense. B. At-fault just cause is the following:
a. Default in the payment of rent.

b A breach of a material term of the lease as described in paragraph (3) of Section 1161 of the California Code of Civil Procedure, including, but not limited to, violation of a provision of a lease after being issued a written notice

to correct the violation. c. Maintaining, committing, or permitting the maintenance or commission of a nuisance as described in paragraph (4) of Section 1161 of the California Code of Civil Procedure.

d. Criminal activity by the tenant on the residential real property, including any common areas, or any criminal activity or crimina threat as defined in subdivision (a) of Section 422 of the California Penal Code, on or off the residential real property against the owner of the residential real property.

e. Assigning or subletting the premises in

violation of the tenant's lease, as described in

paragraph (4) of Section 1161 of the California

f. The tenant's refusal to allow the owner to enter the residential real property as authorized by Sections 1101.5 and 1954 of the California Civil Code and Sections 13113.7 and 17926.1 of the California Health and Safety Code. 6. Using the premises for an unlawful purpose as described in paragraph (4) of Section 1161 of the California Code of Civil Procedure.

h. The employee, agent, or licensee's failure to vacate after their termination as an employee, agent, or a licensee as described in paragraph (1) of Section 1161 of the California Code of Civil Procedure.

i. When the tenant fails to deliver possession of the residential real property after providing the owner written notice as provided in Section the owner written notice as provided in Section 1946 of the California Civil Code of the tenant's intention to terminate the hiring of the real property, or makes a written offer to surrender that is accepted in writing by the owner, but fails to deliver possession at the time specified in that written notice as described in paragraph (5) of Section 1161 of the California Code of Civil Procedure.

C. This article shall not apply to any of the following residential real property or residential

Transient and tourist hotel occupa defined in subdivision (b) of Section 1940 of the California Civil Code

b. Housing accommodations in a nonprofit hospital, religious facility, extended care facility, licensed residential care facility for the elder as defined in Section 1569.2 of the Health and Safety Code, or an adult residential facility, as defined in Chapter 6 of Division 6 of Title 22 of the Manual of Policies and Procedures published by the State Department of Social Services c. Domitories owned and operated by an institution of higher education or a kindergarten and grades 1 to 12, inclusive, school d. Housing accommodations in which the tenant

shares bathroom or kitchen facilities with the owner who maintains their principal residence at the residential real property.

e. Single-family owner-occupied residences, including a residence in which the owneroccupant rents or leases no more than two units or bedrooms, including, but not limited to, an accessory dwelling unit or a junior accessory dwelling unit.

f. A duplex in which the owner occupied one

of the units as the owner's principal place of residence at the beginning of the tenancy, so long as the owner continues in occupancy.

g. Housing that has been issued a certificate of occupancy within the previous 15 years. h. Residential real property that is alienable separate from the title to any other dwelling unit, provided that the owner is not any of the following:
i. A real estate investment trust, as defined in

Section 856 of the Internal Revenue Code.

ii. A corporation. iii. A limited liability company in which at least

one member is a(c) corporation.

i. Housing restricted by deed, regulatory restriction contained in an agreement with a government agency, or other recorded docu-ment as affordable housing for persons and families of very low, low, or moderate income as defined in Section 50093 of the Health and Safety Code, or subject to an agreement that provides housing subsidies for affordable housng for persons and families of very low, lo moderate income, as defined in Section 50093 of the Health and Safety Code or comparable federal statutes

9.71.040 Application.

This article shall apply to tenancies where the tenant remains in possession and the period of notice required under California Civil Code section 1946.1 has not expired.

Section 2. CEQA. The City Council finds and determines that there is no possibility that the adoption of this Ordinance will have a significant effect on the environment. Accordingly, this Ordinance is not subject to the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Sections 15061(b)(3) and 15378 of Division 6 of Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations.

Section 3. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any court of any competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance and load any experience. this Ordinance, and each and every section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase not declared invalid or unconstitutional without regard to whether any portion of the Ordinance would be subsequently declared invalid or

unconstitutional.

Section 4. Pursuant to Government Code Section 36933(c)(1), the City Attorney is authorized to prepare a summary of this ordinance. The City Clerk is also authorized to publish a summary of the text of this ordinance in the Herald Tribune at least five days prior to the adoption of this ordinance. Within 15 days after adoption of the ordinance, the City Clerk is directed to publish a summary of this ordinance in the Herald Tribune.

Section 5. Effective Date. The City Council finds and declares that this ordinance is required for the immediate protection of the public peace, health and safety for the following reasons: The City of Hawthome would suffer potentially irreversible displacement of tenants resulting from no-fault evictions during the period before AB 1482 becomes effective.
