

Friends of Library Make Generous Donation For Youth Services Programs

Torrance Mayor Patrick Furey and members of the City Council accepted and appropriated a \$16,800 donation from the Friends of the Torrance Library for Youth Services programming.

The Friends of the Torrance Library, a group of volunteer citizens committed to working and providing the city's residents with the best possible libraries, has been a strong and long-time supporter of the community. Through the organizing of used books sales, the Friends are able to raise money that is then used to assist the city's libraries with obtaining resources that might otherwise be unattainable through the library's operating budget.

"The Friends of the Torrance Library continue to generously support Library programs and activities, and have voted to fund youth services programs during 2016," states the staff report signed by Community Director John Jones and City Librarian Hillary Theyer. "Throughout the year, youth and families enjoy activities funded by the Friends of the Torrance Library. These include stories combined with crafts for hands-on learning, musical performances, activities for teens, and story times for young children."

The aim of providing additional programming and enhancing youth activities are to draw families to the library and engage kids of all ages through entertaining experiences that involve reading and other learning activities. In addition, the Friends believe that establishing a relationship between the city's kids with the library and reading, skills are

being established that are not only useful, but needed in the future. The programs are also tailored to involve families to share the skills that are used in the library so that they be carried out at home.

"The Friends of the Torrance Library support all direct expenses, enabling us to bring in talented performers, use toys and puppets to enhance storytime, and offer crafts with a variety of hands-on applications," indicates the staff report. "These programs serve all ages, from Serendipity Saturdays for young children through Science Month for school aged youth. Professional staff develop the programs, working with the latest educational and professional expertise, and ensuring we are offering excellent opportunities for learning and enhancing use of the library."

Class Specification For Records Management Specialist Approved By Council

A recommendation by the Civil Service Commission and the Human Resources Administrator to approve class specification for the Records Management Specialist was moved forward by the city council.

At the moment the City Clerk's Office is in the middle of developing a plan that will digitize the city's records during the span of the next five years. The proposed class specification was approved by the Civil Service Commission during its Dec. 14, 2015 meeting and was immediately submitted for approval to the council.

"In order to implement this plan an existing vacancy for Office Assistant has been upgraded to a Records Management Specialist," states

the staff report signed by Human Resources Administrator Leyta O. Fuentes and Chair of the Civil Service Commission Keith Montoya. "The position will assist the Records Management Supervisor in the implementation and maintenance of City-wide electronic records management system. In addition, creation of the classification will allow for cross training, staff retention and create a career path in the City Clerk's Office."

The person filling the Records Management Specialist position will be responsible for assisting in the administrative manners and the implementation of the Citywide Records Management Program. Such responsibilities will include updating and enforcing "citywide retention schedules, policies, and procedures for records management."

Requirements to fill the position state that any combination of education and experience "that provides the required knowledge, skills and abilities is qualifying," and include: Graduation from high school or equivalent and two years of increasingly responsible clerical or office administrative experience; or Associates degree and one year of clerical or administrative experience; or Bachelor's degree in public administration, business administration, or a related field. In addition, the candidate must be experienced in a municipal government setting and supplemental specialized records management experience are desirable. Also required for the position is a valid class C California driver's license and Notary Public certification must be obtained prior to the completion of the probationary period and maintained from that moment forward. •

Nothing of substance happened in a bout that looked like a money-grab from the start, but Mayweather won to remain undefeated and eventually re-proclaim himself as the greatest boxer of all time. Ronda Rousey, who hasn't been shy about letting her hatred for Mayweather become known, was involved in a few fights of her own this past year. Most notably was her the fight, but also ended Rousey's reign on top of the sport. There has already been a rematch discussed, but first Rousey needs to pick herself back up from off the mat, both literally and figuratively.

A trio of championships, including one that was extremely unexpected, round out the most memorable moments of 2015. The Golden State Warriors brought home an NBA championship to California by defeating LeBron James and his Cleveland Cavaliers. Steph Curry took the nation by storm and is now one of America's favorite, most respected athletes. The Warriors finished with the most wins in the league last year (67) and are already off to the best start in the game this season. By beating the Lakers, the Warriors also set a record for most consecutive wins to start a season (16). Who could forget the Seahawks in the Super Bowl? All the talk of "Deflategate" was upstaged when Pete Carroll decided to take the ball out of Marshawn Lynch's hands at the 1-yard line. Russell Wilson threw an interception to New England's Malcolm Butler and in one of the strangest turn of events ever seen in a championship game, Tom Brady and the Patriots won Super Bowl XLIX by a final score of 28-24 and in dramatic fashion, to say the least. Speaking of dramatic, American Pharaoh did something that hadn't been done in almost 37 years by capturing the Triple Crown. Affirmed was the last horse to win the Kentucky Derby, the Preakness and the Belmont Stakes all in the same year. That happened way back in 1978. 11 horses have had the opportunity to accomplish the feat before American Pharaoh by winning both the Derby and the Preakness, but all failed to take home the last leg of the Crown. Pharaoh put on his lucky horseshoes and made history by galloping past the finish line and right into the hearts of America with a historic victory. One that may not be seen again for another 38 years - or longer.

Jordan Spieth won the US Open, the Kansas City Royals won the World Series, Ohio State won college football's first ever playoff to become champions, Wisconsin and Frank Kaminsky upset Kentucky in college basketball's National Championship game, and Kobe Bryant finally said goodbye to the sport that he loves. Naturally, there are many, many more storylines from the year that has passed that were incredible, memorable and emotional, all the same. That's exactly what happened with the young athletes from around the city of Torrance that competed in 2015 for Torrance High, West High, North High and South High, alike. Whether it was football, basketball, baseball or soccer, athletes from these schools competed their hardest and even in some cases, brought home championships to their city and their respective schools. Let's take a look back at some of the brightest moments of '15 for the athletes and their schools' alike.

It's almost too hard to remember now, but the 2014-15 basketball season that ended last February was full of memories on both the boys and girls sides alike. In this case, I'm sorry to say it guys, but the girls may have just tied their laces a little tighter and outshined you in this sport. The North High Lady Saxons led the way with a remarkable season, finishing with only three losses on the year (29-3, 10-0), going undefeated in league play while capturing the Pioneer League championship. the girls won this round.

This year in football is perhaps the freshest thing on most of our minds. When mentioning football, you have to mention the name Mique Juarez of the North High Saxons. Juarez has yet to make up his mind on a college to attend next year, but he certainly went out with a bang in his senior season. The 6-foot-2, 225-pound senior racked up 22 touchdowns on offense while combining for 107 tackles, 8.5 sacks, six forced fumbles and three interceptions in a year that saw his team win the Pioneer League title outright and make it to the second round of the playoffs. The West High Warriors also experienced a successful football season, making it to the playoffs where they lost in the first round to Redondo. The Warriors (6-5, 4-1) experienced great seasons from quarterback Drake Peabody and running backs Michael Timmerman and EJ Hatter.

Baseball season was all about the South High Spartans (24-9, 9-1). The Spartans not only captured the Pioneer League title, but also made it to the CIF Southern Section Division 4 championship game for the second season in a row. Unfortunately, just like two years ago, the Spartans came up short in the final game once again. That didn't stop Drake Pingel and Nick Beardsley from combining to form one of the best one-two punches in all of southland baseball. Seniors Kawika Hubbell (First-Team), Josh Rotuna, and Dylan Plunkett all enjoyed nice seasons for their team. Unfortunately for the guys, however, they were again outplayed by the girls. Instead of just making the playoffs, the lady Torrance Tartars went all the way. A Pioneer League title wasn't enough for the Lady Tartars (27-9, 9-1), they also got on a roll and took the CIF Division 4 championship by beating Highland 1-0. Pitcher Marissa Moreno was simply unbeatable all season long. She went 17-6 with a 1.34 ERA and 264 strikeouts on the season on her way to a Santa Monica Breeze Player of the Year award and trip to San Diego State to attend college. The North High Saxons finished behind Torrance in the standings and made it to the second round of the playoffs. West also lost in the second round.

The Tartars boys (24-7, 10-0) took home a Pioneer League title in volleyball, but lost in the second round of the playoffs. The Lady Spartans (31-10, 10-0) tore things up in the Pioneer League, not only capturing their own volleyball league title, but also destroyed

The 10 Best Films of 2015

What we consider to be the best of this year represents a combination of the movies that had the greatest emotional impact on us, matched with movies that felt innovative or groundbreaking. Here are the films we consider to be this year's best:

10. Tangerine

This micro-indie surges energy and pulses with electricity at every turn and around every corner of its L.A. backdrop. It also happens to be shot entirely on the iPhone 5s. Like its off-beat shooting style, the flick of the summer, Tangerine, is all attitude, all brash, and all defiant in its film-making, which takes just one moment to learn after meeting our main characters: two Transgender prostitutes,

seals this film as one of the most intricate and fascinating cinema experiences of the year.

8. Iris

As a 93-year-old fashion icon known worldwide, Iris Apfel exudes a naturalness that makes you feel as if you know her. Director Albert Maysles, whose previous films include Grey Gardens and Gimme Shelter, takes audiences into Apfel's life behind the scenes in the documentary Iris. From her private apartment in New York that she shares with her 100-year-old husband Carl, to her storage warehouse that doubles as a closet, we embark on an 80-minute journey that finds inspiration-and words of wisdom from Iris herself-at every turn.

7. Grandma

At a brisk 78 minutes, Grandma packs in some of the best movie material from the

Alexandra (Mya Taylor) and Sin-Dee (Kitana Kiki Rodriguez), who serve as a colorful cast of characters in this seedy, yellow and green colored L.A. circus world.

9. White God


From the opening shot of 300 dogs chasing a girl on a bike, it's clear this is going to be something unique. White God is essentially Oliver Twist with a protagonist who is a canine. The fact that this film manages to cross a foray of genres, incite an emotional response from non-human protagonists, and on top of that also be an allegory for the lower-class Hungarian experience makes it a complete work of art. The title, an obscure reference to the confusing dynamic between dog owners and their pets, entire year. Hidden within the deceitfully simple premise is some of the most layered and fun storytelling I've seen and plenty of humor and sincere laughter. This is a movie that manages to cover the board in terms of being funny, endearing, and poignant. With that, it provides the largest wealth of dimensional female characters while mainstream movies notoriously sideline women's roles.

6. The Tribe

A standout at last year's Cannes Film Festival is the Ukrainian crime drama *The Tribe*, a film told through non-verbal acting and sign language with no voice overs or subtitles about a deaf teenager struggling to fit in at his new boarding

Baked Sweet Potatoes with Cranberry Gorgonzola Gremolata



Makes 6 servings

Ingredients

- 6 medium sweet potatoes
- 1/4 c. melted butter
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/4 c. pure maple syrup
- 1/4 c. minced fresh parsley
- 1 lemon zested
- 1 clove garlic, minced finely
- 3 tablespoons minced pecans
- 3 tablespoons finely chopped dried cranberries
- 1 scallion minced
- 2 ounces Stella gorgonzola, crumbled

Preparation

- **1.** Preheat oven to 450 F. Place sweet potatoes on cookie sheet and bake for 30 minutes. Flip over and return to oven to bake until tender, about 20 minutes. Remove from oven and set aside.
- 2. When cool enough to do so safely, peel sweet potatoes. Place in a medium skillet over low heat with butter, salt and maple syrup for 5 minutes, basting the potatoes with the butter mixture occasionally. Lightly smash the potatoes until there is an even consistency. Hold over low heat.
- **3.** In a small bowl, toss together parsley, lemon zest, garlic, pecans, cranberries and scallion. Gently fold in the gorgonzola. Move sweet potatoes to a serving dish and sprinkle with the cranberry blue cheese gremolata. Serve hot. •





school. It is a modern day silent movie with a vibrancy that will leave a lasting impression on those who are willing to experience this unique art film. The Tribe was made for an audience waiting for an authentically beautiful and powerful piece of cinematic art.

5. Ex Machina

Ex Machina is one of the most aesthetically beautiful and stylish films to come out this year. Writer/Director Alex Garland's "Sci-Fi meets Mystery" film tells the story of a young programmer, Caleb (Domhnall Gleeson), who is selected to participate in the opportunity to test an artificially intelligent robot, Ava, (Alicia Vikander) created by the tech-wiz recluse and quirk-capitalist Nathan (Oscar Isaac) and discover what qualities make it human enough to possibly pass as such. Suspenseful and intelligent, Ex Machina also stars some of the year's hottest actors- Vikander can be seen in The Danish Girl and Isaac stars in the highly anticipated Star Wars: The Force Awakens.

4. Room

Of the numerous movies circulating Oscars and other awards this year, my favorite is by far and away Room. Best viewed with as little information as possible (the trailer gives away far too much), it is an emotional experience not easily forgotten. Brie Larson delivers one of the strongest performances of her career as Ma, a victim of a kidnapping who has been forced to create a home out of a woodshed where she and her son Jack (Jacob Tremblay) are being held captive. This is a film that represents the pinnacle of dramatic filmmaking and thankfully is receiving the awards attention it deserves.

3. Mad Max: Fury Road

Normally, blockbusters are saturated, safe, and meant to be appealing to everyone, but nothing is easy to digest about Mad Max: Fury Road. It is a wild unrestrained ride of non-stop mayhem; in other words, it is an absolute blast. Jumpstarting a franchise that nobody thought needed another entry, and most

people born after 1990 have never seen, George Miller reinvigorated his fable to new heights. If every franchise reboot felt as fresh as Fury Road, then I could get behind the industry's obsession with sequels and reimagining old intellectual properties. I can't remember the last time action sequences or chase scenes felt so fresh and alive, making this one of the finest action movies of the decade.

2. Victoria

Despite the fact that the biggest selling point on this movie is that the entire film is one uninterrupted shot, Victoria is more than just a movie all in a single take. For the first half of the film, director Sebastian Schipper borrows from the styles of Richard Linklater to introduce us to the film's protagonists, lonely partier Victoria and four men she encounters on her way out of a club. The fact that this film has both the most daring cinematography of the year on top of a compelling set of characters and memorable sequences makes it a film that has everything firing on all cylinders. Victoria is not the type of film that garners awards attention at the end of the year, but for me it is the cinematic experience that invigorated me more than any other movie I saw this year.

1. Anomalisa

He is the mind behind some of cinema's most creative films, such as 1999's Being John Malkovich, 2002's Adaptation, and 2004's Eternal Sunshine of the Spotless Mind - now, screenwriter-turned-director Charlie Kaufman is back with the stop-motion film Anomalisa. In similar Kaufman fashion, the protagonist is a middle-aged cynic crippled by the mundanity of modern life, only to come to life when a stranger opens his eyes and ears to the beauty of human connection, if only for a moment. Anomalisa is a transfixing, thoughtful, and touching film that goes deep into the viewer's psyche and stirs up emotions of introspective thought. There is no doubt that Kaufman's latest masterpiece stands out as one of the year's best..


